FORTUNE AND FOLLY AT BREEDERS' CUP XIII

It was a day fortuitous for some and unfortunate for others. The Breeders' Cup, hosted for the first time outside the United States, did not run smoothly for the Woodbine starting gate crew, and the Canadian track's mutuel department had an ordeal of their own to overcome (see related News, p 4&5); and while four of yesterday's Breeders' Cup races saw champions crowned, the day's crowning event, the \$4,000,000 Classic, saw Horse of the Decade **Cigar** (Palace Music) go down to defeat once again. The brilliant bay stirred the imagination with his mastery in the Middle East and an historic 16-race winning streak, and he will certainly end his career as the 1996 Horse of the Year, but Cigar also bids farewell to the game on what was once an unthinkable note--running valiantly but in vain in two straight losses. "He didn't disgrace himself," said owner/breeder Allen Paulson. "He tried damn hard. We were hoping and praying he would win today. It's been a great run, but it's probably time to go home with him." A head short when finishing second to three-year-old Skip Away in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup October 5, the six-year-old was 3-5 to turn it around and successfully defend his title in the Classic. Jockey Jerry Bailey had the champ settled midfield down the backstretch, then moved to challenge five-wide as the field swept around the turn; the pair had dead aim on the lead but just couldn't get there as the grey **Alphabet Soup** (Cozzene) outfinished Preakness winner **Louis Quatorze** (Sovereign Dancer) by a nose, with Cigar another head back in third. "He was wide and he couldn't overcome it," said trainer Bill Mott. "When he was at his very, very, very best, he would shoot by and open up. Maybe he's lost a step. I knew it was going to be tough to keep him at his peak to the end of this year. He went down, but he went down battling." The loss will not cost Cigar a second straight Horse of the Year title, and it will not cost his trainer any lost sleep. "I'm not torn apart," said Mott. "My feeling was more of appreciation than any type of letdown for the loss. If you want to be a realist, you know that it just can't go on. He's just flesh and blood." There were four championships collected on the track: **Boston Harbor** (Capote), first in the Juvenile; **Jewel Princess** (Key to the Mint), triumphant in the Distaff; Sprint winner **Lit de Justice** (El Gran Senor); and **Storm Song** (Summer Squall), tops in the Juvenile Fillies are all likely to earn divisional honors with their Breeders' Cup victories.

Alphabet Soup lost the nine-furlong GII Goodwood H. via a debatable stewards' disqualification last time out, but had proved he could run with top company winning three straight graded races last winter, and when besting Sprint winner Lit de Justice (3rd) taking the GIII Pat O'Brien H. off a five-and-a-half month layoff August 17. Stretching out to a mile and a quarter for only the second time in his career, the roan was rated just off the pace of ATTICUS (Nureyev), moved four-wide into the stretch and finished with determination to outgame three-year-old Louis Quatorze and superstar Cigar in a three-way photo. "I'm thrilled," said winning jockey Chris McCarron. "It was a wonderful ending for a long day. To possibly take something away from Cigar doesn't really sit very well with me because I have the utmost respect for him. But I feel fortunate to be on the right horse to beat him when he's beatable." Louis Quatorze, third in the Jockey Club Gold Cup last out after disappointing in his first trip over the track when seventh in the Woodbine Million, ran game between horses and just missed.

Storm Song, six-length winner of the GII Adirondack S. at Saratoga in August, was a disappointing sixth in the GI Spinaway, then bounced back to run second in the GI Matron at Belmont. Looking for further improvement, trainer Nick Zito raced her on Lasix for the first time in the GI Frizette last out and the bay miss responded with an impressive score; she put them back-to-back here, moving through the field to reach contention at the top of the lane and outfinishing stablemate and front-runner Love That Jazz to earn herself a Breeders' Cup and an Eclipse championship. "To win a championship race like this is like getting an A+ on a report card," said Dogwood's Cot Campbell. "She will be sent to Aiken, South Carolina for the winter. She won't go to the Triple Crown. There are too many universes to traverse for fillies for those races." The Zito-trained Love That Jazz set the pace and held well to be second. Matron winner and Frizette second SHARP CAT (Storm Cat), part of the three-pronged Team Lukas attack, was rank early while racing behind horses and bore out on the first turn, carrying HIDDEN RESERVE (Mr. Prospector) and BARBED WIRE (Affirmed) wide; she tired badly and finished ninth in her first two-turn try.

