LIT DE JUSTICE TO ADENA SPRINGS FARM Lit de Justice (El Gran Senor), third in last year's Breeders' Cup Sprint and one of the favorites for Saturday's renewal, will be retired after the Woodbine race and will stand the 1997 breeding season at Adena Springs Farm in Midway, Kentucky, according to a story in today's *Daily Racing Form*. Frank Stronach, who owns Adena Springs, purchased 60 percent of Lit de Justice for breeding purposes last spring. Farm Manager Dan Hall told the *Form* there were four reasons why Adena Springs purchased Lit de Justice: "Pedigree, ability, speed and brilliance." The six-year-old gray has won nine of 35 starts to date for earnings of \$877,874. Winner of this year's GIII Palos Verdes H., GIII Bing Crosby Breeders' Cup H. and El Conejo H. and a graded stakes-placed runner in France, Lit de Justice is a full-brother to Colonel Collins, who finished third in the Epsom and Irish Derbies and the British 2,000 Guineas.

AQUEDUCT OPENS TODAY Aqueduct Racetrack's fall meeting opens today with the 52nd running of the GIII Discovery H. The biggest racing attractions of the 50-day meet are stuffed into the Thanksgiving weekend HolidayFest. Aqueduct will serve up the GII \$100,000 Fall Highweight H. Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 28; the GI \$150,000 Delta Top Flight H. for fillies and mares at a mile Nov. 29; both the GI \$250,000 NYRA Mile for ages three and up and the GII \$200,000 Demoiselle for two-year-old fillies Nov. 30; and the GII \$200,000 Remsen for two-year-olds Sunday, Dec. 1. Along with its live racing, Aqueduct will also offer simulcast action from leading tracks--one full card daily (Keeneland then Churchill Downs in November, Calder in December) followed by the twilight simulcast of several races from top California tracks. Racing will be conducted five days a week, with Mondays and Tuesdays dark. First post is at 12:30 p.m. daily.

CIGAR TRAVEL UPDATE...Defending Breeders' Cup Classic champion Cigar (Palace Music) is scheduled to leave his Belmont Park barn at noon today and is expected to arrive at Woodbine by 3:30 or 4 p.m. after a 1 hour, 20 minute flight via Tex Sutton charter. The six-year-old horse is slated to have his final breeze for the Classic this morning over the Belmont training track. "That seems to be our best shot," said trainer Bill Mott. "If it rains, then we're in trouble." The forecast calls for clear skies in New York through this evening. A total of seven horses will be on Cigar's flight, including Breeders' Cup contenders MEMORIES OF SILVER (Silver Hawk) (Mile), MIGHTY FORUM (GB) (Presidium {GB}) (Mile) and JESS C'S WHIRL (Island Whirl) (Sprint).

ALPHABET SOUP TO CLASSIC...Alphabet Soup (Cozzene), who had been pre-entered in both the Classic and Sprint, will contest the Classic Saturday, trainer David Hofmans confirmed yesterday.

BREEZES...Louis Quatorze (Sovereign Dancer), third to Skip Away and Cigar in the Oct. 5 Jockey Club Gold Cup, breezed five furlongs at Woodbine Tuesday in 1:03 4/5 under regular jockey Pat Day. "I was very pleased with the work," Day said. "He did it in a very business-like mannèr. He galloped out very strong and he seemed like a happy camper. If he stays in this frame of mind, he should be in great shape Saturday.".....Another three-year-old, **Will's Way** (Easy Goer), worked six furlongs in 1:12 2/5 yesterday with regular jockey Jorge Chavez in the saddle. The Travers hero galloped out seven furlongs in 1:27. "He worked real well," said trainer H. James Bond. "Did it just the way you'd want a horse to do it. Switched leads right on command. He really looked the part.".....GI Whitney H. winner **Mahogany Hall** (Woodman) walked the shedrow Tuesday morning following his 1:03 2/5 work on the grass Monday.

TURF

REPORTERS GET LEG UP ON RICKS NATURAL

STAR...Ricks Natural Star (Natural Native), whose most recent victory came in a \$3,500 claimer at Sunland Park Oct. 27, 1993, finally broke through the U.S.D.A.'s red tape and was permitted to cross the border to Canada, arriving at Woodbine by van Monday night. His appearance before the racing press Tuesday morning caused one of the most unique scenes in 13 years of the Breeders' Cup, as two reporters were given permission to climb aboard the horse to pose for pictures. When one of the reporters, David Ashforth from England's *Sporting Life*, was asked how the seven-year-old felt, he responded, "Like a champion." Owner-trainer William Livingston, who obtained the services of an exercise rider he met Monday night in a bar near Woodbine, said he is having some difficulty raising the entry fee of \$20,000 due today. "I have several houses I might have to finance in the long run," he said. He plans to negotiate a loan from his bank in Artesia, N.M. for immediate needs. Livingston said Ricks Natural Star can win and is here to promote three products his owner has developed, including one for navicular disease.

