### KEENELAND JANUARY OPENS TODAY

The dispersal which will end one of racing's longest and most successful partnerships highlights the five-day Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale which starts today in Lexington, Kentucky. Claiborne Farm and Nicole Perry Gorman will disperse 35 horses on Tuesday, dissolving a partnership which Arthur B. (Bull) Hancock and William Haggin Perry formed almost 40 years ago. The collaboration resulted in more than 100 stakes winners, including champions such as Gamely, Lamb Chop, Moccasin, Revidere and Slew o'Gold; U.S. Classic winners Coastal and Swale; European Classic winner and champion stallion Caerleon; and two-time Breeders' Cup Mile winner Lure. The Claiborne-Gorman dispersal consists of 14 broodmares in foal to stallions such as Devil's Bag, Mr. Prospector and Seeking the Gold, and one broodmare prospect; the eight two-year-olds and 12 yearlings are by top sires like Danzig, Forty Niner, Mr. Prospector, Seattle Slew and Seeking the Gold. In addition, the Keeneland January Sale features 1,600 lots, including 725 broodmares in foal to stallions such as A.P. Indy, Danzig, Deputy Minister, Gone West, Mr. Prospector, Seeking the Gold and Woodman; and 486 yearlings representing, among others, Capote, Danzig, Mr. Prospector, Pleasant Colony, Storm Cat, Thunder Gulch and Woodman. One of central Kentucky's newest Thoroughbred operations, Hopewell Farm in Midway, will offer its first-ever consignment of 24 broodmares and broodmare prospects this year. While figures at last year's four-day January Sale were down, with 1,003 horses selling for \$24,042,300, an average of \$23,970, this year's edition follows record-breaking Keeneland events in September and November. Gross sales topped the \$200 million mark for the first time in industry history at the November Breeding Stock Sale, tallying \$213.8 million. Buyers spent a record \$469 million at Keeneland auctions last year. Closed-circuit television coverage of the first two days of the January Sale, which runs through Friday, January 16, will be transmitted via satellite on Galaxy 3, Transponder 11. Bidding begins at 10 a.m. daily.

A mortal lock? Coming off an 11-length win over Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies runnerup Career Collection (General Meeting) in the GI Hollywood Starlet December 13 at Hollywood in her last start, Love Lock was deemed just that by the Santa Anita crowd. The grey/roan filly, the only GSW in the field, also sported two GIII wins--the Golden Rod two starts back Nov. 29, and the June 28 Debutante, both at Churchill--with the only recent question mark on her record a distant ninth in the Juvenile Fillies. The 1-5 favorite "broke like a rocket," according to rider Kent Desormeaux, who expected an uncontested early lead, but EASTSIDE WESTSIDE (Eastern Echo) had other plans. Pressed by that rival until the far turn, Love Lock still led at every call, and shook off her challenger heading for home. Nearing the wire, Desormeaux tapped his filly three times, ensuring a safe margin of finish over the closing Nonies Dancer Ali. Said Desormeaux, "It's unfortunate that she had to work so hard to beat these fillies, but she didn't back up at all and that's what sets her apart from the rest of them. That's what lets you know she's the real deal." Said trainer D. Wayne Lukas, "I was very impressed with the last quarter in light of everything that surfaced." Lukas said the filly would likely run back in the February 15 GI Las Virgenes S., and then the March 15 GI Santa Anita Oaks.

Copy Editor prevailed in a Dec. 12 Calder turf allowance event in his previous trip to the post. The second choice raced in second along the rail in the early going, grabbed the lead down the backside and drew away in the lane. "He breaks real good and with the inside post in a mile-and-three-eighths race, I wanted to get position," winning jockey Jerry Bailey said. "You can't really take too much hold of him. He's got a tender mouth. I was just hoping that I wouldn't get into a head-and-head duel with SEPARATED LOVE (Pentelicus). Fortunately, he outran me enough to where my horse settled off of him. The other horse (Lafitte The Pirate {GB}) was charging but my horse wasn't quitting." The race came up at a good time for the winner, according to assistant trainer Sheila Santage. "The horse runs good fresh," Santage said. "(Trainer) Marty (Wolfson) likes to spread his races out. He performs best when he is given time off between races. He's shown that in the past." Santage substituted for Wolfson in saddling Copy Editor after Wolfson's wife, Karla, underwent emergency surgery earlier in the day after being kicked by a horse at the family farm in West Ft. Lauderdale.

