GULFSTREAM OPENS TOMORROW Gulfstream Park will unveil \$1.4 million in improvements when it kicks off its 54th season of racing this Saturday, January 3 in Hallandale, Florida. The track has expanded the simulcast areas and added a new room, "Inside Track," to introduce newcomers to the sport. A new rail designed to offer better protection for the jockeys has been erected along the inside of the main track, and the racing surface has been reconstructed. The 63-day meet also features a 36-race stakes program, including 31 graded events, worth \$5,225,000. The highlight of the stakes calendar will be the GI \$750,000 Florida Derby for three-year-olds, set for March 14. The \$300,000 GI Donn H. will be run February 7, followed three weeks later by the \$500,000 GI Gulfstream Park H. February 28, which could draw Horse of the Year candidate **Skip Away** (Skip Trial). Juvenile champion-elect and Horse of the Year rival **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick) is also preparing for his three-year-old campaign at Gulfstream, and could make an appearance in the GII \$200,000 Fountain of Youth S. February 21. First post will be 1 p.m. daily, with live racing Wednesdays through Mondays. The meet ends Monday, March 16.

RACING SUSPENDED AT PHILLY PARK Philadelphia Park was forced to cancel racing yesterday after track management failed to come to terms with horsemen's representatives on a new live racing agreement. The old contract expired at midnight, December 31, 1997, and without a new agreement, officials have called off both live racing and simulcasting at the track indefinitely. "We are extremely disappointed that we could not reach terms for a new agreement," said Bob Green, president of Philadelphia Park. "We had proposed a significant increase in purses, but our offer was not accepted by the horsemen."

Inner-track specialist Evil's Pic, four-for-five over this strip coming into this race, was favored after finishing second in her latest, an overnight handicap December 18. The chestnut sat near the back of the pack for a half, came with her bid from between horses on the far turn and continued to rally up the rail in the lane, getting the lead late and drawing clear. "The big difference between this race and her last race was that this time she got a clear trip and last time she didn't," said trainer Howie Tesher. "It's unfortunate that she didn't win last time out because she ran such a good race, but she just couldn't get clear at the end. She's an awfully good filly and she ran a game race today. She got an opening and she went through." Scheduled to be bred this spring, Evil's Pic may make one more start, in the GII Barbara Fritchie H. at Laurel February 14.

Making his first appearance since running third by a mere three-quarters of a length in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint November 8, Bet On Sunshine had never been worse than second in five previous starts at Turfway and was looking for his second straight victory in this event. The overwhelming choice, he stalked the pace in fourth through a half in :44 3/5, burst through to challenge front-running Victor Avenue nearing the eighth pole and outran that rival to the wire for a popular score. "(Trainer Paul McGee) had him ready to roll today," said winning jockey Charles Woods, Jr. "He really felt good. I just needed somewhere to go with him." The veteran will now point for the GII General George H. at Laurel Feb. 16.

Well beaten in her first two starts on the dirt, To Be Approved broke her maiden in her first turf try Nov. 7 at Calder, came right back with a turf allowance win over colts in her next start, and made it three in a row to keep her perfect grass record intact here. Purchased for a reported \$500,000 after her last start, she earned her first win for her new connections, taking the lead after a half and holding on under urging. "I'm the lucky recipient to get this horse," said trainer Shug McGaughey. "I've just had her about two weeks since the purchase. She came to me from (trainer) Ron Spatz in great condition. He was kind enough to fill me in on her routine, which was really helpful and I appreciate that." McGaughey said he would now look at the "logical" turf spots for the filly, including the March 4 GIII Herecomesthebride S. at Gulfstream. Said winning rider Eibar Coa, "When I found out someone bought this horse, I ran to try to get the mount back. I didn't know if I could ride her back, but I said, 'Mr. McGaughey, please let me ride this horse. I really love this horse.' He gave me a chance and she ran like I expected."

