**MR PURPLE TO STAND AT CALUMET** Alex G. Campbell Jr. announced yesterday that his homebred stallion **Mr Purple** (Deputy Minister) will begin his stud career in 1997 at historic Calumet Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. Mr Purple won six of 21 starts for earnings of \$1,134,018. His stakes victories on both dirt and turf included the Gill Hollywood Juvenile Championship S. at two, the Gill Affirmed H., Harry Henson S. and Re-launch H. at three and a two-length tally in the \$1 million Santa Anita H. at age four. He also placed in eight graded stakes, including the Gill Arlington-Washington Futurity, GI Strub S. and GI Californian S. Out of Turk o Witz (Stop the Music), four-year-old Mr Purple is a half-brother to MGI winner Queens Court Queen (Lyphard) and additional stakes horses Turkaro, Taint and Zanferrier. His stud fee will be announced at a later date.

**EMERALD DOWNS INAUGURAL SEASON A SUCCESS** Signaling the successful return of live racing to Western Washington, Emerald Downs' 100-day inaugural season concluded Sunday with statewide total mutuel handle of \$89,813,723 and attendance of 594,702. These totals compute to a statewide daily average handle of \$898,137 and attendance of 5,947. On track, the averages were \$704,210 and 5,185, respectively. "We're extremely pleased with the results of this first meeting," Emerald Downs President Ron Crockett said. "Fans have welcomed back live horse racing here with enthusiasm. We are confident the foundation is set for continued growth in the industry." Compared to the most recent summer meeting held in Washington, a 100-day season run by Emerald Racing Association at Yakima Meadows last year, Emerald Downs' total handle represents an increase of 20 percent, while attendance was up 39 percent. "Major racing is back and our facility was highly praised by horse-men and fans alike," Crockett said. "We're looking forward to bigger and better things in 1997." Emerald Downs opens its doors for a 39-day winter racing season Friday, Dec. 6.

**THE WICKED NORTH FILLY BRINGS \$50,000 AT KEENELAND** A weanling chestnut filly from the first crop by Champion Older Horse The Wicked North brought a top price of \$50,000 during Tuesday's session of Keeneland's 1996 November Breeding Stock Sale. Eric Reed, agent, bought the filly, out of the graded stakes-placed mare Phil's Illusion (Bates Motel), from consigners Haven Bloodstock & Fallbrook Farm, agent. The day's highest-priced broodmare at \$43,000 was **Joyous Thoughts** (Tom Rolfe). The nine-year-old mare, in foal to Robin des Pins, is a half-sister to graded stakes-winner Sunshine Always; she was consigned by Darby Dan Farm, agent and purchased by Crestwood Bloodstock, agent. During Tuesday's next-to-last session of the 11-day auction, Keeneland sold 241 horses for \$2,130,100, an average of \$8,839. With only today's session remaining, 2,658 horses have been sold for \$169,769,400, an average of \$63,871.

**RUGGED BUGGER TOPS HORSES OF RACING AGE SALE** **Rugged Bugger** (Assert {Ire}), winner of his last three starts, including the Gill Laurel Turf Cup H. Nov. 11, brought a final bid of \$130,000 to top Tuesday's Fasig-Tipton New York Horses of Racing Age Sale at Belmont Park. The five-year-old gelding was consigned by Sture G. Olsson and purchased by William Badgett Jr., agent. Overall, 94 horses of racing age were sold yesterday for a gross of \$833,000 and an average of \$8,862, down 67.7% from last year's average of \$27,404. During last year's sale, 128 horses were sold for a gross of \$3,507,700.

Of course, the Somethingroyal source in Chief's Crown's pedigree is Secretariat. In fact Chief's Crown is out of a Secretariat mare, which means that Secretariat is on what has become known as the zig-zag or heart-line. The concept of the heart performance being related to the female sex-chromosome was advanced some 20 years by the Australian professor Dr. J.D. Steel. This work was given considerable publicity by Marianna Haun in the *Thoroughbred Times* (an article which has recently been reprinted in Ken McLean's book *Genetic Heritage*) early in 1994, Haun adding contributions from the University of Kentucky's Gluck Equine Research Center expert, Dr. Gus Cothran, which led to the conclusion that heart performance is linked to sex-linked recessive genes.

Secretariat is known to have inherited a very large heart, and if this is a sex-linked recessive, he would have passed the gene for this factor on to all his daughters, but not his sons. Since the gene is recessive, it would not necessarily be expressed in the daughters, but they would pass it on to 50% of their offspring. As far as colts out of Secretariat mares are concerned, this would mean they had a 50% chance of the gene for a large heart being expressed. This would be a major contribution in making Secretariat a good broodmare sire, but no help to his career as a sire of sires.

If Chief's Crown inherited superior heart size or performance from Secretariat's dam, Somethingroyal, he automatically passes on any x-chromosome linked genes involved in this to all his daughters, although they do not necessarily express the gene. What's interesting about Ampulla is that she is out of a mare by Gay Mecene, whose own dam is by Sir Gaylord. So Ampulla has Somethingroyal on both zig-zags or heart-lines and would have two chances of inheriting this sex-related factor from Somethingroyal.

This is all well and good with a textbook example like Ampulla, but what about Chief's Crown's colts, who don't inherit an x-chromosome from Somethingroyal, or the Chief's Crown stakes-winning sons and daughters who have Sir Gaylord through a son, so don't inherit Somethingroyal's x-chromosome through that channel? Given that the double of Somethingroyal clearly seems to be beneficial here, we can only speculate. Are some of the genes which contribute to the heart-performance not sex-linked? Or is the likelihood of the expression of this x-chromosome linked Somethingroyal gene increased when some other Somethingroyal gene or genes which have an affinity with Somethingroyal are brought back? That's one for the geneticists to ponder. Whatever the reason, it certainly seems worth continuing to send mares carrying Sir Gaylord to Chief's Crown--a 30% stakes-winner strike rate can't be argued with.

**WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES***by Alan Porter***AMPULLA (m, 5, Chief's Crown--Norland {Fr}, by Gay Mecene)**

Oh that all crosses were as consistently successful! In winning the GI Long Island H. Sunday, Ampulla became the fifth Chief's Crown group or graded stakes-winner to carry a duplication of Somethingroyal. Since Chief's Crown has been represented by 14 group/graded winners to date, this means over a third of his group/graded winners carry the Somethingroyal duplication. Stretch the envelope to include all Chief's Crown stakes-winners and the tally becomes eight of 25 stakes-winners, still nearly a third. Of course, one has to take into account opportunity, but if we consider that the above stakes-winners are the produce of the 295 named foals from Chief's Crown's first seven crops, then he would have to have had almost 100 foals with the same duplication to reduce it to a random occurrence. Although possible, this seems extremely unlikely, especially since Sir Gaylord, the Somethingroyal source in the dams of each of these stakes-winners, is not *that* frequently found.
