CIGAR ANNOUNCEMENT MONDAY While retirement for his champion seems all but certain, owner Allen Paulson said yesterday from New York City that he would be making an official announcement Monday regarding Cigar's (Palace Music) future. While Paulson acknowledged that the six-year-old would most likely not race again, stressing, "he's extremely valuable at stud," he did leave the door open a crack. "He's in perfect physical shape and I'll know more at the beginning of the week," he said. Cigar will make an appearance at this Saturday's National Horse Show at Madison Square Garden, traveling from his Belmont Park home in a van festooned with a 40-foot long four-color photo of the champ.

KURT BECKER TO CALL KEENELAND RACES

Live on-track race calls will become part of the Keeneland program for the first time in track history with the introduction of a public address system for the 1997 Spring Meet next April, and 27-year-old Illinois native Kurt Becker has been named Keeneland's first track announcer. Becker has been calling Thoroughbred and harness races since 1985, when he worked the Illinois county fair circuit; he was the announcer at the three Chicago-area tracks, Arlington, Hawthorne and Sportsman's Park, in 1993-94, then switched to auto racing as the Motor Racing Network's radio announcer for the NASCAR Winston Cup Series. "It's really a thrill to have a chance to work at Keeneland," said Becker. "My main focus will be to provide clear, accurate calls of each and every race." Added Keeneland President Bill Greely, "Kurt caught our attention when he was announcing in Chicago. We believe his voice and style will be the ideal match for Keeneland." Becker has also been named track announcer for Churchill Downs, replacing Mike Battaglia, who will now serve as host and primary racing analyst for Churchill's television broadcasts. Battaglia, 46, has been calling the races at Churchill since 1977.

MORE RECORDS FALL AT TATTERSALLS

AUTUMN As the final session closed, the Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale became the third consecutive record-breaking sale at Park Paddocks this year, following the trend set by the Houghton and October Yearling Sales. The average price rose 10 percent to a record level of \$19,860, and the gross rose 46 percent to a new Autumn Sale record of \$15,469,605. U.S. purchasers made a considerable impact on the auction, accounting for 27 purchases totaling \$1,547,680, an average of \$57,321. Bill O'Gorman bought 10 for Californian lawyer/trainer Darrell Vienna, and agent John Ferguson purchased six on behalf of trainer Elliott Walden. The highest bid at Thursday's final session was the \$98,592 paid for the three-year-old gelding **Dilazar** (Zilzal); consigned by Pegasus Stables, the son of GSW Dictina (FR) (Dictus {Fr}) was purchased by Mr. A. O. Nerses. Commenting on the sale, Tattersalls Chairman Ed Mahony said, "We are delighted to have broken the record aggregate for the Autumn Sale, which has stood since 1989, but even more encouraging is that the average has risen to a record level even with a considerably larger catalogue. Demand has been strong from start to finish, and the real features of the sale have been the diversity of buyers and the high clearance rate. The domestic buyers, and in particular the jumping fraternity, have played a significant role, and it would be wonderful if this year's sale were to produce another champion hurdler to follow Collier Bay and Alderbrook."

HANDLE UP ON BREEDERS' CUP; NIELSENS

DROP Total wagering on the seven Breeders' Cup Championship races last Saturday was \$67,738,890, representing a 5.7 percent increase from 1995. The figure includes \$61,813,420 bet at a North American-record 875 simulcast and off-track betting locations. This year's simulcast wagering registered a 9.4 percent increase over last year. The New York State intertrack network and the New York State and New York City Off-Track Betting Corporations led the way with \$10,212,255 bet on the seven Breeders' Cup races and the Pick-7. "We are pleased with our rebound in simulcast wagering over last year and with our record participation of domestic and international sites," said James E. Bassett III, president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. On the down side, the Nielsen ratings for the NBC broadcast of this year's Breeders' Cup were 2.5 with an 8 share, an all-time low. The rating was down 11 percent from last year's 2.8 rating. For the first time since 1990, the Breeders' Cup telecast was competing against college football on both ABC and CBS.

JOCKEY CLUB RELEASES REPORTS OF

MARES BRED The Jockey Club yesterday released Report of Mares Bred statistics relating to the 1996 breeding season. The information, which has never before been available this early, comes from almost 90 percent of the RMBs submitted to The Jockey Club thus far, and provides potential mare purchasers at the upcoming breeding stock sales with a compilation of the number of mares bred to each sire. "Release of RMB statistics in advance of the major breeding stock sales is a direct result of technological enhancements within the Registry," said Nick Nicholson, The Jockey Club's executive director. "These enhancements have been vital to our ongoing commitment to make relevant industry information available in a timely manner." Through October 24, The Jockey Club had received RMBs for 4,445 stallions which were bred to 56,148 mares in 1996. Woodman led the list, servicing 143 mares, followed by Tour d'Or, 133; and Dehere, 129.

BAY MEADOWS SOLD Patriot American Hospitality, Inc., California Jockey Club and Bay Meadows Operating Company yesterday jointly announced they have entered into a binding agreement under which Patriot American will acquire California Jockey Club and Bay Meadows for \$33 per paired share. The acquisition is valued at approximately \$195 million, and was approved unanimously by the boards of Patriot American, California Jockey Club and Bay Meadows; it is subject to approval by the shareholders of the three companies. Under the contract, Patriot American, one of the nation's largest hotel real estate investment trusts, obtains ownership of 175 acres of land in San Mateo, including the 97 acres which comprise Bay Meadows Racecourse. They have announced their intention to continue racing operations at the track, and to construct new stabling facilities on the grounds.
