SERENA'S SONG RETIRED The first lady of Thoroughbred racing, **Serena's Song** (Rahy), has been retired, according to a story in the *Daily Racing Form*. The four-year-old filly's second-place finish in last Saturday's GII Churchill Downs Distaff H. made her North America's all-time leading money-winning distaffer with earnings of \$3,283,388. "We felt there was nothing more left for her to accomplish," her trainer D. Wayne Lukas told the *Form* yesterday. "She did it all, in truly unique and remarkable fashion, and retires completely sound. We had talked about racing her one more season, but decided she's done all there is to do. We're looking forward to racing her foals in the hope they will be champions like their dam." Serena's Song, purchased by her current owners Robert & Beverly Lewis for \$150,000 at the 1993 Keeneland July Yearling Sale, won 18 of 38 starts and finished first, second or third 32 times. After breaking her maiden by 10 lengths at Hollywood Park in June of her two-year-old season, the bay filly went on to take the 1994 GI Hollywood Starlet, GI Oak Leaf S. and GII Landaluce S. and finish second by a head to stablemate Flanders in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Her three-year-old campaign was even better. After starting the season with four straight victories in the GIII Santa Ynez, GI Las Virgenes, GI Santa Anita Oaks and GII Jim Beam S. against males, she was 16th after contesting the early pace in the Kentucky Derby. The gallant filly then rebounded 13 days later, taking the GII Black-Eyed Susan by nine lengths then following with a three-length triumph in the GI Mother Goose. Other highlights of her 1995 season, which culminated with an Eclipse Award as the Champion Three-Year-Old Filly, included a victory against colts in the GI Haskell, a seven-length romp in the GI Gazelle H. and a win over her elders in the GI Beldame. This year, Serena's Song added to her resume tallies in the GI Hempstead H., GI Santa Monica H., GI Santa Maria H., GIII Pimlico Distaff and GIII Fleur De Lis H. as well as a second-place finish in the Breeders' Cup Distaff at Woodbine. "This season, at four, she reached a peak, competing in seven consecutive Grade I events and carrying top weights against the best," Lukas said. "She was outstanding against male handicap horses in the Whitney (finishing second) and the Iselin (third), and then ran one of her greatest races in the Ruffian, giving 10 pounds to Yanks Music, who won by a neck." Lukas added that it has not yet been decided who the champion will be bred to in 1997.

NUMBERS KEEP SOARING AT KEENELAND NOVEMBER Wednesday's fourth session of the 1996 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale saw 294 horses sell for a gross of \$16,605,000 and an average of \$56,480, up 18.1 percent from last year's fourth session average of \$47,819. Through the first four days of the auction, 1,052 horses have brought \$132,204,500 for an average of \$125,670, up 19.5 percent from \$105,168 in 1995. Wednesday's session topper was GII La Canada S. winner **Dianes Halo** (Sunny's Halo). The five-year-old broodmare, in foal to Carson City, was purchased by Maryland veterinarian Dr. Tom Bowman on behalf of Robert Meyerhoff. Bowman said he didn't know what Meyerhoff's plans for Dianes Halo are, but added, "He only buys mares to breed to Broad Brush or Concern. He specifically is trying to pick out mares to breed to those two horses." Bowman said Dianes Halo will be shipped to Taylor Made Farm in Nicholasville, Kentucky today, "and (Meyerhoff) will decide whether he'll leave her here or take her home (to Maryland)." The day's second highest price of \$290,000 was paid for **Valid Carnaub** (Valid Appeal). The seven-year-old stakes-winning mare, in foal to Unbridled, was purchased by George Steinbrenner's Kinsman Farm. Plans call for Valid Carnaub to go to Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky. Kinsman tries to keep its broodmare band at around 20, with 10 at Ashford and 10 at Kinsman Stud Farm in Ocala, Florida. **Another Legend** (Lyphard's Wish {Fr}), winner of the GII All Along S. over the Laurel turf Oct. 27 and catalogued as a racing or broodmare prospect, was consigned by Mineola Farm, agent and sold for \$225,000 to James Delahooke, agent for Peter Savill of Ireland. "She's going to England to go to stud at the National Stud," Delahooke said. He added that the four-year-old filly will be bred to Celtic Swing (GB) (Damister), who stands at the National Stud. Savill owns Celtic Swing, the Champion Two-Year-Old Colt in Europe in 1994. The sale continues through Nov. 20.