Fifth in her career opener at Pimlico July 28, 1996, Brush Over was then out of action for 15 months, returning to break her maiden for a \$25,000 tag at Laurel November 6. Claimed out of that race, the lightly raced bay is now undefeated under new management, stretching out to two turns for the first time to register her second straight allowance triumph in her latest December 11. Making her stakes debut this time, the crowd's choice closed from just off the leaders to take control at the top of the lane and stride clear. "She seems to get better the farther she goes," said trainer Dale Capuano. "We claimed her for \$25,000 and she has shown that she was worth it."

Local News: Calder Race Course

Jockey Eduardo Nunez, the subject of the 1997 Eclipse Award-winning photo series taken by Jean Raftery, won the 1,000th race of his career at Calder yesterday. Nunez, 31, a native of Panama who has been riding in the U.S. since 1986, reached the milestone aboard 3-1 **Brian's Trust** (Sword Dance {Ire}) in the day's ninth race, a maiden special weight event, by a length and three-quarters.

The Calder jockey colony, headed by Randy Romero, has raised \$1,000 to donate to the Miami Project to Cure Paralysis, the nation's premier center for spinal cord research. In addition, Japanese rider Hiroki Goto, who competed at Calder from December 23-28, pledged his earnings from that week, which also totaled \$1,000, to the charity.

A maiden winner over state-breds at first asking last June, Oly Ogy faced graded-stakes foes in his next two starts and was off the board twice. Dropping down to the allowance ranks for his most recent try, the Cal-bred dueled on the lead and just missed, finishing second at Golden Gate December 11. Ignored in this restricted stakes at 15-1, the dark bay dark horse grabbed the lead soon after the start and led all the way to the wire. "On paper, he was the only speed in the race and I just tried to nurse him around the best I could," said jockey Corey Nakatani. "I bounced him out of the gate and he relaxed fine. Turning for home, I just asked him to go on with it and he did everything on his own. He's showing he's getting better and better. Nice way to start 1998." The 9-5 favorite NATIONALLORE (Video Ranger), third in both the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Hollywood Futurity, was last early but made up some ground late to finish fifth. "I lost too much ground," said his rider, Eddie Delahoussaye. "He runs a lot better going two turns."

Fun In Excess, on the board in eight of her nine previous Santa Anita starts, came back after a two-month break to post a front-running score in the mile-and-a-sixteenth Cal Cup Matron H. October 25, but tired after setting the pace in her next outing, the seven-and-a-half furlong Cat's Cradle H. for Cal-breds, and finished fifth in her latest effort November 30. Sent off the second-longest shot in this five-horse field, she sat second as Traces of Gold set an unpressured pace, came with her challenge as they straightened into the stretch and proved best in the drive. "I scratched her out of the La Brea because she's better going two turns," said trainer Bob Baffert. "She's been training great. She was sitting on a good race, so I put her in here. She used to be real flighty, but she's getting smarter and better the older she gets. I just wish I would have bet on her at 9-1." The filly will make her next start in the Pro Or Con H. at Santa Anita February 8.

Local News: Santa Anita

Jockey Laffit Pincay Jr., who had been expected to move his tack from Southern California at the beginning of this year, will instead ride through the Santa Anita winter/spring meeting. "I'm going to give this meet a try and then take it from there," he said.

"Right now, things are about the same. I'm riding three or four a day. I just hope I can win some races and see what happens. I have a lot of things I have to do right now. I'm buying a new house and selling my old one, for example. The time just isn't right to make a move." Pincay, 51, is the leading active jockey in races won with 8,573 victories. His mounts have earned nearly \$197 million.

Apprentice jockey J.C. Gonzalez, 22, who suffered a broken femur and pelvis in a spill at Santa Anita October 24, is scheduled to return to action January 14.

Last Approach also has a double of the mare Uganda through a son, Umidwar, and a daughter, Una. The Uganda sources are also somewhat related since Umidwar appears via his daughter Uvira II, and Una via her son Palestine, and both these horses also carry the strain of Son-in-Law.
