QUEST FOR FAME TO JUDDMONTE Freshman sire **Quest For Fame (GB)** (Rainbow Quest), who entered stud in 1993 at Gainesway in Lexington, Kentucky, will be moved to Juddmonte Farms, also in Lexington, for the 1997 breeding season. Juddmonte owns the nine-year-old stallion in partnership with Woodlands Stud in Australia. Quest For Fame is a shuttle stallion who stands the Southern Hemisphere breeding seasons at Woodlands Stud. "We haven't set his stud fee yet, but it may be close to what it was last year (\$10,000)," said a Juddmonte spokesperson. "In Australia, he's had three two-year-old runners. One is a Group 2 winner, one is a stakes-winner and one is stakes-placed. It's very impressive because it is only the equivalent of May of their two-year-old years when looked at in Northern Hemisphere terms. We're looking forward to him being another top-class sire." Quest For Fame raced for Juddmonte Farms, winning the G1 Epsom Derby and the G1 Hollywood Turf H. and finishing third in the Breeders' Cup Turf in both 1991 and 1992. A freshman sire of 1996, his two-year-old daughter Dame D'Harvard finished second in the G3 Prix du Calvados.

PETIONVILLE RETIRED Four-year-old **Petionville** (Seeking the Gold) has been retired after suffering a recurrence of an injury to his right knee which sidelined him in the fall of his three-year-old season. Petionville finished a disappointing ninth in his last start, the Keeneland Breeders' Cup Mile Oct. 12, and the injury was discovered at that time. "After the race, he had some heat in his knee," said trainer Niall O'Callaghan. "The veterinarians felt he could continue to race with some minor time off, but his owners have decided, based on his value at stud and the heavy interest already shown in him, to retire him." The MGSW will stand the 1997 season at Crestwood Farm in Lexington, Kentucky for a fee of \$10,000. After breaking his maiden in his only start at two, Petionville won five stakes as a three-year-old, including the GII Ohio Derby, GIII La Jolla and GIII Louisiana Derby. He took 10 months off after a fourth-place finish in the GI Molson Million before winning his first start back at four. "He was ranked in the top 10 three-year-olds of his generation last year," said O'Callaghan. "He's as good-looking and as professional as any horse I've ever been around. I'd love to have another horse like him." Petionville retires with seven wins in 15 starts and earnings of \$811,905.

OVERSEAS CHALLENGERS ARRIVE...The chartered flight from England was scheduled to touch down at Lester B. Pearson International Airport yesterday afternoon, and the horses were expected to be on the Woodbine backstretch by 4:00 p.m. On board were 10 from Team Europe: **Charnwood Forest (Ire)** (Warning {GB}) and **Mark Of Esteem (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}), Mile; **Dushyantor** (Sadler's Wells), **Pilsudski (Ire)** (Polish Precedent), **Shantou** (Alleged), **Singspiel (Ire)** (In The Wings {GB}) and **Wall Street** (Mr. Prospector), Turf; **Iktamal** (Danzig Connection), Sprint; **Falkenham (GB)** (Polar Falcon), Juvenile; and **Tamayaz** (Gone West), Classic. Also expected yesterday were the three French contenders--**Swain (Ire)** (Nashwan) and **Luna Wells (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), Turf; and **Spinning World** (Nureyev), Mile. The trio should land at 9:30 p.m., arriving at the stable area at 11:00 p.m. Blood from the foreign contingent will be drawn by Agriculture Canada veterinarians and tested, with results available within 48 hours. But, unlike the U.S., in Canada the quarantined horses may go to the track even before the tests results come in, and most will be out after the locally based runners have finished their work at 9:45 a.m.

