**CIGAR ARRIVES AT CHURCHILL DOWNS** Cigar (Palace Music) arrived at Churchill Downs Tuesday morning and took up residence in trainer Bill Mott's barn in preparation for Saturday's parade appearance scheduled at the Louisville, Kentucky track. The six-year-old will parade before the track's crowd between the seventh and eighth races before retiring to Ashford Stud. He arrived in Kentucky on a flight from New York early Tuesday. "We were a little late leaving, but the flight went without a hitch," said Mott. "We got him here safely and got him to the barn in good shape. He's ready to go to work Saturday." Mott said Cigar will go to the track each day heading into his parade day. Regarding the horse's retirement, his trainer said, "I don't think it really hit me until yesterday when he galloped at Belmont for the last time. It was a sad time."

**PEAKS AND VALLEYS RETIRED TO PIN OAK STUD** Josephine Abercrombie of Pin Oak Stud announced yesterday that her homebred Canadian Horse of the Year and Sovereign Award-winning three-year-old colt **Peaks and Valleys** (Mt. Livermore) has been retired from racing and will stand the 1997 season at stud at Pin Oak in Versailles, Kentucky. The four-year-old won nine of 16 starts for earnings of \$1,589,270. He was victorious in four graded stakes--the GI Molson Export Million, GI Meadowlands Cup, GII Illinois Derby and GIII Derby Trial. He also placed in the GI Whitney H., GIII Saratoga Cup, GIII Lafayette S. and GIII Kentucky Jockey Club S. While finishing sixth as the favorite in Sunday's GIII Sport Page H. at Aqueduct, Peaks and Valleys pulled a muscle, prompting his connections' decision to retire him. Abercrombie said, "We had big plans for '97. However, we look forward to a successful stallion career." The champion will stand for \$10,000 live foal, due October 1.

**SERENA'S SONG CHASES RECORD** Breeders' Cup Distaff runner-up **Serena's Song** (Rahy) is expected to contest Saturday's GII \$200,000a Churchill Downs Distaff H., and either a victory or a second-place finish in the one-mile event would make her the all-time earnings champ among fillies and mares. The record, set by Dance Smartly, is \$3,263,836; Serena's Song goes into Saturday's race with earnings of \$3,238,348. A field of seven or eight is expected for the Grade II race, with Serena's Song carrying highweight of 125 pounds and spotting **Morris Code** (Lost Code), who may be the second highweight, 10 pounds.

This year's Melbourne Cup saw the 'heavenly' connection of the gelding Sainly; jockey Darren Beadman, a born-again Christian; and trainer Bart Cummings, who is 'God' when it comes to Cup winners, prevail. Cummings now has 10 miniature trophies in his cabinet. His grip on the Cup stretches back to 1950, when he saddled Comic Court to victory for his father. Since then, Light Fingers, Red Handed, Galilee, Think Big Twice, Gold and Black, Hyperno, Kingston Rule and Let's Elope have all tasted glory under his expertise. But yesterday was Sainly's day. A horse Cummings bred himself in a rare venture into breeding, the chunky gelding became the first horse since Rising Fast in 1954 to capture Australia's two most prestigious races--the Cox Plate and Melbourne Cup. Ridden beautifully by Beadman, Sainly sprinted clear halfway down the straight to win by 2 1/4 lengths. The 4-1 favorite Oscar Schindler settled back in the field early and failed to make an impression in the run home, finishing 15th.

**THREE 1996 GROUP 1 WINNERS HIGHLIGHT TATTERSALLS DECEMBER SALES**

Three 1996 Group 1-winning fillies, including two French Classic winners, look set to star at the upcoming Tattersalls December Sales, to be held in Newmarket, England Nov. 25 through Dec. 6. The three fillies are G1 Prix de Diane Hermes winner **Sil Sila (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}), G1 Prix Royal-Oak heroine **Red Roses Story (Fr)** (Pink {Fr}) and **Luna Wells (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), winner of the G1 Prix Saint-Alary and fifth in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. All three are being offered as both racing and breeding prospects. In total, there are nearly 1,300 mares and fillies catalogued, including mares in foal to Sadler's Wells, Caerleon, Rainbow Quest, Lammtarra, Lure and Seeking the Gold. The foals, numbering 890, are headlined by the Sadler's Wells half-brother to 1991 Epsom Derby winner Generous (Ire), while the largest ever December Yearling catalogue includes half-brothers to GII E.P. Taylor S. winner Wandering Star and G1 winner Tagula (Ire). Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony said, "We are delighted with the quality of the December Sales in all categories. It is particularly exciting to have three 1996 Group 1 winners catalogued, and after the successes of our Houghton and October Yearling Sales, we are looking forward to rounding off the year with a lively December sale."