**FAIR GROUNDS UPS PURSES** Effective Thursday, January 15, all Fair Grounds purses with the exception of stakes and Louisiana-bred maiden events will receive a 10% purse increase for the remainder of the meet, track President and General Manager Bryan Krantz announced yesterday. Krantz attributed the increase, which will boost purses between \$700 and \$3,600 per race, to the continued growth of Fair Grounds' out-of-state simulcast revenue and to improved on-track business due to the opening of the track's new grandstand/clubhouse facility. The 88-day Fair Grounds meet concludes March 30.

## WRITERS UP

### TAKING THE A1A TO THE FIRST SATURDAY IN MAY

For many of those three-year-olds with the right stuff, the road to the Triple Crown passes through South Florida. A stroll down the backstretch at Gulfstream and Hialeah finds the following colts you might just find in the starting gate on the first Saturday in May:

**Cape Town** (Seeking the Gold--Seaside Attraction, by Seattle Slew), a half-brother to champion Golden Attraction (Mr. Prospector), is trained by D. Wayne Lukas and owned by Overbrook Farm. First in the GIII Brown & Williamson Kentucky Jockey Club S. in front of stable-mate Time Limit, Lukas' assistant trainer Jerry Barton said the colt will go in the GIII Holy Bull S. January 17 at Gulfstream Park.

**Caution Flag** (A.P. Indy--Miss Eva {Arg}, by \*Con Brillo), a winner once in six starts at two, is the first of four candidates trained by Neil Howard. Will Farish, W. Webber, Jr. and F. Mansell are partners in Caution Flag. Howard is looking for a non-winners of one allowance race to evaluate Caution Flag's progress into his three-year-old season.

**Comic Strip** (Red Ransom--Now That's Funny, by Saratoga Six) is another Howard-trained colt, owned by Farish, G. Watts Humphrey and James Elkins. He appeared on opening day at Gulfstream, January 3, going 1 1/16 miles in 1:43.92 and winning by 1 3/4 lengths. "I'd like to keep them apart as long as possible," said Howard about his four Triple Crown candidates. "So we may have to go to the Fair Grounds for his next race." Howard said that as his four develop, he'll decide which will go to Kentucky (for the GII Toyota Blue Grass April 11) and which will go to New York (for the GIII Gotham March 21 and GII Wood Memorial April 11).

**Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner--Laughing Look, by Damascus) is owned by Stuart Janney III and trained by Shug McGaughey. A distant runner-up in the Eclipse Award balloting for top two-year-old of '97, he was five-for-six as a juvenile with wins in the GIII Nashua, GII Cowdin and GII Remsen at Aqueduct just before Shug headed south for the winter. Coronado's Quest, who set a track record at Aqueduct, going 6 1/2 furlongs in 1:14 1/5, is training at Payson Park and McGaughey said he'd have him ship down to Gulfstream Park before the seven furlong GII Hutcheson January 31. "He's working well up there and I'm inclined to leave him there as long as possible," said McGaughey from his barn at Gulfstream. "He's had three good works and went :50 1/5 just the other day." McGaughey said he would look at the GII Fountain of Youth February 21, the GI Florida Derby March 14 and possibly the Blue Grass at Keeneland April 11.

**Dawson's Legacy** (Roanoke--Creme Caromel, by Whitesburg), Canada's champion two-year-old, was second in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at 78-1. Owned by J. M. Stritzl Stable and trained by Rita Schnitzler, Dawson's Legacy won on the turf on Gulfstream's opening day, taking an allowance by six lengths in 1:43.50. "It's the last time he'll see the turf down here," Schnitzler said. "I might run him in the Holy Bull January 17, or I might wait for one of the other longer races before I send him out again." This is Schnitzler's first Derby possibility and she admits she's feeling her way along.

**Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick--Evil Elaine, by Medieval Man) has just moved over to Bill Mott's barn from trainer Pat Byrne's shedrow. Byrne guided Favorite Trick to a perfect eight-for-eight season, a GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile victory and a two-year-old championship for owner Joseph Lacombe. Favorite Trick was under the watchful eye of Dick Lundy in Ocala before he was shipped to Mott's operation at Payson Park. Mott said he anticipated starting Favorite Trick in mid-March, possibly in the GIII Swale March 14. Since its inception in 1985, no horse has come out of the Swale and won the Kentucky Derby.

**Halory Hunter** (Jade Hunter--Halory, by Halo) is handled by two-time Derby-winning trainer Nick Zito, who has another barn full of promising 3-year-olds. Halory Hunter, owned by Rick Pitino's Celtic Pride Stable, ran second to Coronado's Quest in the Remsen and third in the Champagne. Zito said he was looking at the Holy Bull or a two-turn allowance race, with the Florida Derby and ultimately the Kentucky Derby down the road.

