MYSTERIOUSLY OUT OF DISTAFF *Mysteriously* (Afleet), who had been entered in Saturday's Breeders' Cup Distaff at Woodbine, is expected to be withdrawn from the \$1 million race. After galloping over the Toronto oval Thursday morning, her trainer Daniel Vella said, "When she came back, she just wasn't right. It's a problem ankle she's had for a long time. The Distaff was going to be her last race anyway and, with the race on our home course, we had hoped to give her a try. She certainly doesn't owe us a thing." The five-year-old mare, owned by Frank Stronach, won 13 of 27 starts, including nine stakes, for earnings of \$659,579. In what was probably her final career start at the Meadowlands Sept. 14, the roan won the GIII Konica Long Look H. for the second straight year.

WILLIE CARSON ON ROAD TO RECOVERY

Willie Carson, the five-time British champion jockey whose life was threatened when he was cow-kicked in the stomach at Newbury last month, made an emotional return to the course yesterday. Carson, still unsure about plans to resume his riding career, was working as a T.V. commentator and admitted it was "sweet" to be on the road to a full recovery. The 53-year-old rider added, "It is marvelous to be wearing a suit again and not a track suit. It is good to be at the races and I can feel the adrenalin pumping." Carson also paid tribute to his doctor, Myrddin Rees, who decided an operation was not necessary despite damage to the rider's liver. The jockey said, "He was a brave man. He could have gone in but he thought it better to sit and wait. He told me he was playing poker and that he thought he had a good hand. He was right."

HEAVENLINESS RETIRED *Heavenliness* (Lord Avie), a five-time stakes-winner of \$342,092, has been retired. The six-year-old chestnut mare will begin her broodmare career in 1997 at Taylor Made Farm in Nicholasville, Kentucky. Plans have not been finalized regarding who *Heavenliness*, owned by Sam Pollock, will be bred to.

TURF TALK...The European contingent was released from quarantine yesterday and several of their number took to the E.P. Taylor Turf Course early for their morning exercise. Afterwards, their connections commented on the course. "It has lovely, galloping bends; you couldn't ask for more," said jockey Willie Ryan, who galloped Turf runner *Dushyantor* (Sadler's Wells) Thursday. "Horses' hooves are cutting in—it's soft ground." Simon Crisford, the racing manager for Godolphin, added. "The horses appear to dig their toes in a bit more on the backstretch. The course is in very good condition. If it remains dry, it will be perfect Saturday." Godolphin will be represented by *Wall Street* (Mr. Prospector) in the Turf, *Tamayaz* (Gone West) in the Classic, and *Mark Of Esteem (Ire)* (Darshaan {GB}) and *Charnwood Forest (Ire)* (Warning {GB}) in the Mile. Jimmy Scott, aboard Turf contender *Singspiel (Ire)* (In The Winds {GB}) yesterday morning, raved about the course. "It's beautiful ground, the best I've seen all year," he said. Added *Singspiel's* trainer, Michael Stoute, "The course should suit any horse and I think the worst it should be is on the soft side of good on Saturday."

TEAM LUKAS COMES TO TOWN...D. Wayne Lukas, by far the leading Breeders' Cup trainer with 94 starters, 12 winners and more than \$11.5 million in purses, arrived yesterday with his 10-horse line-up for this year's event. The Tex Sutton flight originated in Kentucky, where it picked up *Boston Harbor* (Capote), Juvenile; and *Cheyenne City* (Carson City), Juvenile Fillies. It then stopped off in New York to board *City Band* (Carson City), Juvenile Fillies; *Editor's Note* (Forty Niner), Classic; *Gold Tribute* (Mr. Prospector), Juvenile; *Honour and Glory* (Relaunch), Sprint; *Lord Carson* (Carson City), Sprint; *Marlin* (Sword Dance {Ire}), Turf; *Serena's Song* (Rahy), Distaff; and *Sharp Cat* (Storm Cat), Juvenile Fillies. "Obviously, we're not going to dominate this thing," said Lukas. "No one ever has and no one ever will. But we'll have some fun here."

CLASSIC

CIGAR TOURS THE TRACK... Taking his first look at the surroundings at Woodbine, Cigar (Palace Music) first toured the paddock and then jogged once the wrong way around the main track under regular exercise rider Gerard Guenther yesterday morning. "He was marching right along this morning," said trainer Bill Mott. "He looked happy, willing, eager and full of himself." Mott added that he knows his superstar likes what he sees at Woodbine, explaining, "I can tell by the way he swings his rear end when he's on his way home. He was prancing, he liked the air--he liked everything about it."

