ZAGREB TO STUD IN JAPAN Irish Derby winner Zagreb (Theatrical {Ire}) has been sold to stand stud in Japan, according to a report in Wednesday's *Sporting Life*. The purchase, for an undisclosed seven-figure sum, was negotiated by Liam Browne, The Curragh trainer. The principal mover in the deal was Terumobu Nakao, who represented the Japan Bloodstock Breeders' Association, which has 2,343 members. The group, which already stands Polish Patriot and Wollow, will stand Zagreb in Hokkaido. The three-year-old was owned in partnership by Allen Paulson, Michael Smurfit and Mike Watt. Zagreb's trainer Dermot Weld said, "It is a shame I won't be able to train my first Irish Derby winner as a four-year-old, but I will follow his stud career. Zagreb was brilliant on his day. He was a stayer with speed."

DELAWARE PARK HANDLE SKYROCKETS Delaware Park's 139-day 1996 meeting ended Nov. 10 with huge increases over last year's figures. Live on-track handle totaled \$28,655,018, a slight increase from \$27,251,269 during last year's 129-day season. However, live off-track handle skyrocketed from \$62,273,151 in 1995 to \$107,368,067 this year, for total combined 1996 handle of \$136,023,085, up 51.9 percent from last year's \$89,524,420. Due to the tremendous increase in handle, Thoroughbred purses were up over 100 percent from 1995--from \$10,041,651 to \$20,956,561.

RUDIMENTARY COLT TOPS TATTERSALLS WEDNESDAY A bay colt by Rudimentary (Nureyev) out of Pursuit of Truth (Irish River {Fr}) topped Wednesday's first weanling session of the Tattersalls December Sales in Newmarket, England. Consigned by Cheveley Park Stud, the weanling was purchased by Peter Doyle Bloodstock for \$62,979. Overall, 97 foals were sold Wednesday for a gross of \$1,217,244 and an average of \$12,549, up 38.6 percent from \$9,051 last year. The weanling portion of the sale continues through Saturday, Nov. 30.

ON-LINE SUCCESS FOR BREEDERS' CUP

WAGERING The Ontario Jockey Club announced the success of its Breeders' Cup Online Challenge yesterday. The 184 people who registered to play came from six Canadian provinces, 29 U.S. states and the District of Columbia and from Scotland, Switzerland and Barbados, West Indies. "In terms of system response, operation and general customer satisfaction the test was extremely successful," said Andrew Gaughan, Director of New Distribution Initiatives at the OJC. The other two partners in the venture, Breeders' Cup Ltd and IWN of Carlsbad, California were also pleased with the results. "The contest was quite successful and provided us with much useful information and data," said Ken Kirchner of Breeders' Cup Ltd. Players in the contest received a starting bankroll of \$500 in play money and used IWN's online service interfaced to the Autotote tote system to place their bets. A California player built his initial stake into a \$12,320 bankroll and won a \$650 prize pack. In all, the 121 participants made 1,344 wagers, representing a handle of \$95,954. The OJC and IWN are considering running further contests in the near future while full regulatory approval is being sought.

DISQUALIFICATION IN AQUEDUCT AMATEUR

RACE **Cop a Kiss** (Kris S.), ridden to victory by a former professional in Saturday's amateur jockey's race at Aqueduct, was disqualified from first and placed last for purposes of purse money only by New York Racing Association stewards yesterday. Cop a Kiss was ridden by Angel Monserrate Jr., who rode under the false name of Carlos Castro. Monserrate was working at the NYRA tracks as an exercise rider before being ruled off for various offenses. Original runner-up **Did** (Star Gallant) was placed first in the \$31,000 maiden special weight race for New York-breds. "This was in the best interests of racing," explained State Steward John Joyce. "The horse had a professional rider in an amateur race and it didn't seem fair under the circumstances that he could remain in first and earn the purse." Joyce said he expected an appeal would be filed.