Twining leaped into the second spot with a \$355,000 filly late Tuesday and \$170,000 colt Wednesday...this is a very striking performance...his median was a staggering \$167,500, over 16 times his stud fee...Commercial Players, Get On Board. Here's the more or less complete list with 100 left to sell Wednesday (stallions with 2 or more sold in Books 1-2).

MANILA SOLD TO TURKEY Manila (Lyphard), the Champion Turf Male of 1986, has been sold to the Turkish Jockey Club, bloodstock agent Mark MacDonald told the *Daily Racing Form* Wednesday. The 13-year-old stallion has stood at Will Farish's Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky since his retirement in 1987. "The transaction with Mr. Farish was completed Tuesday," MacDonald said, "and the horse will leave as soon as the quarantine requirements are met." According to the *Daily Racing Form*, both MacDonald and bloodstock agent Mike Cartee represented the Turkish Jockey Club and its agent, Turgut Koyuncuoglu, in the transaction with Lane's End. Manila won 12 of 18 starts and finished second five times for earnings of \$2,692,799. During his championship three-year-old season, he won the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, GI Breeders' Cup Classic, GI United Nations H. and three other graded stakes. He added two more Grade I tallies to his resume at age four--the Budweiser-Arlington Million and a repeat victory in the United Nations H. From six crops to race, Manila has sired 11 stakes-winners and the earners of over \$7.8 million. His best runner to date, Bien Bien, won four Grade I stakes and over \$2.3 million.

DANZIG TOPS STALLION ACCESS SALE Danzig (Northern Dancer) was the star of Tuesday night's Stallion Access sale of select seasons and shares at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky in Lexington. The 19-year-old stallion brought the night's highest price for a 1997 No Guarantee Season--\$150,000, and the highest price for an option for a 1998 nomination--\$20,000. A share in the 12-year-old stallion **Tremolino** (Sharpen Up {GB}) topped all shares at \$46,000. Overall, 66 seasons grossed \$1,274,400 for an average of \$19,309, and five shares totaled \$90,000.

HERO WINS NEW ZEALAND'S 2000 GUINEAS Hero (NZ), a son of the Maryland-bred stallion Deputy Governor (Master Willie {GB}), won yesterday's \$88,464 G1 Two Thousand Guineas at Riccarton, Christchurch, New Zealand, giving his 28-year-old rider Catherine Treymane a unique "double" as she became the first female jockey to win both New Zealand's One Thousand Guineas and the Two Thousand Guineas--in fact she is the first woman to win either race. Hero is owned and trained by the same combination who gave Treymane last Saturday's win on the filly Emerald in the One Thousand Guineas--owner/breeder Jim Campin and his trainer son-in-law John Gudopp. "It's a huge thrill," said Treymane. "To win one is great, to win both is just unbelievable."

DOUBLE NEGATIVE DEAD Double Negative (Mr. Prospector) died Wednesday morning at Rood and Riddle Veterinary Clinic in Lexington, Kentucky. The 10-year-old stallion, sire of GI stakes winner Double Dee's, died of severe complications resulting from a ruptured bladder. Double Negative had just arrived at Fred Seitz's Brookdale Farm in Versailles, Kentucky last month after standing the 1996 breeding season at The Stallion Park in New York.