**Laydown** (Cryptoclearance--Pushing Fifty, by Forty Niner), winner of the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile and third to Favorite Trick in the GII Lane's End Breeders Futurity, is another Zito-trained colt, owned by Texan James McIngvale. "He'll go around two turns, either in the Holy Bull or a non-winners of two," said Zito. Like Howard, Zito will probably keep his contenders separate by sending one to Kentucky and one to New York for prep races to the Derby.

**Lil's Lad** (Pine Bluff--Totemic, by Vanlandingham) is owned by Will Farish, Lillian Durst and Centennial Farms and trained by Neil Howard. A 50-percent interest in Lil's Lad was purchased by Farish and Centennial Farm from Lillian Durst for a reported \$1.5 million and the colt went from Frank Martin's barn to Howard's. After knocking heads with Grand Slam twice as a two-year-old, finishing fourth in the GI Futurity and second in the GI Moet Champagne, Lil's Lad had an easy time on the second day of the Gulfstream meeting. Facing seven others in a 6-1/2 furlong race January 4, Lil's Lad carried Jerry Bailey to a 16-1/2 length victory in 1:16.73. Howard said he would point Lil's Lad toward the Hutcheson. "We'll take it one race at a time," said Howard, who is about as superstitious as a trainer can get.

**Missionary** (Deputy Minister--Prayer Wheel, by Conquistador Cielo) is another colt under Howard's care. Owned by Farish, Donald Adams and Robe Brunson, he is being pointed toward the Holy Bull S. after breaking his maiden and winning a non-winners of one allowance going two turns as a two-year-old.

**Polished Brass** (Dixie Brass--Solo Haina, by Solo Landing), winner of last year's GIII Sanford S. at Saratoga, is another of Lacombe's horses that left Byrne's barn, this one to go to Elliot Walden. From his winter training site in Payson Park, Walden said he had just gotten the colt a day earlier and wanted to take at least three weeks to evaluate what he had. "The Hutcheson is out," said Walden of the colt who finished a disappointing fifth after a five-month layoff in the six-furlong GIII Spectacular Bid S. January 4; Byrne saddled him that day.

**Scatmandu** (Storm Cat--Princess Alydar, by Alydar) was injured after a third-place finish in the GII Cowdin at Aqueduct and won't return to training until February. He is more likely for the GI Travers at Saratoga than the Derby. The million-dollar two-year-old purchase, a full brother to MGISW November Snow, is trained by John Kimmel and owned by Robert Waxman.

**Solid Wood** (Woodman--Touch of Greatness, by Hero's Honor), a maiden and allowance winner at two, is being evaluated after a last-place finish in the B & W Kentucky Jockey Cup. Trainer Nick Zito said he was looking for a two-turn allowance race at Gulfstream for James McIngvale's colt.

**St. Michael** (Devil's Bag--Line, by Mr. Prospector) is another McIngvale/Zito colt. A late bloomer who was third behind Grand Slam in his lone start July 18, St. Michael will first look to break his maiden at Gulfstream. "When he runs, you watch. He could be something," warns Zito.

**Swig** (Fly So Free--Cassa Gay, by Cassalera), two-for-five as a juvenile, is trained by Zito for Fox Hill Farm, Inc. After a fifth in the GIII What A Pleasure S. at Calder, Zito said, "I'm looking to regroup, maybe find a two-turn, non-winners of two allowance race."

**Sweetsouthern** (Saint Ballado--Sweetsouthern, by Tri Jet) went three-for-three as a two-year-old, winning the What A Pleasure by 4 1/2 lengths, and is trained by Leo Azpurua, Jr. and owned by Harold Plumley. Rumor has it Plumley turned down seven figures for the colt after his third win. He has shipped from his home base at Calder to Gulfstream and is being pointed toward the Holy Bull.

**Thunder Bow** (Rocky Mountain--Penalty Declared, by Thanks to Tony) is the second three-year-old in trainer Rita Schnitzler's barn for owner Stritzl. The colt, winner of Woodbine's Swynford S., has never been worse than second in five starts. Schnitzler is looking at the Hutcheson for Thunder Bow, who is eligible for non-winners of three.

**Treasury** (Deputy Minister--Glorious Natalie, by Reflected Glory), half-brother to MGISW and millionaire King Glorious (Naevus), is another in the line of McIngvale/Zito colts. One-for-six last year with a third-place finish in a stakes at Sam Houston, Treasury is headed to a two-turn allowance, according to Zito.
