PAT BYRNE GOES PRIVATE Pat Byrne, who burst into national prominence as the trainer of juvenile stars Favorite Trick and Countess Diana, announced yesterday that he will begin training exclusively for Frank Stronach. In addition to his two Breeders' Cup champs, Byrne also trained Richter Scale, Polished Brass and Panama City to recent graded stakes triumphs. "It was a tough decision," Byrne admitted. "Favorite Trick is like a son for us. We picked him out of a sale and we had him all along and developed him." Byrne expects to train about 40 horses for Stronach and said he will move his current horses out to other trainers as the owners decide where to send them. Byrne signed a five-year contract with Stronach, with the usual percentage on top of that, plus breeding rights. "Mr. Stronach gave me the opportunity to select the top marquee horses and also pick up the two-year-old crop with the idea that we can develop these young animals and continue to win Breeders' Cup races and marquee races throughout the country. I'll stay on the same circuit I've been racing on; Kentucky, Saratoga and Gulfstream." Kerry Cauthen, a spokesman for Walmac International in Lexington, Ky, which owns 40 percent of soon-to-be-named champion two-year-old Favorite Trick, said, "We are hoping to keep the horse with Pat. There's a chance Mr. Stronach will buy a piece of him and we can leave him where he is."

TRF & TCA AUCTION SCHEDULED FOR JAN.

27-31 The Eighth Annual Charity Stallion Seasons auction benefitting the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation and Thoroughbred Charities of America kicks off on Tuesday, January 27 with five days of telephone bidding on more than 200 stallion seasons. The telephone bidding leads up to the annual gala dinner and live auction of select seasons and equine art at Candy Land Farm in Middletown, Delaware on Saturday January 31. This year's list of stallion seasons include Wild Again, Dixieland Band, French Deputy and Two Punch. "Each year we've seen an increase in proceeds," said Monique Koehler, president and founder of the TRF. "In reviewing the list of seasons we have this year, we are looking forward to another increase." Mrs. Richard C. (Allaire) du Pont, one of the founders and vice president of the newly created Thoroughbred Charities of America, said the group will distribute a portion of the auction proceeds this year to horse rescue and research organizations throughout the United States. "If we in the horse business do not help our own," Mrs. du Pont observed, "who will?"

MEDIA ECLIPSE AWARDS ANNOUNCED Eclipse Awards for outstanding television, radio and photography were announced yesterday by the Thoroughbred Racing Associations. E. S. "Bud" Lamoreaux III was awarded the 1997 Eclipse Award for Outstanding National Television Achievement as producer of a *CBS News Sunday Morning* feature on three-time Horse of the Year Forego which appeared on November 9, 1997. It was Lamoreaux's third Eclipse Award, having previously earned recognition in 1991 and 1993 for features aired on *CBS News Sunday Morning with Charles Kuralt*. Lamoreaux wrote, reported and produced the Forego story, which was narrated by Charles Osgood. Brian Blessing won the 1997 Eclipse Award for Local Television Achievement for "Fort Erie Racetrack, the First 100 Years," a documentary commemorating the Canadian track's first century. The award-winning feature aired several times on Empire Sports Network across New York State and Rogers Community Channel 10 in Southern Ontario, Canada. Baltimore's WBAL Radio received the 1997 Eclipse Award for Outstanding Radio Achievement for its five-part news feature "Slots or Not," which examined the issue of legalizing slot machines in the state of Maryland. The series was researched, prepared and narrated by WBAL news reporter John Patti and aired from May 19-23. Chick Lang, longtime racetrack industry executive and WBAL racing analyst and reporter, was the producer. Jean Raftery earned the 1997 Eclipse Award for Outstanding Photographic Achievement for her five-photo series of the finish of the 10th race at Calder Race Course on June 22. Raftery's winning photos appeared in the July 5 issue of *The Blood-Horse* and the August/September issue of *The Jockey News*. The photographs captured Eduardo Nunez as he tried to remain aboard his mount, Sweet Jab, long enough to earn second place in the race. Nunez can be seen beginning to fall to the left and over the head of his mount and then falling to the track just before the finish line. The equine Eclipse Awards will be announced January 8.