PENTIRE LEAVES FOR JAPAN This year's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. winner **Pentire (GB)** (Be My Guest), who disappointed when 10th behind Helissio in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, left Newmarket yesterday on his way to Tokyo for the Nov. 24 Japan Cup and ultimate retirement to stud in Japan. Now owned by Teruya Yoshida, Pentire will spend a week in quarantine in Japan before being prepared for the mile and a half \$4.1 million event. After the Japan Cup he will spend another week in quarantine before returning to England. At the end of the year, the four-year-old will return to Japan to take up stallion duties at Yoshida's Shadai Farm in Hokkaido.

WILD GALE SOLD AT KEENELAND Wild Gale (Wild Again), a six-year-old stallion, was sold during Wednesday's fourth session of the 1996 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. A winner of three of 22 starts and \$404,214, the dark bay was consigned by Glencrest Farm, agent and purchased for \$70,000 by Suzanne Smallwood, senior equine analyst for EQUIX Biomechanics, on behalf of her client George "Sonny" Oechsher III. Wild Gale will stand the 1997 breeding season at stud at Oechsher's Good Guys Farm in Folsom, Louisiana. Of the \$70,000 price tag, Oechsher said, "I thought it would go higher than that. He's a real well-balanced horse. We expect his mechanics will blend well with a wide variety of mare types physically." Wild Gale won the GIII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at two and placed in four graded stakes, including third-place efforts in the 1993 Kentucky Derby and Belmont S.

AGA KHAN SENDS YEARLINGS TO STOUTE Seven years after Epsom Oaks first-place finisher Aliysa was controversially disqualified for failing a drug test, her owner The Aga Khan has sent her trainer Michael Stoute five yearlings to train. Stoute is the second trainer to receive horses from the Aga Khan since he decided to renew his patronage of British racing. Luca Cumani was sent 10 yearlings at the end of 1995. At the height of their highly successful partnership, Stoute trained more than 30 horses each year for The Aga Khan and his winners for him included Epsom Derby heroes Shergar and Shahrastani.

Two days, yet to be determined, will be dark at Monmouth each week. Garden State Park was awarded 63 Thoroughbred racing dates in 1997 from Jan. 1 through May 23.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

Saturday's GII Churchill Downs Distaff H. resulted in a first stakes win for the improving **Fast Catch** (f, 4, **Fast Play--Catch On Quick** {Smarten}). Fast Catch is a three-parts sister to the graded stakes-winning Looie Capote (whose sire Capote is by Fast Play's sire, Seattle Slew), and the pair might be an illustration of how the distaff family of a mare's sire can suggest ways in which she might be mated. In this case, the clue is that Smarten is a half-brother to Smart Angle, champion two-year-old filly and dam of the good runner Houston, also a son of Seattle Slew.

A duplication which just keeps on throwing up stakes-winners is that of Rough 'n Tumble through his best daughter, My Dear Girl (dam of In Reality), and his best son, Dr. Fager. The latest example is **Shes Got the Facts** (f, 3, **Known Fact--Erzulie Freda** {Fappiano}), who took the Bridal Flower S. at Delaware Park, her fourth victory in as many outings. Shes Got the Facts has Rough 'n Tumble 4x4. While on the subject, Rubiano, who is already inbred to Rough 'n Tumble through the same ancestors, was represented by a first stakes-winner from his first crop when **Starry Dreamer** (f, 2, **Rubiano--Lara's Star** {*Forli}) won the Gold Digger S. at Hawthorne Sunday.

The Sharpen Up/Ribot cross has long been a source of good stakes-winners, but there was a Group 1 winner bred on the reverse over the weekend when **Flemensfirth** (c, 4, **Alleged--Etheldreda** {Diesis}) captured the G1 Premio Roma. Alleged is by Hoist the Flag, a grandson of Ribot, and Diesis is a son of Sharpen Up. Given that they are out of an outstanding mare, one would expect Kris and Diesis to do well as broodmare sires, and obviously crossing them with stallions carrying the Ribot strain close up could pay dividends.
