SKIP AWAY TO MISS CLASSIC With his trainer Sonny Hine still hospitalized with possible kidney stones, **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) will miss the Oct. 26 Breeders' Cup Classic after owner Carolyn Hine and her husband, Sonny, did not make the \$160,000 payment due yesterday at pre-entry time to supplement their top three-year-old to the race. "We made the decision at 6:20 this morning," said Carolyn Hine Tuesday from Lexington's Saint Joseph Hospital, where Hine was admitted Saturday. "Sonny called me and we talked and we decided not to go. He said, 'I just can't operate that way. I haven't even seen the horse since Saturday.'" Mrs. Hine said she and her husband had decided to run in the Classic, pending Skip Away's scheduled work at Keeneland Sunday. The colt was then forced to skip the breeze when Hine took ill. "We had planned to go, but it was bad timing," said Carolyn. "Maybe this is a message or some sort of signal. I'm not down about this because I respect my husband's judgment and the way he operates. Whatever he decided was going to be the right decision." Allen Paulson, owner of **Cigar** (Palace Music), who finished second to Skip Away in the Oct. 5 Jockey Club Gold Cup, said he was disappointed there would be no rematch at Woodbine. "I had heard they were going to run," said Paulson. "This is too bad because you always like to go back and beat the one who beat you, especially considering the circumstances under which he got beat. Anyway, we'll still be there."

TATTERSALLS FIRST SESSION UP 53 PERCENT Tuesday's opening session of Tattersalls October Yearling Sale at Newmarket, England saw 227 lots--a remarkable 97% of those sent through the ring--gross \$5,871,525 for an average of \$25,865. The average was up 53% from last year's corresponding session, while the median increased 44% to \$21,450. Tuesday's session topper at \$115,500 was a colt by Indian Ridge (Ire)--Forest of Arden (Ire) (Tap On Wood {Ire}). Consigned by West Dereham Abbey Stud, the colt was purchased by agent Charlie Gordon-Watson. Tattersalls Marketing Manager Jimmy George said, "This was a very encouraging start to the week's trade, following on from the record-breaking Houghton sale. Particularly impressive was the 97% clearance rate, which resulted from intense competition among domestic and overseas buyers. It's a strong catalogue right through to Saturday's final session, and today's results bode well for the rest of the week."

EPSOM DERBY TO ACCEPT SUPPLEMENTARY ENTRIES Beginning in 1998, supplementary entries will be accepted for the Epsom Derby for a fee of \$117,371 per horse, according to a story in yesterday's *Racing Post*. For the first time in the race's history, supplementary entries will be accepted seven days before the event, and it is expected that when added to the purse, the supplementary fees will make the Epsom Derby Britain's first £1 million horse race. For this year's Derby, there were two entry stages--\$391 for yearlings and \$12,520 for three-year-olds in April. Epsom Race Committee Chairman Christopher Spence told the *Racing Post* the supplementary stage was introduced after "lengthy and careful consideration of several options. It is positioned as the ultimate safety net in order to ensure that, as far as possible, the best field may be assembled. It is accepted that none of the recognized trials have been run by the time of the April entry and that horses can become Derby candidates between then and the race itself. This new stage will ensure all potential candidates are now given the opportunity to run."

KISTENA INJURED; ANABAA RETIRED French trainer Criquelette Head announced yesterday that both **Kistena (Fr)** (Miswaki) and **Anabaa** (Danzig) were injured in the Oct. 6 G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp. "Anabaa and Kistena both suffered chips in their left knees," said Head. "Anabaa has therefore been officially retired and will go to my parents' Haras du Quesnay in Normandy, while Kistena will be operated on in the near future and, hopefully, will be back in training as a four-year-old." Kistena, owned and bred by the Werthemier brothers, won the Abbaye by a neck over her stablemate, who, earlier in the year dominated European sprinting, winning both the G1 July Cup at Newmarket and the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville. Anabaa, who won five of six starts this year, retires with eight wins in 13 career starts and earnings of \$481,879. Kistena added her Prix de l'Abbaye win to victories in the G3 Prix de Meautry and the G3 Prix de Seine-Et-Oise earlier this year.

ST. JOVITE FILLY IS TOPS AT FASIG-TIPTON

A dark bay or brown filly by St. Jovite--Ivorlanche (Sir Ivor) brought a final bid of \$80,000 from Murray Smith, agent, to top Tuesday's second and final session of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling Sale. Consigned by Havens Bloodstock and Fallbrook Farm, agent, the filly is a half-sister to MGSP Marsha's Dancer (Northern Dancer) and MSP Ivory Regent (Vice Regent). During Tuesday's session, 165 yearlings sold for a total of \$1,654,600 and an average of \$10,028. There were 42 yearlings reported as not sold. Throughout the two-day auction, 340 horses brought a gross of \$3,311,000 for an average of \$9,738. The average was up 23.9% from last year, when 272 yearlings were sold during a single session for an average price of \$7,860.

BLUSHING FLAME TO KIRTLINGTON STUD

Blushing Flame (Blushing Groom {Fr}) will take up stallion duties in 1997 at Kirtlington Stud in Oxfordshire, England. Chris Budgett, managing director of Kirtlington Stud, has acquired an interest in the five-year-old, who will stand for a 1997 fee of \$3,130 (October 1 terms). Out of the Sadler's Wells mare Nearctic Flame (Ire), Kentucky-bred Blushing Flame won five of 20 starts for earnings of \$108,380. He took the G3 Curragh Cup this past June and the listed Cooperative Bank Serlby S. at Doncaster in November, 1995 for his owners, the Cheveley Park Stud. Cheveley Park Stud's Managing Director, Chris Richardson, said, "Blushing Flame's pedigree is from one of the most current, progressive and exciting families, with Marju having sired two Group 1 winners from his first crop this year." Marju (Ire) (Last Tycoon {Ire}) is a half-brother to Blushing Flame's dam, Nearctic Flame.

Showboat (GB) (Warning {GB}--Boathouse, by Habitat) caused a few ripples in the early betting on next year's 2000 Guineas with an impressive first appearance in Leicester's Manny Bernstein Credit Division Maiden S. yesterday. The Barry Hills-trained two-year-old colt, who went to the course with a glowing reputation, was sent off at 2-1. Showboat was never in danger of defeat and sprinted clear inside the last 200 yards of this seven-furlong test to win by five lengths. Hills' assistant, ex-jockey Kevin Mooney said, "This is definitely a nice colt. He had been working well and we were very hopeful."

Local News, Woodbine:

Two more Breeders' Cup hopefuls arrived at Woodbine at 8:30 a.m. Tuesday, bringing the total number of participants for racing's championship day currently on the grounds to 12. Trainer Wally Dollase flew Distaff contender **Jewel Princess** (Key to the Mint) and Breeders' Cup Mile hopeful **Helmsman** (El Gran Senor) from his training base in Southern California via Dayton, Ohio to Toronto to join Turf contender **Windsharp** (Lear Fan) in Woodbine's Barn 3. "No problem with their ship, both were quiet on their flight," said Aimee Dollase, assistant to her father. "They're not even jet-lagged. They should both handle the cooler weather. Helmsman's from Europe, so he'll like it. Jewel Princess is from Florida, but she should be all right. We shipped her to Kentucky before and she handled the cold weather fine there."