CLASSIC

BREEZING TO THE BREEDERS' CUP...**Mahogany Hall** (Woodman), winner of the GI Whitney at Saratoga but off the board in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup last out, worked five furlongs on the Woodbine grass Monday; trainer Jimmy Baker had originally planned to work the colt on the main track, but switched surfaces when the track came up sloppy. Jockey Shane Sellers has picked up the mount for the Classic, replacing Jose Santos, who has ridden the horse in his last five starts. "I feel like Shane is on the top of his game right now," said Baker...**Mt. Sassafras** (Mt. Livermore), Canada's lone Classic contender, also worked Monday, going five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 over the wet track. "He skipped over the sloppy going," said trainer Barbara Minshall...Trying to become the first distaff winner of the Classic, **Yanks Music** (Air Forbes Won) worked a half in :48 4/5 in the slop Monday.

FROM THE LAND OF THE RISING SUN...Taiki Blizzard (Seattle Slew) will become the first Japanese runner in the Breeders' Cup when he breaks from the gate Saturday. "We have always been confident in his ability," said Nobutaka Tada, racing manager for the Taiki Farm. "From the beginning of his three-year-old year, we began to plan for the Breeders' Cup." Tada, an aeronautical engineer, said Taiki Farm sent another of their colorbearers to North America to help them plan The Blizzard's trip. Kurofone Mystery shipped to New York last March and finished third in the Distaff H. "We learned very much," said Tada of that experience. "We learned about shipping, which things to bring, things the grooms should do." They also learned that a horse can get lonely on the road. "We could see Kurofone Mystery was very, very lonely," he recalled. So Taiki Blizzard has a travelling companion, Red Alydar, who accompanied him on the 14-hour flight from Tokyo to New York and the 10-hour van ride from New York to Toronto; the colt also trains with the Classic hopeful every morning.

TURF

STAR AT A STANDSTILL...Ricks Natural Star (Natural Native), the most unlikely Breeders' Cup competitor in the event's history, arrived in Detroit Sunday night but was unable to get across the Canadian border. Checked into a Budgetel Motel, he was still waiting for the U.S. Department of Agriculture to endorse his veterinary papers Monday morning, but owner/trainer William Livingston said if he does make it into Canada, the seven-year-old, winless since 1993 and unraced since 1995, will be ridden by Remington Park-based jockey Sally Williams.

JUVENILE:

BREEZES...Acceptable (Capote) breezed five furlongs in 1:01 1/5 over Woodbine's sloppy main track Monday. "I'm sky-high on him right now," said trainer Nick Zito. Acceptable finished sixth in his last start, the GI Moet Champagne S. at Belmont Oct. 5...Frank Stronach's **Cash Deposit** (Deposit Ticket), six-length winner of the GIII Grey Breeders' Cup S. at Woodbine Oct. 6, worked six furlongs yesterday. "I caught him in 1:14 and change," said trainer Dan Vella. "He will just gallop up to the Juvenile off that work."...**His Honor** (Honor Grades) galloped Monday at Calder. Trainer David Vivian said the In Reality S. winner breezed six furlongs in 1:18 2/5 Saturday morning at the Miami track...**Sal's Driver** (Salem Drive) was vanned out of Philadelphia Park early Monday morning and was scheduled to arrive at Woodbine Monday evening. The Philly Park allowance winner worked a mile in 1:44 at the Philadelphia oval this past weekend.

BRAVE ACT OUT OF JUVENILE...Sid and Jenny Craig's Brave Act (GB) (Persian Bold {Ire}) did not ship to Woodbine Sunday with the other California horses and will not run in the Juvenile. "He bruised his left hind foot, probably on the flight from England," said Hall of Fame conditioner Ron McAnally. "We've been tubbing his foot and soaking it in Epsom salts, but it was just impossible to run him. He's lost too much training." Brave Act won the G3 Solario S. at Sandown Park in England Aug. 30.

MILE

CHAPOSA SPRINGS PROBABLE FOR MILE...Trainer Marty Wolfson has engaged jockey Craig Perret to ride **Chaposa Springs** (Baldski) in the Breeders' Cup. The four-year-old filly, cross-entered in the Mile and Sprint, will almost certainly contest the Mile, Wolfson said yesterday. Four-year-old Chaposa Springs has raced on the grass only once before, winning the Miramar S. at Calder in December of her two-year-old season.