VELASQUEZ OFFICIALLY RETIRES Jockey Jorge Velasquez officially ended his riding career yesterday after riding three races at Calder Race Course. "I'm not sure what I'll do now," the 51-year-old Hall of Famer said. "Every athlete's career has to come to an end and I've had a long, healthy career. It's time to make room for the younger guys. I did everything possible--the best I could do in racing. I had my ups and downs like every other jockey." Velasquez won the 1981 Kentucky Derby aboard Pleasant Colony and the 1985 Breeders' Cup Classic on Proud Truth.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

MARTINQUAIS (IRE) (c, 4, Simply Great–Majolique, by Irish River {Fr})

Making only his second start in North America, Martiniquais delivered notice that he will be a force to be reckoned with this year when taking the GII San Gabriel H. Since Martiniquais was bred by the Wildenstein family's Allez France Stables Ltd., pedigree aficionados might expect to find an interesting pattern behind the mating.

A quick look shows that expectation to be more than fulfilled. Martiniquais is the product of some pretty close inbreeding, with Never Bend appearing 3x4 and Val de Loir 4x3. Never Bend comes in the male line as the grandsire of Simply Great (by Mill Reef) and in the sire line of the mare as the grandsire of Irish River (by Riverman).

Taken generally, matings in which the sire and dam come from the same male line have a disappointing record, but there are exceptions to every "rule," and one of the exceptions is when genetic relatives are involved. Mill Reef and Riverman are a rather interesting pair, as both Mill Reef's dam, Milan Mill, and Riverman's broodmare sire, Prince John, are products of the Princequillo/Count Fleet cross. So, Mill Reef and Riverman are the results of combining Never Bend with three-quarters genetic relatives. Then in Martiniquais' sire, Mill Reef is combined with a mare by a son of Val de Loir, and in Martiniquais' dam, Riverman is combined with a Val de Loir mare. This pattern of inbreeding in pairs seems to work rather well. For example, Gentlemen's sire is by a Northern Dancer son out of a mare by a son of Graustark, and his dam is by a son of Northern Dancer out of a Graustark mare, a rather similar pattern (though with different names) to Martiniquais.

The pedigree of Martiniquais has one more delicious twist. His sire, Simply Great, is out of a mare by Chapparral. In turn, Chapparral is out of Niccolina, and she is by a son of Nogara (dam of Nearco) out of a mare by Pharos (sire of Nearco). Of course, Never Bend, who is here twice, is a grandson of Nearco.

Since Martiniquais is the only group or graded stakes winner which Simply Great has sired from 11 crops of racing age, we can only conclude that he is yet another example of the power of inbreeding and linebreeding to genetic relatives.

I AIN'T BLUFFING (f, 3, Pine Bluff–Cup of Honey, by Raise a Cup)

In capturing the GI La Brea S. at Santa Anita Dec. 27, I Ain't Bluffing became the first Grade I winner from the first crop by her sire. Recently, Owner•Breeder magazine's Roger Lyons and I have been looking at the successful combination of Crafty Admiral and Case Ace, which is particularly apparent in the successful combination of Danzig and Raise a Native.

I Ain't Bluffing is an interesting representative of that combination. We noted that Crafty Admiral and Case Ace both combine Teddy and Commando, Crafty Admiral twice. Pine Bluff has Crafty Admiral's sire Fighting Fox 5x5 in his pedigree, and where Fighting Fox is by a son of Teddy out of a mare by a son of Commando, Case Ace is by Teddy out of a mare by a son of Commando. What's more, where Fighting Fox has the mare Maid of Erin, Case Ace has Maid of Erin's half-brother Voter, so the pair are even more closely related.

Raise a Cup, the broodmare sire of I Ain't Bluffing, has Case Ace through Raise a Native, his sire, but through his dam, he also has Bull Lea. Since Bull Lea combines Voter with Bull Dog (by Teddy), who is a brother to Sir Gallahad III, the sire of Fighting Fox, he has relationships with both Fighting Fox and Case Ace.

The other thing which struck us is that I Ain't Bluffing has a pedigree which is very similar to that of Devil His Due, both combining Halo, Raise a Cup and Herbager within the first three generations. So perhaps Devil His Due will be suited by mares carrying the strain of Pine Bluff's sire, Danzig.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

We were recently checking for examples of inbreeding to Secretariat, to consider whether we could recommend a mating which involved a close inbreeding to that horse. We found two examples—Western Fame (by Gone West and inbred to Secretariat 3x3) and Bishops Idea (by Executive Order and inbred 2x2 to Secretariat, with a third cross of his dam, Somethingroyal). Last weekend added a third example in the shape of **Hazel's Honor (f, 2, Honor Grades–Provinette, by Private Account)**, winner of the Kattegat's Pride S. at Laurel Dec. 28. Hazel's Honor has Secretariat 3x3, and for good measure, also has Somethingroyal 4x6x4 and Buckpasser 4x4.
