AND THEN THERE WERE TWO: SKIP AWAY AND FAVORITE TRICK IN TITLE FIGHT

Normally, there are three names still in the hat for Horse of the Year after the divisional Eclipse Awards are announced. Year-end honors were handed out yesterday, however, and the fight for the 1997 title is literally a two-horse race. **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick), runaway winner of the Two-Year-Old Colt Eclipse Award, and **Skip Away** (Skip Trial), who edged **Gentlemen** (Arg) for the Older Male Award, are so far in front of the field that there is no third candidate. Trainer Patrick Byrne orchestrated **Favorite Trick's** eight-for-eight juvenile campaign, but has handed his reins to Bill Mott in favor of a private job with owner Frank Stronach. Byrne is not making any Horse of the Year predictions. "I'd definitely be satisfied with the two-year-old championship," he said. "Favorite Trick was brilliant, but Skip Away is a wonderful horse and has been wonderful for racing for the past couple of years. You can't win every time, and if we come in second (for Horse of the Year), it won't be the end of the world. I believe he'll be a top-class three-year-old and I wish his connections the best of luck with him." Trainer Sonny Hine handles Skip Away, also the 1996 champion three-year-old colt, for his wife, Carolyn; he mirrored Byrne's sentiments. "We are grateful for what we've got," said Hine. "We're just grateful to have our horse named older horse of the year." Carolyn Hine was also honored as the Eclipse Award-winning owner of 1997. "I'm a believer," she said. "I'm ecstatic and proud and honored. All my dreams have come true." Her colt did his most impressive running at the end of the season, winning the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic by daylight. Now five, the grey had his first work of the new year yesterday at Gulfstream Park, going three furlongs in :37 2/5. Jockey Jerry Bailey, who picked up his third straight Eclipse Award yesterday, was in the irons for the breeze. "That wasn't a very serious work," said his trainer. "Just a feeler to see where we're at. Jerry said he was very strong and could have done a lot more." As for where the champ will make his seasonal debut, Hine revealed that Skip Away was sidelined with a fever for several days at the end of December, but added, "We'll let him tell us when he's ready. We'll nominate for the Donn H. (GI, February 7) and see what happens. We're in no rush." The 1997 Horse of the Year will be announced at the Eclipse Award Dinner February 10 in Rancho Mirage, California.

AND THE ECLIPSE AWARD WINNERS

ARE... There were few surprises in the 1997 Eclipse Award categories. Five of the 10 divisional champions capped their 1997 seasons with Breeders' Cup scores, and all were the unanimous choices of the three voting groups, the Thoroughbred Racing Associations, National Turf Writers Association and *Daily Racing Form*. **Countess Diana** (Deerhound), who went five-for-six with a decisive win in the GI Juvenile Fillies, was named champion Two-Year-Old Filly. Stablemate **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick), easy winner of the GI Juvenile, took home honors as champion Two-Year-Old Colt, giving trainer Patrick Byrne his first-ever Eclipse winners. GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness hero **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) missed winning the Triple Crown by three-quarters of a length when second in the GI Belmont S., and he was still on the sidelines when the GI Breeders' Cup Classic rolled around, but he didn't miss out on year-end honors. The engaging grey was named champion Three-Year-Old Colt. **Ajina** (Strawberry Road {Aus}) started off slowly in 1997 but picked up the pace to take the GI Mother Goose and GI Coaching Club American Oaks and her victory over older fillies in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff earned her the Eclipse as top Three-Year-Old Filly. **Hidden Lake** (Quiet American) suffered a resounding 22-length defeat in the Distaff, finishing seventh, but the now five-year-old put together consecutive wins in the GI Shuvee H., GI Hempstead H., GI Go For Wand and GI Beldame and came away with the Eclipse Award as champion Older Female. **Skip Away's** (Skip Trial) awesome 6 1/2-length romp in the Breeders' Cup Classic carried him to the Older Male championship. **Chief Bearhart** (Chief's Crown), five-for-seven on the year and a game three-quarter length victor of the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, was honored as champion Turf Male. **Ryafan** (Lear Fan), also five-for-seven as a three-year-old in 1997, began the season in Europe but was undefeated in three U.S. starts, the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup, GI Yellow Ribbon and GI Matriarch, and was named champion Turf Female. **Smoke Glacken** (Two Punch), a perfect six-for-six at a mile or under in 1997 and winner of the GI Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial Dash over older horses, was retired after that July victory but was remembered at voting time as the year's champion Sprinter. A champion in 1992, 1993 and 1995, nine-year-old **Lonesome Glory** (Transworld) started the campaign with a win in the GI Carolina Cup and ended it with a win in the GI Colonial Cup, tying the venerable John Henry (champion Turf Male and Horse of the Year in 1984 at age nine) as the oldest Eclipse winner as top steeplechaser. With the exception of champion jockey and breeder, the winners in the human categories were all first-timers. (Cont. p2)

