SECRETARIAT MARE TOPS

KEENELAND JANUARY OPENER Tiffany's Secret (Secretariat), an 11-year-old broodmare in foal to Smart Strike, brought a final bid of \$325,000 to top the opening session of the five-day Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale Monday in Lexington. Consigned by Anderson Farms, agent for Sam-Son Farm, the Canadian-bred stakes winner was purchased by Richard L. Golden. "She's a lovely mare in foal to one of the hottest young stallions," said Golden. "She was an outstanding runner and has a great pedigree. We liked everything about her. She will be shipped to my farm in Maryland. She doesn't foal until April, so we'll make breeding plans in the near future." Broodmare prospect **Batroiale** (Batonnier), a five-year-old who captured the GII Sorrento S. and GII Del Mar Debutante at two and three stakes at four for earnings of \$411,309, attracted the second-highest bid Monday. Consigned by Dan Kenny, agent, the dark bay was purchased by Oceanic Bloodstock Agency for \$310,000. The mare will be retired, and is headed to Woods Edge Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. Her buyers have not yet decided on a stallion for her. A total of 224 horses grossed \$8,421,800 during the sale's opener, down 12.5 percent from the corresponding session last year when 257 hips brought \$9,628,800. The 1998 average of \$37,597 was up slightly, however, gaining from last year's opening figure of \$37,466, and the median was up an impressive 46.6 percent, from \$15,000 a year ago to \$22,000 yesterday. The sale continues through Friday.

SIR CAT RETIRED Sir Cat (Storm Cat), winner of the GII Appleton H. at Gulfstream Park January 3, has been retired and will stand the 1998 breeding season at Gainesway in Lexington, Kentucky. A winner of seven of his 14 career starts and \$401,085, including the GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame S. at three and the GIII Knickerbocker H. and GIII Tropical Turf H. at four, the five-year-old was purchased by a syndicate headed by Richard L. Golden just before his Appleton victory. "The other partners and I purchased him as a stallion prospect, so he will retire sound and have an early start at stud," said Golden. "We are very excited he will stand at Gainesway." Added Michael Hernon of Gainesway, "Sir Cat has all the credentials we look for in a sire. He proved himself on the track, he has excellent conformation and his pedigree is very strong." Sir Cat will stand for \$7,500, live foal.

HOLY BULL S.-GIII, \$100,000, 3yo, 1/16m

Overbrook Farm's **Cape Town** (Seeking the Gold), winner of last season's GIII Brown & Williamson Kentucky Jockey Club S., worked five furlongs in 1:00 yesterday for the Holy Bull. "He did everything right," said Jerry Barton, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "We're really looking forward to next weekend."

Also pointing for the Holy Bull, Canadian champ **Dawson's Legacy** (Roanoke) will just gallop into the race. The Sovereign Award winner took a turf allowance on opening day of the Gulfstream meet, January 3. "He came out of the race strong," said Norm McKnight, assistant to trainer Rita Schnitzler. "We're just going to gallop him to get him ready for Saturday."

Undefeated **Sweetsouthern** (Saint Ballado), winner of the GIII What A Pleasure S. to end his two-year-old campaign, zipped five furlongs in :59 1/5 yesterday with Pat Day in the irons. Day will replace jockey Abdiel Toribio, who rode the colt in his first three starts, Saturday. **Roguish Prince** (Robyn Dancer), runner-up in the What A Pleasure, will be back for a rematch in the Holy Bull. "He's doing good," said trainer James Divito. "This is going to be tough, but I've got a pretty good horse here. We'll see where we belong after this race."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

REGAL CLASSIC TO PRESTONWOOD Champion and Classic winner **Regal Classic** (Vice Regent), Canada's General Leading Sire and Leading Sire of Two-Year-Olds in 1997, will stand the 1998 season at Prestonwood Farm near Versailles, Kentucky. From five crops of racing age, Regal Classic has sired 20 stakes winners, including his leading earner, 1997 GIC Eclipse S. winner Stephanotis. Voted champion two-year-old in Canada, the stallion won the GIC Prince of Wales S. at three. He will stand as the property of a syndicate for a fee of \$12,500, live foal.

AMERICAN STALLIONS IMPACT MAGIC

MILLIONS SALE Six of the American stallions which shuttled to the Southern Hemisphere for the 1997 covering season--Brocco, Dehere, Jade Hunter, Personal Hope, Quest For Fame (GB) and Regal Classic--were represented at the three-day Magic Millions Yearling Sales held Friday, Saturday and Sunday on the Gold Coast in Queensland, Australia. Most in demand was Dehere, whose seven yearlings grossed \$549,488, an average of \$78,498. Quest For Fame's three yearlings averaged \$35,509, while Regal Classic's team of eight brought an average of \$32,236 and the eight yearlings by Brocco sold for an average of \$31,267. Personal Hope's five averaged \$15,777. The final day of the sale saw 148 yearlings gross \$5,307,443, an average of \$35,861. Over the three days of the auction, 415 lots sold for an aggregate \$15,127,144, an average of \$36,451. The session topper on closing day was a colt by the Australian-based stallion Naturalism (NZ), which was purchased by trainer Graeme Rogerson for \$134,844.