**CALDER MEETING ENDS** The first full season of live racing coexisting with full-card simulcasting at a Florida Thoroughbred racetrack came to a close Tuesday at Calder. During the 122-day Calder meeting, total on-track attendance of 689,691 was down 7% from last year, and on-track handle of \$74,544,771 (not including full-card simulcasting) was down 22.8%. However, because the ITW and ISW wagering handle of \$208,105,039 (not including full-card simulcasting) was up 22.9% from 1995, the combined handle on Calder races rose 6.3% to \$282,649,810. Another \$87,072,335 was wagered on full-card simulcasting. Also at the meeting, purses were increased three times, bringing the daily outlay to \$160,000, the highest purse structure a Calder summer meet has ever seen. Eibar Coa led the jockeys standings, with the trainer's title going to Dan Hurtak. The 1996-97 Tropical at Calder meet begins this Thursday.

### WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

#### **SHAKA (c, 2, Exit to Nowhere--Serafica {GB}, by No Pass No Sale {Ire})**

A new contender for the 1997 European classics entered the spotlight Saturday when Shaka produced a game performance to take the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud in France. Shaka is a member of the first crop by the French-based sire Exit to Nowhere. An Irish River half-brother to the very successful young stallion Machiavellian, Exit to Nowhere won four group stakes, including the Prix Thomas Bryon at two and the Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard Jacques le Marois at three.

Exit to Nowhere and Machiavellian are two of the four group stakes-winners out of the renowned producer Coup de Folie (the others are dual G1 winner

Coup de Genie and French 1,000 Guineas runner-up Hydro Calido). Coup de Folie is by Halo out of Raise the Standard, a Hoist the Flag half-sister to Northern Dancer, which means she is inbred 3x3 to Northern Dancer's granddam, Almahmoud.

What makes Exit to Nowhere and Machiavellian important in this particular time and place is that one is by Irish River and the other by Mr. Prospector, which means both are free of Northern Dancer, an influence which threatens to virtually saturate European racing. In addition, the fact that their granddam is a half-sister to Northern Dancer and they carry an extra strain of Almahmoud would indicate they are perfect mates for Northern Dancer-line mares.

That's the theory. Now, how does it work in practice? Well, at least eight of Machiavellian's first 11 stakes-winners have Northern Dancer in their pedigrees, six in the male line. And--surprise, surprise--when we look at the pedigree of Shaka, we find he is out of a mare by No Pass No Sale, who is by Northfields, a son of Northern Dancer. Thus, Shaka has Natalma 4x5 and Almahmoud 5x5x6. Now things will get really interesting when someone breeds a filly by Danehill (3x3 to Natalma) to Exit to Nowhere or Machiavellian, lining up three crosses of Natalma and four of Almahmoud.

Of course, there is more to Shaka's pedigree than two crosses of Natalma and three of Almahmoud. To begin with, he has three strains of the great classic influence Ribot, one through a daughter (on the "zig-zag" or "heart-line" of Shaka's dam). Then there is a double of Turn-to, combined with Turn-to's half-sister Black Brook. Finally, the pedigree also has Nasrullah/Princequillo crosses through Irish River's sire Riverman and through Secretariat, sire of Shaka's third dam.

#### **PEDIGREE SHORTS...**

Cozzene's strong late run for the Champion Sire title was aided further over the weekend by stakes victories for his daughters **Reach the Top (f, 2, Cozzene--Reach For It {Ack Ack})** and Belle of Cozzene. Reach the Top, a sister to the MGSW Grab the Green, has an interesting pedigree. Cozzene's second dam is by Sir Gaylord, and Reach the Top's broodmare sire, Ack Ack, is out of Fast Turn. Both Sir Gaylord and Fast Turn are by Turn-to out of daughters of Princequillo, meaning Reach the Top has the relatives 4x3 in her pedigree.

The courageous victory of **Water Street (f, 2, Storm Bird--Ivor Jewel {Sir Ivor})** in the Pocahontas S. is a reminder of just how well Storm Bird likes the strain of Somethingroyal through Secretariat or Sir Ivor (by Secretariat's half-brother Sir Gaylord). Somewhere approaching 25 percent of the starters by Storm Bird out of mares by Secretariat or Sir Ivor have won stakes, and they include two of Storm Bird's most notable stallion sons--Storm Cat and Bluebird. Perhaps introducing strains of Secretariat and Sir Ivor to Storm Bird sons without either of the pair, or to Storm Bird mares, could pay dividends.