SILVER RIDING WITH CIGAR Memories of Silver (Silver Hawk), undefeated in four starts on the turf, galloped over a "very sloppy" Belmont track Monday morning and is scheduled to arrive at Woodbine on the same plane with Cigar early Wednesday afternoon. "I decided it might be good luck to get on the same plane with Cigar," said her trainer James Toner.

SPRINT

SPRINTERS ON THE WORK TAB...Appealing Skier (Baldski), winner of the GII Kentucky Cup Sprint in his most recent start, worked a half mile in :47 3/5 under Woodbine's leading jockey Emile Ramsammy Monday. Mike Smith will ride the three-year-old colt in the Sprint...Also working yesterday was veteran runner **Friendly Lover** (Cutlass), who went five furlongs in :59 3/5 at Woodbine under regular rider Herb McCauley. The 8-year-old, fifth in last year's Sprint, was a dull seventh in the Oct. 6 GII Boojum H. in his most recent race, but his solid work here solidified his starting position Saturday. "If he would have gone in 1:02 or 1:03, we probably would have passed, but he was impressive and galloped out strong," said trainer Joe Pierce. "I can't explain the Boojum at all."...**Lit de Justice** (El Gran Senor) worked a sharp half-mile in :47 3/5 under jockey Corey Nakatani, who was celebrating his 26th birthday yesterday. The gray colt hasn't raced since finishing third in the GIII Pat O'Brien at Del Mar Aug. 17.

WHO DUNNIT...Canada's Distaff challenger **Mysteriously** (Afleet) had her final tune up for the big race yesterday, going five furlongs in 1:01 over Woodbine's sloppy main track. The five-year-old mare, a winner of seven races at Woodbine, will be making her final career start in the Breeders' Cup before joining owner Frank Stronach's broodmare band.

CHANDLER NAMED COBRA GOLF/TDN

SUBSCRIBER OF THE MONTH Alice Chandler, whose Mill Ridge Farm consigned a son of Gone West--Existentialist for \$1.4 million at the Keeneland September Sale, the highest price ever for a yearling at the sale, has been named the Cobra Golf/Thoroughbred Daily News Subscriber of the Month for September. The colt, originally owned by Tolle Otto and Shirley Taylor, was purchased by Buzz Chace as agent for Fox Hill Farm. Mill Ridge also consigned the sales-topping filly, a daughter of Forty Niner--My Song for You, who brought \$600,000 for breeder Carolyn Groves. "I thought I had a very even consignment, but I never thought I saw \$1.4 million," said Chandler. "It is a tremendous thrill. This colt was a nice horse, obviously, and he opened at \$400,000. That in itself kind of takes your breath. He had tremendous interest before the sale, but you never know." Chandler will receive a set of King Cobra golf clubs, the country's leading irons and woods, in recognition of the honor. "I have not had time to play golf lately," she said. "I played a lot when I was in Houston years ago, but I never learned how to putt. Now it looks like I'm going to have to learn."

LONESOME GLORY HEADS STEEPLECHASE

ENTRIES A field of 12, headed by three-time steeplechase Eclipse Award winner **Lonesome Glory** (Transworld), was entered today for Saturday's Breeders' Cup Grand National, the richest steeplechase in the United States. The fifth race on a six-race card at the Far Hills Races in Far Hills, New Jersey, the GI Grand National is worth \$150,000 and will be run over 2 5/8 miles. Lonesome Glory, who hasn't raced since finishing fourth in an English steeplechase in January, will face stiff competition from '95 Grand National winner **Rowdy Irishman** (Erins Isle {Ire}) and GI New York Turf Writers Cup winner **Petroski** (Polish Navy).

