**HALLING MAY RUN IN JAPAN** **Halling** (Diesis {GB}), whose victories in both Sandown's Eclipse S. and York's International S. this year made him the only horse ever to capture that G1 double on two occasions, is now being trained with a shot at the November 24 Japan Cup in mind. The Godolphin-owned five-year-old finished second in his most recent outing in the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket and it had been assumed that he would not run again this season. But trainer Saeed bin Suroor said yesterday, "He is still in training and we are considering accepting the invitation to send him to the Japan Cup. It will depend on how he is nearer the race and whether he shows us he can stay the mile and a half. But it is a possibility we are discussing and Sheikh Mohammed will give his decision after we have talked." Halling, unbeaten on turf for 26 months before suffering defeat in the Champion S., has never raced beyond 10 furlongs.

**MISTLE CAT'S DEATH RULED SUFFOCATION** **Mistle Cat** (Storm Cat), the winner of this year's G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua in Milan who was found dead in his box at Sean Woods's Newmarket stables last week, appears to have died of suffocation. Britain's Animal Health Trust has been carrying out a post mortem on the six-year-old grey and, apart from a slight swelling in his lower intestine, little has been revealed about the cause of his death. Woods has disclosed that the theory is that Mistle Cat put his head close to the door of his stable when laying down on the floor and was unable to breath. "That's all the vets can come up with at present," said Woods. "They are still taking culture tests, but I don't expect them to find anything else." Mistle Cat was on the verge retiring to stud and offers were being considered to stand him as a stallion in either Britain or the USA.

**YELLOW RIBBON INVITATIONAL S.-GI, \$600,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 10fT**

**Donna Viola (GB)** (Be My Chief), winner last time out of the G2 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp on Arc day, will make her final start for Newmarket-based trainer Chris Wall at Santa Anita Sunday. The four-year-old filly, who flew out from Britain for California on Tuesday evening, is set to join Ben Cecil's barn to continue her racing career after this weekend's 10-furlong contest. Wall said: "It's going to be a tough race, because not only will Donna Viola be trying to beat **Timarida (Ire)** (Kalaglow), but I am told the turf track at Santa Anita is a front-runner's course and Donna Viola is definitely no front-runner. But she is in good form for Sunday and Gary Stevens has been booked to ride." Wall himself is planning to leave Britain on Friday, and added, "going to America to race is the best thing for her. There just aren't really the races for older fillies in Europe unless they are capable of beating top colts."

**TATTERSALLS CONTINUES ON UPSWING** The international flavor of the Tattersalls Autumn Yearling Sale continued on the third day of selling yesterday with session topper **Inquisitor** (Alleged) heading for Saudi Arabia. Trained in Britain by John Gosden for Prince Khalid Abdullah, the four-year-old was purchased by agent Charles Gordon-Watson on behalf of Prince Faisal bin Khalid for 135,000 guineas (\$221,830) and will go on to race in Saudi Arabia. American buyers were again active at the top of the market, with agent John Ferguson picking up another trainee for Elliott Walden. Ferguson secured the winning colt **Social Pillar** (Gone West) for 75,000 guineas (\$123,239). Wednesday's gross was up 31% from last year, rising to 2,757,000 guineas (\$4,530,282). The average of 12,308 guineas (\$20,224) was up 21 percent from last year. Tuesday's session saw 225 lots sold for a gross of 3,360,700 (\$5,522,276), with the average of 14,936 (\$24,542), up 18 percent from last year's 12,684 (\$20,842).

Trainer Harvey Vanier said he would probably skip this Sunday's \$100,000-added Pocahontas S. with **Southern Playgirl** (Western Playboy) after the MGII winner turned in a disappointing workout yesterday morning at Churchill. The two-year-old filly, who has won five of her six starts including the GII Alcibiades at Keeneland last out Oct. 10, breezed five furlongs in 1:02 in company, and Vanier was baffled when the filly was unable to outfinish her workmate. He indicated he would lean toward bringing her back to run in the GIII \$200,000-added Golden Rod Nov. 30.

LeRoy Neiman has been chosen as the Official Artist of the 1997 Kentucky Derby. Neiman, who will create the imagery that will serve as the Official Kentucky Derby poster and be used for Kentucky Oaks and Derby tickets and programs, will be at Churchill Nov. 13 to unveil the artwork.

#### Local News, Hawthorne:

Phil Georgeff, the longtime voice of Chicago racing, has written his first novel, *Thoroughbred: In A Class By Himself*, which will be released Saturday, Nov. 9, to correspond with the Phil Georgeff Illinois Festival of Racing at Hawthorne. The novel will be given to the first 5,000 fans in attendance that afternoon.

#### Local News, England:

**Happy Valentine (GB)**, a colt by Rainbow Quest--Nearctic Flame, by Sadler's Wells, is now a 20-1 shot for the 1997 Epsom Derby after his eye-catching first racecourse appearance at Yarmouth yesterday. The Godolphin-owned colt led from stalls to wire in the seven-furlong EBF Herringfleet Maiden S. and eventually finished five lengths ahead of his nearest pursuer despite Frankie Dettori easing him down in the final few strides. Said trainer Saeed bin Suroor of the colt who cost £630,000 (\$985,915) as a yearling, "He had been training well for this race and was very relaxed. I shouldn't think he will run again before he goes to Dubai for the winter. He will leave in the middle of November."

**Mandilak (El Gran Senor)** gave the Aga Khan his first winner in Britain since 1990 in winning the one-mile Ranworth Maiden S. at Yarmouth yesterday. The Luca Cumani-trained juvenile colt had already created his small piece of history when becoming the initial British-based runner for his owner since the Aga Khan removed all his horses from England in a protest relating to drug-testing procedures after the disqualification of **Aliysa (GB)** (Darshaan) from the 1989 Epsom Oaks.

**Even Top (Ire)** (Topanoora) and **Bijou d'Inde (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux), second and third behind the newly-retired **Mark Of Esteem (Ire)** (Darshaan) in the 2000 Guineas at Newmarket back in May, are both to stay in training for 1997. Even Top will be prepared for a crack at the Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba next March. Meanwhile, Bijou d'Inde will be pointed for the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown next July.
