RECORDS FALL WITH CLAIBORNE/GORMAN DISPERSAL ON KEENELAND'S CENTER STAGE

The complete dispersal of Claiborne Farm and Nicole Perry Gorman exceeded all expectations while dominating the second day of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. Bidding on nine of the 34 horses in the dispersal reached seven figures. Claiborne President Seth Hancock said, "We've had a great sale. It's really been unbelievable--we never anticipated anything like this." Irish bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne, acting for John Magnier and Michael Tabor, purchased hip number 657, a yearling filly by Seeking the Gold--Number (Nijinsky II), for a sales record-shattering \$3.4 million. "She's really something special, we think," O'Byrne said. "She has everything. How many times can you get into one of these families like this? We just thought it was a good opportunity." Prior to Tuesday, the highest price ever paid at the Keeneland January Sale was \$3 million, set in 1986 when Shadwell Farm bought the mare Lucky Lucky Lucky, in foal to Northern Dancer, from Spendthrift Farm. One hip later, O'Byrne purchased the filly's two-year-old full sister for \$1 million. "The two-year-old will probably train in Europe, I would think," O'Byrne said of the elder Number filly. The session's highest-priced mare was hip number 626, the six-year-old **Limit** (Cox's Ridge). Purchased for \$2.5 million--the second-highest priced mare in Keeneland January history--by Adele Dilschneider, the bay mare is in foal to Boundary. "She's such a magnificent mare. She's just breathtaking," Dilschneider said of the newest of her approximately 15 broodmares, all of whom are boarded at Claiborne. The second-highest priced mare of the session was hip number 491, the 14-year-old mare **Bound** (Nijinsky II). In foal to Seeking the Gold, the bay mare brought a final bid of \$2.2 million from John Magnier. Hip number 535 became the highest priced two-year-old to go through the Keeneland January sales ring when Course Investments purchased the filly for the Niarchos family with a bid of \$1.2 million.

W. S. Farish purchased a yearling colt for \$1.15 million. Selling as hip number 436, the colt is a full brother to multiple grade I stakes winner Scan, by Mr. Prospector--Video (Nijinsky II). "He is an outstanding racing prospect and sire prospect--one of the best I've seen," Farish said. "It's very, very difficult to get a horse with this kind of pedigree. When they come along, you have to be prepared to try to get into them." When the day was done, the dispersal had sold 34 horses for a total of \$21,205,000. The average was an eye-popping \$623,676. It was probably too late to change the catalog, but the mare **Unbeknownst** (Lyphard) should have been listed as hip numbers 430 and 430a. The seven-year-old mare was covered by Silver Ghost last Valentine's Day and around 9:00 Monday morning she foaled a bay filly. When the mare, accompanied by her filly, passed through the ring, the pair was greeted with a lengthy, "Awww," from the crowd. **Unbeknownst** was consigned by Fred Seitz/Brookdale Farm, agent, and brought a final bid of \$55,000 from J. Gunther, et. al. All told, Keeneland sold 245 horses during Tuesday's frenetic bidding for a total of \$34,884,800. The average was \$142,387. The median price was \$35,000. At last year's corresponding session, 260 horses sold for \$8,695,200, with an average of \$33,443 and a median of \$16,000.

PEINTRE CELEBRE IN A CLASS OF HIS OWN

Daniel Wildenstein's homebred colt **Peintre Celebre** (Nureyev) was voted the best horse in the Northern Hemisphere for 1997 Tuesday when given a rating of 137 in the International Classifications, which include horses rated at 110 or over which have run or been trained in Europe, Japan or North America. Winner of both the G1 Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby) and the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe as a three-year-old, **Peintre Celebre** was rated three pounds ahead of G1 Japan Cup, G1 Coral-Eclipse S. and G1 Champion S. winner **Pilsudski (Ire)** (Polish Precedent) at 134, with G1 Dubai World Cup, G1 Coronation Cup and G1 Juddmonte Int'l winner **Singspiel (Ire)** (In the Wings {GB}) at 132, followed by **Bosra Sham** (Woodman) and **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois) at 131. Godolphin's **Swain (Ire)** (Nashwan) was next on the list at 129, followed by **Formal Gold** (Black Tie Affair {Ire}) and **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) at 127. **Peintre Celebre** was rated no less than nine pounds better than his nearest rival, G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 Budweiser Irish Derby winner **Desert King (Ire)** (Danehill), among the three-year-olds. G1 Epsom Derby winner **Benny The Dip** (Silver Hawk) and G1 Belmont S. winner **Touch Gold** (Deputy Minister) were next at 126, with G1 Kentucky Derby and G1 Preakness S. winner **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) at 125, a pound ahead of **Captain Bodgit** (Saint Ballado), **Free House** (Smokester) and G1 English 2000 Guineas winner **Entrepreneur (GB)** (Sadler's Wells). Three-year-old fillies **Ajina** (Strawberry Road {Aus}) and **Sharp Cat** (Storm Cat) were tops in their division at 123. As expected, Prince Khaled Abdullah's colt **Xaar (GB)** (Zafonic), winner of the G1 Prix de la Salamandre and G1 Thoroughbred Corporation Dewhurst S., dominated the European two-year-old category with a 127-pound rating.