TTBA SALE SHOWS INCREASES The Texas Thoroughbred Association's (TTBA) 1996 Fall Mixed Sale concluded Sunday with solid increases in every category. The two-day auction saw 236 Thoroughbreds sell for a gross of \$915,600, a 31.1% increase over 1995's \$698,550. The average price also increased 20% to \$3,880 from \$3,234 in 1995. This year's median of \$2,200 was up 46.67% from last year's \$1,500. TTBA Sale Director Clay Murray said, "I am very pleasantly surprised in our across-the-board success. Our broodmare session alone averaged better than the entire sale last year. That's strong." Sunday's second and final session, which featured broodmares, broodmare prospects and stallion shares, saw 152 horses sell for a total of \$527,200 and an average of \$3,534. The top seller of the day was **Lady Rahy**, a four-year-old broodmare prospect who was purchased for \$21,000 by Capital Management of Morristown, Florida. By Rahy--Statue (Exclusive Native), Lady Rahy was consigned by Steve Marvin and Roberta Smoodin.

NORTH OF THE BORDER

So, you're coming to Toronto for the Breeders' Cup at Woodbine and you don't know much about the city or the people. Well, here's some help from a guy who has lived all his life in Toronna (nobody, but nobody, who lives in the city actually calls it Toronto).

First of all, when out and about (or oot and aboot, as Americans like to think we pronounce it), make sure you use the word "eh" a lot. As in "how's it going, eh?" or "Toronna's a pretty decent city, eh?"

Second, talk a lot about hockey. It's the national pastime of Canada (next to lacrosse and curling and snowball throwing) and it's a must conversation piece in Toronna, where the local team, the Maple Leafs, rule. Or used to rule, at one time. You might want to expand your language skills by chatting up one of the locals about the Leafs. "The Leafs are going all the way to the Cup, eh?" (That's the Stanley Cup, not the Breeders' Cup).

We stress that you start the conversation with the Stanley Cup, as much as you'd like to talk about the Breeders' Cup. Don't rush into that too soon--some people think it's all a bunch of horse hockey. But they are the same folks who idolized Colonel Sherman Potter of M*A*S*H fame.

Next, talk about the weather. "Is it always this cold this time of year, eh? I thought it only snowed in winter, eh?" You can even raise its significance regarding the Breeders' Cup. Even though it might be colder than the North Pole (which some people mistake for Canada) on the big day, you don't care because you came to see Cigar. "I know Cigar won't mind the cold weather because he's from New York, eh?"

Make sure you let 'em know you're aware that the temperature, 5 degrees, is in Celsius, even if it feels like 5 degrees Fahrenheit, and the only thing colder are the Maple Leafs--the only Cup they're going to is the Breeders' Cup.

But, in all seriousness, the city of Toronto itself needn't take a beat seat to any North American metropolis that has hosted the Breeders' Cup. It is universally recognized for its mix of people, culture and class.

The city has many interesting attractions, such as the Royal Alexander Theatre and O'Keefe Centre, both of which offer Broadway-type shows; and the Eaton Centre, which has excellent shopping in the heart of downtown. In midtown, Yorkville offers a little bit of everything in terms of trendy shops and dining.

For fine dining, Toronto has everything. I recommend any of the following Bigliardi's (operated by owner/breeder George Bigliardi); Hy's and Carmen's (for steaks); Mercer Street Grill (nouveau cuisine); Splendido's, Alice Fazooli's, Prego (Italian); Yung Luk (Chinese); and Ginsberg and Wong (Jewish and Chinese).

Supporting attractions include the Maple Leafs, and the Toronto Argonauts, the leading team in the Canadian Football League and featuring star quarterback Doug Flutie, the one-time Heisman Trophy winner. The Argos play the day after the Breeders' Cup at Skydome.

I strongly recommend that all visitors see the beautiful sights and exhibits that form my home town. These are the things that the Breeders' Cup executive committee used in its decision to choose Toronto as the first city outside the U.S. to host racing's championship event.

And, if you have a few dollars left after your trip, I urge you to buy *The Greatest Show On Turf, A History of the Breeders' Cup*. It took nine months of my life to write, but offers many years worth of memories of the Breeders' Cup!
