### CHURCHILL UNVEILS DERBY POST DRAW

**RULES** Churchill Downs has established an official set of rules for the new Kentucky Derby post position draw. Beginning with the 124<sup>th</sup> running of the Derby, a random draw will determine not the post positions themselves, but the order in which participants will choose their preferred posts from those left when their turn comes up. Under the new rules, Derby entrants must designate an "authorized agent" who will select the horse's post position and announce the selection. The agent must be in attendance at the draw, which this year will be held at 5 p.m. ET Wednesday, April 29 at the Kentucky Derby Museum. After the random draw for selection order is completed, the agents will have 10 minutes to discuss their strategy with the horse's connections. Each agent will then, in his turn, be given 60 seconds to choose a post; if any agent fails to make a decision in the time allowed, his horse will drop to the bottom of the selection order. Both the random draw and the post position selections will be televised live on ESPN.

**MR PURPLE PRIMED FOR '98 SEASON** After experiencing fertility problems in 1997, second-year sire **Mr Purple** (Deputy Minister) is back at Calumet Farm in Lexington and is ready for the '98 season. Following the '97 breeding season, GISW Mr Purple was sent to Colorado State University under the care of Dr. Bill Pickett, a stallion reproductive specialist. After extensive testing and treatment, the six-year-old responded well and returned to Kentucky. "From what we've been told, all critical parameters regarding fertility have dramatically improved," said Neil Howard, Calumet's general manager. "Dr. Pickett feels that Mr Purple can successfully cover a book of mares. We plan to start breeding him once a day to a book of 40 mares. Dr. Pickett feels that after the first month, we can breed him twice a day. If everything goes as well as we hope, we will then increase his book." Mr Purple will stand the 1998 season for a fee of \$5,000, live foal.

**CORRECTION:** A story in Friday's *TDN* included Brocco among a group of shuttle stallions returning to the Northern Hemisphere from stud duty in Australia. In fact, Brocco remains at Arrowfield Stud in Australia and will miss the 1998 Northern Hemisphere breeding season, as previously reported. He is expected to breed the Southern Hemisphere season in 1998, returning to Kentucky in 1999.

**FREE HOUSE SIDELINED** According to the *Daily Racing Form*, **Free House** (Smokester), winner of the GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Swaps S. and on the board in all three Triple Crown races last year, has suffered a training setback at Hollywood Park and is likely to miss the GI Strub S. February 7. The four-year-old colt has been out of action since finishing sixth and last in the GI Super Derby September 28. "He's body sore and I'll go easy on him," trainer Paco Gonzalez told the *Form*. "We didn't find anything wrong. I want to see him 100 percent and I won't train him on bute. I don't know if he's pulled a muscle or what. I sent him for a nuclear scan, but they didn't find any problems."

"I think he's going to be at his best going two turns," said Puype. "I think he's going to a very good router."
