### CIGAR TO APPEAR AT NATIONAL HORSE

**SHOW** Horse of the Year Cigar (Palace Music) will highlight the closing session of the 113th National Horse Show Saturday afternoon, Nov. 2, at Madison Square Garden in New York City. "His winning streak, which received so much media attention, gained him millions of fans outside the racing world and we are indeed honored that he will participate in the National Horse Show," said Horse Show President Alan Balch. The New York City Police will provide an escort for Cigar the afternoon of Nov. 2 as he travels from his home at Belmont Park to Madison Square Garden.

### SUCCESSFUL HOUGHTON YEARLING SALE

**CONCLUDES** Tattersalls 1996 Houghton Yearling Sale ended Thursday night, with 65 yearlings selling during the third and final session for a gross of \$11,305,800 and an average of \$173,935. Remarkably, though the average dropped a bit from Wednesday's record European session average of \$222,260, only three yearlings were RNA'd, meaning Thursday's clearance rate was 96%. The session topper was a chestnut colt by Cadeaux Genereux (GB)--Shawgatny (Danzig Connection). Consigned by John Troy, agent, the colt was purchased for \$490,425 by Gainsborough Stud Management. Final figures for the three days overall saw 213 yearlings gross \$43,027,050 for an average of \$202,005. The gross was up 45% from last year, the average 51% and the sale's median of \$125,400 represented a 65% increase from 1995. Sheikh Mohammed's Darley Stud Management emerged as the sale's leading buyer, with 27 purchases totaling \$5,898,750. Demi O'Byrne, who buys for Monaco-based businessman Michael Tabor, bought 11 yearlings, including the \$1,452,000 sales-topping Kingmambo colt Wednesday, for a total of \$5,494,500. At least four American pinhookers were among the purchasers. Florida's Ken Ellenberg bought three yearlings by Caerleon, St. Jovite and Brief Truce for a total of \$767,250; Kip Elser of Kirkwood Stables bought a Theatrical colt for \$313,500. Other purchases for Nick de Meric and by Lincoln Collins of Kern/Lillingston Associates are also reportedly heading for U.S. two-year-old sales. Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony commented, "This Houghton sale has been a great advertisement for European bloodstock and I believe our vendors can look forward to a solid October Yearling Sale in two weeks' time."

Bahamian Bounty, purchased earlier this week by Sheikh Maktoum al Maktoum, brought an immediate return on what is estimated to have been a one-million pound investment. The winner last time out of the G1 Prix Morny, he appeared to have little chance of finding sufficient racing room get his second Group 1 win here. With all 11 runners tightly bunched, Bahamian Bounty was at the back of the pack, but a gap appeared on the stands' rail with two furlongs left. The colt quickened through it but Muchea, on the wide outside, had already grabbed an advantage and it was only in the final strides that the race was decided. Bahamian Bounty may have one more run this season in the G1 Dewhurst S. over seven furlongs on the same course Oct. 18 and will then be sent to Dubai for the winter. Sheikh Mohammed, the winning owner's brother, said, "I hope he will then come back to England next spring in the Godolphin colors. Whatever he achieves from now on, though, he has already proved a good buy for us. We are very happy with this win."

**SLOTS TO ILLINOIS RACETRACKS?** A complicated blockbuster deal that would bring slot machines to Illinois racetracks and casinos to Chicago and would put a retractable dome on the Chicago Bears' home in Soldier Field appears to be in the offing at the Nov. 7-Dec. 5 veto session of the Illinois General Assembly. "I would not be surprised if somebody tried to float a package on gambling as soon as the (Nov. 5) election is over," said the state's Republican Governor, Jim Edgar. In addition to introducing either land-based or riverboat casinos to Chicago and to the suburb of Rosemont near O'Hare International Airport, the plan being engineered by Republican leaders also would produce an expansion of riverboat casino gambling in two Chicago suburban areas. Democratic support is anticipated because casinos in the city and the Soldier Field retractable dome are part of the deal. According to the *Chicago Sun-Times*, the principal players behind the deal are Arlington International Racecourse owner Dick Duchossois, Rosemont Mayor Don Stephens and former (Republican) Governor Jim Thompson. Following last week's issuance of the 1997 Thoroughbred and harness schedules by the Illinois Racing Board, Phil Langley, a member of the hierarchy at the Sportsman's Park, Maywood Park and Balmoral Park harness meetings, confirmed that slot machines at racetracks are a major priority for their owners. "If we get the slots, we don't care when we run," said Langley. "Getting the slots is the key to everything." As is the case at Delaware Park and Prairie Meadows in Iowa, a portion of the gaming revenue would be pumped into horsemen's purse accounts.

**DETTORI TO HONG KONG** Frankie Dettori has agreed to ride as a freelance jockey in Hong Kong this December, just four years after racing authorities in the Far Eastern state turned down an application for a short-term licence from the Italian-born rider after he was cautioned by London police for possessing a small quantity of cocaine. But now, at 25 and a dual British champion, Dettori is in demand from the Hong Kong Jockey Club. "I am delighted at the prospect of going to ride in Hong Kong and very proud that they have asked me," said Dettori. The jockey, who made history by partnering all seven winners at Ascot's meeting last Saturday, will face a busy winter schedule. Britain's turf season ends in early November and, following that, he is to visit Australia for the Melbourne Cup, Japan for an international jockeys' challenge and South Africa. He is also certain to be required by the Godolphin team around the time of the Dubai World Cup in March and intends to be back at his Newmarket base for the start of the 1997 turf season that same month.

**Run Softly** (Deputy Minister) and **Eltish** (Cox's Ridge) will be coupled in the wagering as a Juddmonte Farms-owned entry. **Stephanotis** (Regal Classic) and **Mt. Sassafras** (Mt. Livermore) will be coupled in the wagering as a Minshall Farms-owned entry.

**THORO-GRAPH ANALYSIS** by Jerry Brown: Tonight's Meadowlands Cup features a gateful of horses with connections too sensible to tackle Cigar at scale weights. While not the strongest edition in the race's history, it is an excellent betting event, since we have major doubts about the favorites.

At the handicap weights, **Geri** (Theatrical {Ire}) would need his best race (2 3/4) to win, and since he is coming off an ear-infection induced layoff, it's hard to believe he'll fire a top effort. **Dramatic Gold** (Slew o' Gold) has been alternating good and bad, is due for an off race, and at the weights even his best Thoro-Graph figure (3 1/2) may not be good enough. **Devil's Honor** (Devil's Bag) gets a break in the weights, but would need his best (3) to win and is unlikely to do so on short rest after a long trip.

When **Formal Gold** (Black Tie Affair {Ire}) debuted in June, we assigned him the best first-out figure (1 1/4) ever. We were sure that effort would kill him, but although it did set him back, he has not fallen apart and is now moving forward again. At the weights, he doesn't need his best to win, and at the price Formal Gold is the Thoro-Graph play.

**Local News, England:**

Willie Carson, the four-time Epsom Derby winning jockey who suffered liver damage and fractured ribs when kicked by an unraced two-year-old at Newbury Sept. 20, has been released from the hospital. The 53-year-old rider, with five British championships and 13 other British Classics to his name, left the North Hampshire Hospital in Basingstoke Wednesday evening but specifically requested that details of his departure not be released until Thursday morning. Myrddin Rees, consultant surgeon at the hospital which specializes in internal injuries, said, "Mr. Carson has made excellent progress and has been discharged to begin convalescence."