CLASSIC COMMENTS... Dare and Go (Alydar) makes his first dirt start outside of California, but trainer Richard Mandella said, "It would be a surprise to me if he didn't handle (the Woodbine track)." ...Owner John Murphy, who will watch his three-year-old Formal Gold (Black Tie Affair {re}) challenge for Classic honors, quipped yesterday, "I'm trying to figure out whether it would be better to pass Cigar on his left or right side. We know our horse will run big against 'The Boss'." ...How will trainer Leo O'Brien beat Cigar with his three-year-old filly Yanks Music (Cormorant)? "If Cigar takes a wrong turn and all the others follow him, that would certainly help," he said.

TURF

TUNING UP... Looking for his third straight Grade I win, Diplomatic Jet (Roman Diplomat) worked three-eighths in :36 and galloped out a half in :48 2/5 on the Taylor Turf yesterday. The four-year-old captured the GI Man o' War and GI Turf Classic Invitational in his last two starts...California shipper Talloires (Tremolino) also breezed three furlongs, going in :39 Thursday...

Windsharp (Lear Fan), one of two distaffers in the field this year, went a half in :49 2/5 Thursday. "The course was too soft for her today, but it will be better by Saturday," said trainer Wally Dollase.

BETTING THE FARM... Owner/trainer William Livingston put up the title to his New Mexico clinic as collateral to obtain a loan for pre-entry and entry fees to the Breeders' Cup. The seven-year-old Ricks Natural Star (Natural Native) will have to finish fourth, earning \$56,000, in order to turn a profit for Livingston.

MILE

MILE MOVES... Spinning World (Nureyev) worked three furlongs in :37 over the soft turf course Thursday with jockey Cash Asmussen in the saddle...Helmsman (El Gran Senor) breezed the same distance in :38 3/5. "He would really prefer a course on the 'good' side," said trainer Wally Dollase, adding, "He runs well off a layoff and we are hoping for a drier turf than it was (Thursday)." The colt will be making his first start since running third in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup June 30.

DISTAFF

PRACTICE RUN FOR THE PRINCESS... Jewel Princess (Key to the Mint) blew out three furlongs in :37 1/5 Thursday morning, galloping out the half-mile in :49 2/5. "She couldn't have done it better," said trainer Wally Dollase. "We have it all--a fit horse, a small field and a good post." The four-year-old's owners, Rick and Martha Stephen, also indicated yesterday that their filly will race again next year at five.

SPRINT

BC BREEZING... Team Europe challenger Iktamal (Danzig Connection) worked a half-mile in :47 on the main track yesterday. The colt was wearing toe grabs for the first time. "They make a huge difference to the way he's moving compared to when we took him to Lingfield (England's all-weather track)," said trainer Ed Dunlop.

LIT NOT SO LIGHT ON HIS FEET... Lit de Justice (El Gran Senor), known as "Pumpkin" around the barn, had grabbed his right front foot when he first arrived in Canada and stepped on the spot again during his gallop yesterday, but trainer Jenine Sahadi said the six-year-old was just fine for Saturday's big race. "It's all right," said Sahadi after making a thorough inspection of the foot.

ON THE WORK TAB... Runaway Mary (Hatchet Man) worked three furlongs in :37 1/5 with Hall of Fame jockey Sandy Hawley in the saddle Thursday.

BREEDERS CUP BEST BET: Bill Handleman,

columnist, Asbury Park Press; winner of the 1995 World Series of Handicapping: "Just to be contrary, I'm going to pick Boston Harbor in the Juvenile. You always like to go against the flow, and everybody is suddenly anti-Boston Harbor. About a dozen people have told me they saw his last race in the Keeneland Breeders' Futurity and decided it wasn't a good race because he didn't beat anything. Everybody has jumped off him and onto the Ordway wagon. Boston Harbor is the only speed in the race and he drew the #2 post. He is one of the favorites in the race, but he might not be such a big favorite because of Ordway."

BREEDERS CUP BEST BET: Bill Finley, New York

Daily News: Da Hoss appeared to be the best American turf miler in the country this summer, but may have lost some fans with a second-place finish in the Kelso H. However, he had missed 10 days of training prior to that race and was, according to trainer Michael Dickinson, "a little short." Blocked for a good part of his trip, he still ran well and should improve enough to win the Mile in a mild upset. He's untested on soft turf, which is a major concern.
