CIGAR'S FOOT PROBLEMS CONTINUE Cigar (Palace Music), winner of last year's Breeders' Cup Classic, will be forced to defend his title at Woodbine Oct. 26 with a newly developed quarter crack on his right front foot, according to a story in yesterday's *Blood-Horse On-Line Daily Edition*. It is the third time this year that Cigar's white right front hoof has suffered such an injury. A similar problem forced the six-year-old to miss the \$1 million Hollywood Gold Cup June 30. Trainer Bill Mott and his farrier applied a fiberglass patch to Cigar's hoof Tuesday night at Mott's Belmont barn. "I won't be losing any sleep over the rest of the field," Mott told Jay Hovdey of *The Blood-Horse* Wednesday morning. "If I lose any at all, it will be over Cigar's foot. He seemed comfortable on it this morning when he galloped. I'd want to get two works into him before shipping to Canada." The trainer has tentatively planned for the reigning Horse of the Year to breeze today.

SALSABIL DEAD Salsabil (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), heroine of the British 1000 Guineas, Epsom Oaks and Irish Derby in 1990, has died at Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum's Shadwell Stud Farm in Kentucky. The nine-year-old bay mare, who recorded wins in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at two and the G1 Prix Vermeille at three, had been suffering from complications brought on by cancer of the colon. Rick Nichols, general manager of Shadwell's American operation, said, "We are all terribly sad about losing Salsabil. Her death has really taken the wind out of our sails. She had been ill for some time--so we knew this was coming--but there was just nothing we could do to save her. She wasn't in any pain at the end, but her breathing stopped about lunchtime last Saturday." Salsabil, an earner of over \$1,252,900 on the racecourse, had already promised to make a major contribution to Sheikh Hamdan's breeding program. Her three-year-old daughter **Bint Salsabil** (Nashwan) won last season's G3 Rockfel S. at Newmarket and her juvenile colt **Sahm** (Mr. Prospector) has taken two races at York this season. Nichols added, "Salsabil also has a Riverman filly weanling and a Mr. Prospector yearling (filly). I have told Sheikh Hamdan that the older of the pair is probably the best individual we have ever had here. She obviously has a marvelous pedigree, but she has outstanding conformation, too, and a great attitude. We are very hopeful for her future on the racecourse."

BREEDERS' CUP CHAMPIONSHIP DAY

BREEDERS' CUP CLASSIC:

Alphabet Soup (Cozzene) breezed six furlongs in 1:15 2/5 at Santa Anita Tuesday. The five-year-old will ship to Woodbine Oct. 20 and be cross-entered in the Sprint.

Trainer Barb Minshall said yesterday she has changed her mind about starting **Mt. Sassafras** (Mt. Livermore) in the Classic. "When we learned Skip Away wasn't coming, we had a hurried conference Tuesday morning, in fact about 10 minutes before the deadline to pre-enter at noon," said Minshall. "We thought the race would have been very difficult with Skip Away and Cigar in it. Skip Away ran a monster race here (in the Woodbine Million) and giving him weight would have been a tough assignment. Mt. Sassafras is in good order and he's on his own track. He didn't run all that bad (when sixth) in the Whitney. He was only beaten a couple of lengths to Dramatic Gold and Formal Gold (when third) in the Meadowlands Cup in his last."

BREEDERS' CUP TURF:

Singspiel (Ire) (In the Wings {GB}) and **Swain** (Ire) (Nashwan) will be the only two horses to carry Sheikh Mohammed's colors in the Breeders' Cup October 26. Anthony Stroud, racing manager to the Sheikh, confirmed yesterday that both would be aimed at the Turf and fly out from Britain early next week. Singspiel, trained by Michael Stoute, proved he is at home at Woodbine when winning the G1 Canadian International in September.

Windsharp (Lear Fan), who flipped a palate when fourth to Singspiel in the Canadian Int'l, skipped over Woodbine's turf training track yesterday, going five furlongs in :57 4/5 and galloping out six furlongs in 1:10 3/5. The five-year-old mare underwent minor surgery days after the Sept. 29 Canadian Int'l to rectify her breathing problem. "It appears her air is better than ever after the operation," said trainer Wally Dollase. "She usually doesn't work this fast."

**BREEDERS' CUP MILE:**

Dumaani (Danzig) won last Saturday's GIII Keeneland Breeders' Cup Mile in what was expected to be the five-year-old's final racetrack appearance. But the victory convinced owner Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum to add one more race to the horse's career before he begins stud duty. Dumaani will make his final start in the Breeders' Cup Mile.

The Godolphin silks will be carried by this year's 2000 Guineas winner **Mark Of Esteem (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}), who is expected to tackle the Mile.

BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE:

GII Norfolk S. runner-up **Zippersup** (Alwuhush) breezed five furlongs in 1:01 Tuesday at Santa Anita.

BREEDERS' CUP SPRINT:

Criollito (Arg) (Candy Stripes), a GSW in both Argentina and the U.S., drilled a half-mile in :46 2/5 at Santa Anita Tuesday. The five-year-old will be supplemented to the Sprint by owners Robert and Beverly Lewis.