SHANTOU'S FRIEND...Representatives of the International Racing Bureau often get strange requests from horsemen when shipping to foreign countries. One came this year regarding Turf hopeful **Shantou** (Alleged). Nicky Vaughan, head travelling lad for trainer John Gosden, phoned Nick Clarke of the IRB about two weeks ago to talk about Shantou's needs. "They often need a pony, but for Shantou, they asked for an Appaloosa," Clarke recounted. "That part seemed relatively easy, but then they said they needed an Appaloosa that had spots. Not only that, but one that would be fast enough to keep up with Shantou when he canters." Clarke didn't have to look far to fill the order, finding the appropriately named Lots of Dots, a 16-hand Appaloosa whose rider, Charlie Brown, said can and will keep up with a cantering Shantou. Lots of Dots was tested at 9:45 am. Tuesday, when he and Shantou walked once around Woodbine's main track then very lightly cantered once around. Back at the barn afterwards, Vaughan and Brown both said things went very well.

BREEZES...Awad (Caveat), sixth in last year's Turf, breezed a half-mile in :49 2/5 over Woodbine's "soft" grass course yesterday in preparation for Saturday's renewal. The six-year-old, second in the GI Turf Classic at Belmont Oct. 5, went the first quarter in :25 3/5 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:02.

JUVENILE

MICHELLE ARRIVES...Calder-based **Michelle'sallhands** (Slewacide) arrived at Woodbine Tuesday on an overnight flight from Miami. The two-year-old colt is still a maiden, but finished second by a neck to Juvenile pre-entrant **His Honor** (Honor Grades) in the In Reality division of the Florida Stallion S. Sept. 28.

BREEZES...Buckram Oak Farm's **Gun Fight** (Fit to Fight) blew out five furlongs at Woodbine yesterday in 1:00 3/5. Pat Day, who rode the colt to a third-place finish in the GI Hopeful S. and a fourth-place effort in the GI Moet Champagne S., was aboard for the work....Moet Champagne winner **Ordway** (Salt Lake) drilled a half-mile in :48 flat over Woodbine's "good" main track Tuesday....GI Norfolk S. runner-up **Zippersup** (Alwuhush) breezed five furlongs in 1:02 yesterday under jockey Sandy Hawley. "He didn't get tired," said trainer Bob Baffert. "I can't get him tired." Baffert added, "The reason I brought this horse is because he's gone two turns already. He'll love the distance. He just keeps going and going. When a horse goes two turns for the first time, he'll come to the second turn and go 'whoa.' This horse has already done that."

MILE

CHAPOSA SPRINGS DEFINITE FOR MILE...**Chaposa Springs** (Baldski), cross-entered in the Mile and Sprint, breezed a half-mile in :50 Tuesday at Calder. The four-year-old filly was scheduled to board a plane Tuesday night for an early Wednesday morning arrival in Toronto. "She'll go in the Mile," trainer Marty Wolfson confirmed yesterday. "The Sprint has been a treacherous race some years. She won on turf as a two-year-old and I've always felt she can be at least as good on grass as dirt."

BREEZES...Dumaani (Danzig) worked a half-mile in :49 1/5 over Woodbine's E.P. Taylor turf course yesterday. The five-year-old gray was scheduled to be retired after the Oct. 12 GIII Keeneland Breeders' Cup Mile, but his racing career was extended for one more outing after he won that event....**Kiridashi** (Bold Ruckus), six-length winner of the Heresy S. at one-mile over the Woodbine turf Sept. 29, drilled a half-mile in :47 4/5 at Woodbine Tuesday, galloping out five furlongs in 1:00 under regular jockey Mickey Walls. "That was an easy work for him," said trainer Barb Minshall. "Just look how relaxed he is. He should do well and I'm pretty confident, but it is the horses who will decide the outcome."

DISTAFF

MYSTERIOUSLY'S SWAN SONG...Dan Vella-trainee **Mysteriously** (Afleet) will be making her final career start in the Breeders' Cup Distaff. The five-year-old mare, now called "Mysty" around the barn, has won 13 of 27 career starts, seven of those at Woodbine. Tracy Smith has been her groom since the roan came to the track as a two-year-old. "We used to call her Florence then," said Smith. "Even as a baby she was so easy to work around, so sleepy that none of us thought she would run an inch. She sure fooled us." Mysteriously won the GIII Konica Long Look H. at the Meadowlands for the second straight year in her last start Sept. 14.