Mr. and Mrs. John Mabee's Golden Eagle Farm, also a winner in 1991, was named champion Breeder. The Mabees, based in California, sent out 19 stakes winners in 1997, including GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and GI Hollywood Starlet runner-up **Career Collection** (General Meeting), winner of the GII Landaluce S. and GII Sorrento S. Golden Eagle-bred horses earned more than \$7.3 million last year. Jerry Bailey, who led the nation's riders in earnings with \$18,320,743 and won 273 races last year, picked up an unprecedented third consecutive Eclipse Award as champion Jockey. The 40-year-old reinsman won 51 stakes in 1997, including 36 graded events, and captured the second running of the Dubai World Cup with Singpiel (Ire). There was a tie in the Apprentice Jockey category, with Philip Teator and Roberto Rosado named co-champions. Carolyn Hine, who put up \$480,000 to run her stable star Skip Away in the Breeders' Cup Classic, was honored as the year's champion Owner. Bob Baffert, who guided Silver Charm through a stellar Triple Crown campaign and saddled 113 winners, was honored with his first Eclipse as champion Trainer. In addition to Silver Charm, he conditioned Grade I winners **Vivid Angel** (Septieme Ciel) and **Real Quiet** (Quiet American); his runners earned \$8,867,128. "When I left Prescott Downs in 1983, I never imagined I would be in this position," said Baffert. "Something like this didn't even seem conceivable. It's very emotional. I never thought I would come this far." But when asked his opinion of the outcome of the Horse of the Year battle, Baffert reverted to comic form. "I wish you would have asked me that a week ago. I would have said Favorite Trick all the way...when they were looking for a trainer for him," he quipped.

GLITTER WOMAN PREPS FOR RETURN GISW

Glitter Woman (Glitterman), away since finishing eighth as the 7-5 favorite in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 2, worked five-eighths in :59 4/5, handily, Tuesday at Gulfstream Park. Now four, the filly started 1996 with four straight graded stakes victories, winning those races by a combined 32 1/2 lengths. She captured, in succession, the GIII Forward Gal and GIII Davona Dale, GII Bonnie Miss and GI Ashland before injuring her right knee in the Oaks. The Shug McGaughey trainee underwent minor knee surgery at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital May 7. Of the breeze, McGaughey said, "It was the first time I had really asked her to do anything. She worked good." As for her return date, he offered, "She's nominated to First Lady H. (GIII, January 14), but that's something I really don't know about right now. It's a possibility. I could wait a little longer."

PHILLY PARK BACK IN BUSINESS Officials at Philadelphia Park have reached an agreement with the Pennsylvania division of the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, ending a dispute which had closed the track since New Year's Day. Racing is scheduled to resume Saturday, and Philly Park was open for simulcasting yesterday. The new contract provides for "a significant increase in race purses and long-term security for our horsemen," according to a Philly Park press release. "This is a good deal for our members and for the continued well being of the Pennsylvania Thoroughbred racing and breeding industries," said Larry Rivello, president of the Pa-THA.

STUKA TO MAGNOLIA RUN FARM GISW

Stuka (Jade Hunter), a freshman sire of 1998, will stand the '98 season at Magnolia Run Farm in Summerfield, Florida for a fee of \$3,000, live foal. The eight-year-old, winner of the GI Santa Anita H. and \$916,175, is a shuttle stallion and served the 1997 Southern Hemisphere season in Chile. Stuka stood at Vinery in Midway, Kentucky in 1997. His first crop races this year.

THE BOYS ARE BACK IN TOWN The largest-ever contingent of shuttle stallions arrived back in the Northern Hemisphere early Wednesday morning on flights organized by International Racehorse Transport. Twenty five of the horses went to North American farms, 11 to England, 28 to Ireland and five to France. Sixteen of the American stallions--Hennessy, Honour and Glory, Thunder Gulch, Dehere, Personal Hope, Woodman, Royal Academy, Quest For Fame (GB), Brocco, Unbridled's Song, Regal Classic, Personal Flag, Mister Frisky, Is It True, Supremo and Jade Hunter--were returning from stud seasons in Australia, while the other nine--Rhythm, Wallenda, Prized, Honor Grades, Defensive Play, Housebuster, Faltaat, Slavic and Resting Place--have all been in New Zealand. Among those arriving in England were Hector Protector, Danzig Connection, Suave Dancer and Celtic Swing (GB); included in the large Irish contingent were Danehill, Barathea (Ire), Brief Truce, Night Shift and Bluebird. Heading the French group was 1996-97 Australian Horse of the Year Octagonal (NZ).

JOCKEY CLUB'S PROTECTED NAMES LIST

SHRINKS The Jockey Club reports that efforts to ease the naming of Thoroughbreds have resulted in a substantial decline in the number of protected names to 485,000, the fewest since the early 1980s. Credited for the decrease was a rule change which freed many of the names which had been listed. Rule 6 (E) was amended to release names of horses over 10 years old which have not been raced or used for breeding for the preceding five years, rather than the preceding 10 years. February 1 is the deadline to name foals for 1996. Name applications can be submitted via the Internet on The Jockey Club's site, *Jockey Club Interactive*, accessible at www.jockeyclub.com.

Jockey Goncalino Almeida, hospitalized for five days following a spill December 30, hopes to be back in the saddle Wednesday.