The lukewarm favorite in a competitive group, Lit de Justice was looking to end his racing career with his first Grade I win. The striking gray, headed to stud in Kentucky, was third as the 4-5 favorite in the GIII Pat O'Brien H. August 17 in his last start and third in this event last year; he sat last for the first quarter as Team Lukas runners LORD CARSON (Carson City) and Honour and Glory cut out the early fractions, but found room up the rail as he started his bid, then switched to the outside for the final drive and strode clear late, making Jenine Sahadi the first woman to train a Breeders' Cup winner. The victory was bittersweet for jockey Corey Nakatani, whose sister Dawn was murdered less than a month ago. "All this was for Dawn," said Nakatani. "I just hope she is in a better place and that she is at peace now." The result could be appealed, as six of 13 horses were loaded incorrectly by saddlecloth number, and not in post position order (see *News Today*).

Jockey Corey Nakatani, 0-for-12 in the Breeders' Cup before yesterday, became the 13th rider in the event's history to win two of the championship races on one card, and he dedicated his victory in the Sprint and here in the Distaff to his slain sister. "I've got an angel on my shoulder and Dawn is her name," he said as he headed to the winner's circle for the second time. "This is for her." The crowd's second choice, Jewel Princess was rated off a moderate pace as TOP SECRET (Afleet), shadowed by Serena's Song, set fractions of :24 and :48 2/5. Bidding for an Eclipse Award with her two competitors for year-end honors in front of her, the Florida-bred bay split horses at the top of the stretch and finished fastest of all along the inside to win going away. "She was appropriately named," said trainer Wally Dollase. "She's one heck of a jewel, and acts like a princess." Last year's champion three-year-old filly Serena's Song, bidding for her first Breeders' Cup win after finishing second in the '94 Juvenile Fillies and fifth in the '95 Distaff, moved to the lead as they straightened for home but, despite another game effort, she could not hold the winner safe and had to settle for second. Different (Arg) loomed boldly at the top of the lane but could not sustain her rally and finished third, earning back \$120,000 of the \$200,000 her owners put up to supplement her to the race.

Never off the board in eight turf starts, Da Hoss found himself on the main track attempting the Breeders' Cup Sprint last year; he finished 13th and last and has not raced over that surface since. Twice a winner during an abbreviated 1996 campaign, the four-year-old just missed last time out in his first start in two months; blocked on the far turn in the Gill Kelso at Belmont, the game gelding came running late and finished second by a head. But jockey Gary Stevens kept his mount out of harm's way this time, gaining a ground-saving position into the turn as Canadian KIRIDASHI (Bold Ruckus) and URGENT REQUEST (IRE) (Rainbow Quest) set the pace, then swinging to the outside for running room down the lane. The two took the lead a furlong from home and held European Group One winner Spinning World safe in the final yards. "(Trainer Michael Dickinson) did just a great job getting this horse ready," said Stevens. "He walked the turf course this morning and he knew the best part of the course to put me on. We had a great trip all the way." The 6-5 favorite in the race, Team European sensation MARK OF ESTEEM (IRE) (Darshaan {GB}) launched a bid three-wide on the turn and was in contention with a furlong to race but could not sustain his rally and ended up seventh. "We had a good trip but he got a little rank with me," said jockey Frankie Dettori. "He has a good turn of foot, but the ground was too soft (on the backstretch). We paid the price in the straight--I pressed the button, and there was no response. You didn't see the true Mark Of Esteem today."