JUVENILE FILLIES

DUNBAR HILL TAKES TO WOODBINE...Exercise rider Jose Cuevas galloped **Dunbar Hill** (Pine Bluff) 1 1/4 miles around Woodbine's main track Tuesday morning. "She really liked it," said Cuevas. "She doesn't care one way or another what the track's like. She just wants to go. She dances when she goes to the track and covers a lot of ground in her stride." Cuevas was with trainer Ron McAnally when he purchased Dunbar Hill for \$140,000 for Sid Craig at the 1996 Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale. "We were there for three days and she was the only horse we bought," said Cuevas. "She had worked the fastest eighth (:10 1/5) of all the horses at the sale." Dunbar Hill displayed the same quality of speed when she broke her maiden by six lengths at Santa Anita Oct. 5, covering the mile in 1:36 3/5. "Her time in that race was faster than the time of the winner of the Oak Leaf S., which was run the same day," said McAnally.

SPRINT

LOVE GROWS INJURED...Sprint pre-entrant **Love Grows** (Steady Growth) has suffered an injury that will keep him out of the Breeders' Cup. "He is lame in behind and is definitely out (of the Sprint)," trainer Roger Attfield confirmed Tuesday morning. "The exact nature of the problem has not yet been determined by the vets, but it looks as if he will be out of action for some time at least." Four-year-old Love Grows has won four of five career starts, all at Woodbine, including the six-furlong Highlander H. Oct. 6. **Jess C's Whirl** (Island Whirl) has earned a place in the starting gate for the Sprint due to Love Grows' defection from the field.

BREEZES...Criollito (Arg) (Candy Stripes), who was supplemented to the Sprint by owners Robert & Beverly Lewis, drilled five furlongs in a bullet :59 3/5 at Woodbine yesterday with substitute jockey Sandy Hawley in the saddle. "A little fast, Sandy," trainer Bob Baffert said as Hawley pulled up. "Was it?" Hawley responded. "He did it easy." In fact, Hawley said he had figured the clocking was in the range of 1:00 to 1:01. "You know what that means?" Baffert asked. "He loves that track. He gets a hold of it. God, I hope it rains."

LEVEL SANDS TO STAND AT BUCK POND **Level Sands** (Storm Cat) has been retired and will enter stud in 1997 at Buck Pond Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. The five-year-old won four of 15 starts for earnings of \$117,371 and finished second in the GIII Churchill Downs H. in 1995. Out of the French Group 2 winner Sea Sands, Level Sands is a full-brother to MGSW Future Storm. "Level Sands is a big, flashy black colt whose confirmation is impeccable," said Doug Arnold, owner of Buck Pond. "He possessed raw, natural speed and a pedigree to match. If you see him, you'll breed to him." His 1997 stud fee has been set at \$5,000 live foal.

As a result of action taken by the Arkansas Supreme Court Monday, the Oaklawn Park-backed Amendment 4 stands as the only gaming-related Constitutional amendment that will remain on the ballot for Arkansas voters Tuesday, Nov. 5. The Court action struck Amendments 5, 7 and 8, all on the basis of flaws in their ballot titles. Those three amendments all proposed casinos in Arkansas, but differed as to where they would be located, how many would be established and how the revenue produced from them would be spent. "Our Amendment is quite easy to understand," explained Oaklawn General Manager Eric Jackson. "It provides for the establishment of a state lottery, allows charitable bingo and lets the people of Hot Springs determine whether or not they would approve three casinos in the city, one of which would be here at Oaklawn."

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

IN COMMAND (IRE) (c, 2, Sadler's Wells--Flying Melody {Ire}, by Auction Ring)

It isn't often that a mare breeds Grade I winners by own-brothers, but that is the feat achieved by the Auction Ring mare Flying Melody. Already represented by Champion two-year-old filly Lyric Fantasy (Tate Gallery), Flying Melody is now also dam of the G1 Dewhurst S. winner In Command by Tate Gallery's brother Sadler's Wells. Unlike his sister who was a pure sprinter, In Command appeared to relish the step up from six to seven furlongs and will be aimed for the one mile 2,000 Guineas next season. The pedigree is an interesting example of inbreeding to inbred horses. There is a duplication of Djeddah (a very closely inbred horse, who appears in Tate Gallery and Sadler's Wells as broodmare sire of the broodmare sire) and the second dam is inbred to Fair Trial, while the second dam of Tate Gallery and Sadler's Wells is by Forli, who is closely inbred to Fair Trial and his three-parts sister Riot.
