MINSHALL FARMS SWEEPS TOP

SOVEREIGN AWARDS Minshall Farms, the stable developed by the late Aubrey Minshall that is now overseen by his two sons, Shawn and Patrick, and his widow, trainer Barbara Minshall, was the big overall winner at last night's Sovereign Awards dinner at Woodbine in Toronto. The outfit took home five of Canadian racing's year-end awards; in addition to being named champion Owner and champion Breeder, Minshall Farms earned Horse of the Year and champion Older Horse or Gelding honors for stable star **Mt. Sassafras** (Mt. Livermore), and Barbara Minshall became the first woman in the country's history to collect the Sovereign Award as champion Trainer. Minshall took over the training chores for the stable last year and saddled Kiridashi to victory in the Prince Of Wales S., the first time a woman had trained the winner of a Canadian Triple Crown race. Showing no signs of a sophomore jinx, the horsewoman won with 28 percent of the horses she sent out this year (through November 15), capturing 39 races, including 15 stakes, and purses of more than \$2.3 million. Four-year-old Mt. Sassafras ran nine times this season, winning the Dominion Day H., the GIII Eclipse H. and an allowance event, all at Woodbine, for earnings of \$531,111. He was also a courageous fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, beaten less than a length. Other award winners last night were **Larkwhistle** (Silver Deputy), top two-year-old filly; **Cash Deposit** (Deposit Ticket), two-year-old colt; **Langfuhr** (Danzig), sprinter; **Silent Fleet** (Silent Screen), three-year-old filly; **Victor Cooley** (Cool Victor), three-year-old colt/gelding; **Windsharp** (Lear Fan), older filly/mare and turf filly/mare; **Chief Bearhart** (Chief's Crown), turf colt/gelding; and **Amelia Bearhart** (Bold Hour), broodmare. Emile Ramsammy, a 23-year-old native of Trinidad, was voted Canada's top jockey, while Neil Poznansky was named top apprentice jockey. In the media categories, Curtis Stock of the *Edmonton Journal* won for outstanding newspaper article; Skip Dickstein, *The Blood-Horse*, outstanding photograph; Jay Hovdey, *The Blood-Horse*, outstanding feature story; and Morgan Elliott, *Discovery Channel*, outstanding broadcast.

TATTERSALLS DECEMBER HITS NEW

HEIGHTS The final figures for the Tattersalls Mares and Fillies in Training Sale which concluded yesterday showed a 42-percent rise in gross to \$56,191,339 and a 33-percent increase in average to \$58,108. This brought the gross for the 1996 Tattersalls December Sale to a new high of \$84,879,633, up 41 percent from 1995, while the average jumped by 29 percent to a record \$43,527. The two-year-old filly **La Curamalal (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest--North Telstar {Ire} {Sallust {Ire}}) brought the highest price at the final session of the Mares Sale, attracting a bid of \$97,967 from German International Bloodstock. A half-sister to G2-placed Canaska Star (GB), the filly was consigned by Egerton Stud. After a year in which Tattersalls' annual turnover through the ring breached the 100-million guineas mark for the first time, Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony was prompted to comment, "The December Sales have brought to a close the most remarkable sales season we have ever experienced here at Tattersalls. Since the opening day at our Houghton Yearling Sale there has been unprecedented global demand in all categories. It has been wonderful to see our vendors reaping rewards, as well as the eagerness of buyers from every corner of the world to participate despite the current strength of sterling. The underlying message is that European bloodstock is a world class product, of which breeders can be justifiably proud. Newmarket has proved to be the focal point of the European market place, and the strength in the market here has given breeders the opportunity to reinvest their returns in the industry. While overseas investment has been the feature of this year's trading, the long-term prosperity of our racing and breeding industry relies heavily on a strong domestic base. We hope that the success of the sales here at Tattersalls will have helped to provide a platform on which we can all continue to build."

KEENELAND JANUARY CATALOGS 1,329

Keeneland will catalog 1,329 horses for its annual January Horses of All Ages sale; the four-day auction begins Monday, January 6 with sessions at 10:00 a.m. daily. This year's offering includes 656 broodmares, 422 yearlings, 55 two-year-olds, nine stallions and 187 horses of other ages; the total is 51 less than the 1,380 in last year's catalog. The 1995 Keeneland January sale saw 996 horses and three stallion shares gross \$30,275,100.

SUFFOLK CANCELS FRIDAY Gusting winds and blinding snow caused Suffolk Downs to call off its card Friday after just one race. Simulcasting continued as scheduled at the Massachusetts oval. Racing is expected to resume this afternoon for what will be the closing day of the Suffolk fall meet.

ELEVEN STAKES UPGRADED FOR 1997 Santa Anita's La Brea S. will move to Grade I status for 1997, heading a list of 11 stakes upgraded by the North American Graded Stakes Committee. The 12-member Committee, a division of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association, is chaired by TOBA Trustee G. Watts Humphrey Jr. TOBA members Josephine Abercrombie, John Ed Anthony, Gary Bisantz and Cot Campbell, as well as racing officials Howard Battle, Eual Wyatt Jr., Frank Gabriel Jr., Robert Umphrey, Terence Meyocks, Leonard Hale and Christopher Evans, make up the rest of the committee. A total of 25 races received downgrades, including seven Grade I stakes; 11 additional events received downgrades at the 1995 grading session, but following the policy of the NAGSC, the downgrading was delayed until 1997 for those races which are normally run before May 1.