Paying Dues (Cure the Blues) breezed a half-mile in :50 3/5 Tuesday and is waiting for an invitation to the Sprint field. The four-year-old colt dead-heated with Abaginone for the win in the GIII Los Angeles H. over six furlongs at Hollywood Park April 26.

Track Gal (Track Barron), 11th in last year's Sprint, will not run in this year's edition.

BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE FILLIES:

Canadian hope **Barbed Wire** (Affirmed) worked five furlongs in 1:00 at Woodbine Wednesday, galloping out six furlongs in 1:13 4/5. "She's ready for her \$1 million dollar race," said jockey Emile Ramsammy, who was aboard for the work. Barbed Wire won the Mazarine Breeders' Cup S. (GIC) by 10 lengths in her last start at Woodbine Oct. 6.

MATIYA'S RACING CAREER ENDS **Matiya (Ire)** (Alzao), winner of this year's Irish 1,000 Guineas, has been retired, according to a story in yesterday's *Racing Post*. Angus Gold, racing manager to owner Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum, said, "We have decided to retire **Matiya** after she ran below her best in France (in the G2 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp Oct. 6) last time--there are no more races for her this season anyway. She was a very tough, long-striding filly and she won us a Classic, which is not bad considering she cost just \$59,467 (at the Goffs Irish National Yearling Sale)." The three-year-old filly won two of nine career starts for earnings of \$280,419. She also finished second in the British 1,000 Guineas and third in the G1 Fillies Mile and G1 French Oaks.

EPSOM DERBY WINNER SHAAMIT RETIRED

Shaamit (Ire) (Mtoto {GB}), winner of this year's Epsom Derby, has been retired. The William Haggas-trained colt suffered damage to a tendon while finishing seventh in the Oct. 6 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. No definite plans have yet been made for his future career as a stallion. However, Sheikh Mohammed's Darley Stud Management in Newmarket issued a statement yesterday describing the colt as "a most exciting addition to the stallion ranks." Shaamit, successful on the second of his only two starts as a juvenile, won the Derby at 12-1 odds on his first appearance as a three-year-old, but failed to add to his score in three subsequent starts. Following the news of Shaamit's retirement, trainer Haggas said, "From a personal point of view, I am very upset and now we have got to find another star. It is such a pity because I have said all along that he would get better as he got older. But nobody will see that now."

STRONG TATTERSALLS YEARLING SALE

CONTINUES The second session of Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale at Newmarket, England Wednesday saw the strong trends established Tuesday continue. After Tuesday's opening session saw a remarkable 97% of the yearlings offered find buyers, even that figure was topped Wednesday. There were 263 yearlings sent through the ring during Wednesday's 12-hour session, and 258 of them--a staggering 98%--were sold, for a gross of \$9,577,900 and an average of \$37,122. This was a 32% increase in aggregate from the corresponding 1995 session, while the average rose 25%. Wednesday's median price of \$27,225 was up 38% from last year. Four colts shared top billing Wednesday at \$165,000 apiece. Trainer Paul Cole bought a colt by Bering (GB); Gordon Smyth signed for a colt by Selkirk; Peter Wragg Bloodstock purchased a colt by Polish Patriot; and Sheikh Mohammed's Darley Stud went home with a colt by Inchinor. Agent Charlie Gordon-Watson, who has been the second leading buyer at the sale so far, having signed for 20 yearlings worth \$1,234,200, said, "I think this may be the strongest sale yet this year, maybe even stronger than Houghton. This sale is the true barometer, the working man's sale. There were so many people shut out at Houghton, it's had a knock-on effect. It's a very, very strong sale." The sale continues through Saturday.

JOCKEYS REFUSE TO RIDE AT HAYDOCK

Yesterday's meeting at Haydock Park in England had to be cancelled after the first race when all of the jockeys in attendance refused to ride on what they considered unsafe track conditions. Among those who took part in the protest were Pat Eddery and Frankie Dettori, the leading riders in Britain. Stewards inspected the track after the jockeys voiced their concerns over the ground conditions on the home turn and, although officials deemed the surface safe for racing, the jockeys refused to leave the weighing room for the second race. The stewards were left with no alternative but to cancel the remaining races. Several owners had heated arguments with the senior jockeys claiming that, in most cases, these were the exact conditions their horses had been waiting for. A senior steward said they would be forwarding a full report to the Jockey Club, which will then decide whether to punish the riders who refused to continue.

GABR EUTHANIZED **Gabr (GB)** (Green Desert), winner of this year's G2 Sandown Mile and G3 Van Geest Criterion S. in England, is dead. The six-year-old was owned by Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum. Trainer R.W. Armstrong revealed in July that the horse had suffered a split pastern while working on the gallops near his home base and would need emergency surgery. Yesterday the trainer said, "Unfortunately, Gabr had to be put down. He had the operation but, while the vets were changing his cast for what I think was either the second or third time, they found the bone was shattered. Everybody here misses him a great deal. He was a marvelous old horse." Gabr, who journeyed to the U.S. in 1995 to finish third in the GIII Jaipur S. at Belmont, won eight of 24 starts for earnings of \$271,821.