Boston Harbor had lost only once in his career coming into this race and was a perfect two-for-two around two turns, but a narrow win in the GII Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland last time left some with doubts, and Moet Champagne winner Ordway went into the Juvenile as the favorite. A speedy son of 1986 Juvenile winner Capote, Boston Harbor jumped out to the lead at the break and was never headed; New York Yankees owner George Steinbrenner, back in the Bronx as he waited to watch his championship baseball team win the World Series, saw colorbearer Acceptable make a determined run at the winner, only to be turned back as the winner refused to lose. "This is a very game horse," said winning jockey Jerry Bailey of Boston Harbor. "It's not good on my heart, but it's okay on him." Favored Ordway, well back early, made a belated bid but was no match for the top two.

Runner-up at 22-1 in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in his most recent outing after taking a G3 in Ireland and a G1 in Germany, Pilsudski (Ire) was again overlooked at the windows despite finishing first or second against top company in five of six starts this year. Dual Grade I winner **DIPLOMATIC JET** (Roman Diplomat) set the pace as unmercifully outclassed **RICKS NATURAL STAR** (Natural Native) sat second to his outside. The front-runners tired from their early efforts, but patiently ridden by jockey Walter Swinburn, who had come back after a suffering head injuries and fracturing ribs, a collarbone and his left shoulder in a frightening spill at Hong Kong's Sha Tin Race Course in February, the Irish-bred Pilsudski moved up steadily to challenge GI Canadian International winner **Singspiel (Ire)** as they straightened into the stretch and proved best in the drive. "I can't tell you what this means to me," said Swinburn. "I've had some dark days. I dedicate this victory to my family; I dedicate this to my parents." The favored Godolphin entry came home in second, third, fourth and eighth.

Godolphin's Saeed bin Suroor grabbed what appears to be a decisive lead in the race to be Britain's champion trainer of 1996 with Medaaly's win which puts Suroor around \$54,773 ahead of his main rival Henry Cecil. Successful jockey Gary Hind said: "My horse went to post well, but he didn't really take a hold early in the race. But he battled at the end and saw the trip out well." Favorite Benny The Dip, a winner at Group Two level on his previous start when finishing well ahead of Medaaly, became slightly fractious at the gates and may not have shown quite his best form. John Reid, riding him for the first time, said: "He might have gone over the top for the year." Each of the first three home can be backed at 25-1 for next year's 2000 Guineas.

SNAFU AT THE GATE IN BC SPRINT Six of the 13 starters in yesterday's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint broke from the wrong stalls in the starting gate after they were loaded by saddlecloth number, rather than by their assigned post positions. **Paying Dues** (Cure the Blues), who finished second at 31-1 in the race, was the horse most adversely affected by the mistake; he drew post seven, but wore #12 as part of the mutuel field and so broke from five stalls outside of his assigned position. Also out of position were **Boundless Moment** (Crafty Prospector), 9th; **Criollito (Arg)** (Candy Stripes), 12th; **Honour and Glory** (Relaunch), 3rd; **Friendly Lover** (Cutlass), 11th; and **Langfuhr** (Danzig), 8th; wearing #7, 8, 9, 10 and 11, respectively, the five all broke from one post to the inside of their assigned draw. "A protest was not lodged immediately after the race," said Nelson Ham, one of three presiding stewards representing the Ontario Racing Commission. "A protest should have been lodged before the result became official. Therefore, if an owner or trainer of one of the horses involved in the incorrect loading does appeal, it will have to be heard at the Ontario Racing Commission level."

AGAINST THE ODDS Prices and odds on the Breeders' Cup races could not be calculated for 41 minutes after an unidentified patron wagered \$35,000 on a horse in the Breeders' Cup Mile. "The system limit is \$5,000," explained Autotote President Jerry Lawrence, who said that the teller entered the first of seven \$5,000 tickets, which the system tried to convert from American to Canadian dollars. "The system fell down," said Lawrence. "Wagering was not affected, but we could not calculate payoffs (for the Mile) or prices (for the Juvenile). Off-site had no payoffs or odds during the period." Midway through wagering for the Juvenile, Autotote programmers corrected the problem.

CORREGGIO UPSETS IN STEEPLECHASE

Winning trainer Paul Cole said: "He is a real trier and this was a good performance. The second was well fancied but our horse fought hard."