BRITISH HORSERACING BOARD CHAIRMAN RESIGNS

The British Racing Industry was in disarray yesterday after Lord Wakeham, chairman and director of the British Horseracing Board for the past 2 ½ years, resigned his position on the eve of the presentation of the Industry Committee's Financial Plan. In a short statement, Lord Wakeham said, "I have today resigned as chairman and director of the British Horseracing Board as I was unable to agree with the financial plan put before the board. In my opinion, the plan is unrealistic in the current economic circumstances." Wakeham ended his statement with a succinct, "I wish racing well." The financial plan was approved by the Industry Committee Monday and was expected to gain the Board's approval. Owner Peter Savill is chairman of the group who produced the plan. Lord Wakeham has come under fire from several members of the Board in recent weeks, most notably Savill, who were upset that details of the plan had been leaked and accused Wakeham of undermining the BHB's case with the Government. The financial plan is expected to call for an input of £105 million (\$173,324,530) per year in an effort to double prize money, significantly increase spending on marketing and boost breeders' premiums. Racing is expected to try to convince politicians that £80 million (\$132,056,784) be secured with Government help via a 1.75-percent reduction in betting duty. The extra £25 million (\$41,267,745) is expected to be generated from within the racing industry itself. In the short term, Sir Thomas Pilkington has been appointed acting chairman of the BHB, with the Board promising to appoint a new chairman "as soon as possible."

MACKEY NAMED HIALEAH VP

Michael G. Mackey has been named vice president and general manager of Hialeah Park and Race Course. Mackey served in the same position at the Florida track in the mid-1980s before moving to Thistledown in Ohio, where he was executive vice president and general manager. John Van Lindt, who had the title Mackey currently holds, will continue at Hialeah with the title of vice president. "I'll be spending a good deal of time in Tallahassee this year," said Van Lindt. "Mackey will run the track's day-to-day operations, while I concentrate on the politics." Asked if Mackey's job was permanent or temporary, Van Lindt said, "If we don't get what we need in Tallahassee this year, everybody's job at Hialeah will be temporary."

TURFWAY NUMBERS REMAIN STEADY The 1997 Holiday Meet at Turfway Park concluded December 31 with a 3.5-percent increase in total handle and a 2.7-percent increase in total attendance. Total handle reached \$3,571,350 and total attendance was 5,881. On-track attendance at the 22-day meet reached 36,339, down 10 percent from the 1996 Holiday Meet. On-track handle decreased 5.6 percent, from \$10,044,536 a year ago to \$9,479,916 in 1997. "The battle for the entertainment and wagering dollar in the Greater Cincinnati area remains at an all-time high," commented Turfway Park President Mark Simendinger. "Despite that, we were able to maintain the same purse structure we had last year, we averaged 9.7 starters a race, which remains one of the highest numbers in the country. We continue to be a popular simulcast signal which drives our business."

CTBA & HOLLYWOOD TEAM UP FOR '99 SALE

The California Thoroughbred Breeders Association and Hollywood Park, Inc., have joined forces and will hold a 1999 Select California-bred Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale. The sale will be held at Hollywood Park the Tuesday following the April 6 Santa Anita Derby with a preview to be held that Monday. CTBA Sales expects to catalog between 30-50 select California-bred two-year-olds in April 1999. "A two-year-old sale of this caliber will complement our Del Mar Yearling Sale, which has shown new-found promise the last few years," said CTBA General Manager Doug Burge. "Hollywood Park has gone out of its way to make us feel at home there. We hope this is the beginning of a long and productive collaboration."

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

HAL'S PAL (GB) (h, 5, Caerleon--Refinancing, by *Forli)

Since the advent of all-weather racing in England, it has become clear that some European horses prefer the dirt to the turf. A recent example of that phenomenon is Hal's Pal. Hal's Pal failed to win in 12 starts on the turf in England, but was three-for-three on the dirt. That preference for dirt has been maintained since Hal's Pal came to North America, and on Saturday he broke his stakes maiden with a decisive victory in the GII San Pasqual H.

Hal's Pal is the first stakes winner to be sired by Caerleon out of a Forli mare, but Caerleon has sired at least six earlier stakes winners out of mares by sons of Forli. These include the Group 1 winners In a Tiff and Welsh Guide, Japanese Champion Shinko Lovely, 1997 California graded stakes winner Pinfloron and Welsh Muffin, who is also dam of current Japanese star Taiki Shuttle.

The comparison between the pedigree of Hal's Pal and Shinko Lovely is particularly interesting. Recognized as one of the best fillies to race in Japan in recent years, Shinko Lovely is out of a mare by the good miler Posse (Forli-In Hot Pursuit, by Bold Ruler). Since Hal's Pal's dam Refinancing is by Forli out of a daughter of In Hot Pursuit, she is three-parts sister to Posse.

Is there any reason for a Caerleon/Forli affinity? If there is, it may reside in the background of Caerleon's broodmare sire Round Table and Forli. Both have Papyrus close up and while Round Table traces to the renowned tap-root Aloe, Forli has Aloe's brother Foxlaw. For good measure, Forli is inbred to Lady Juror, a genetic relative to Aloe and Foxlaw.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

The Count Fleet S. at Aqueduct Saturday was taken by **Classic Time** (c, 3, **Sky Classic--Cecelia Tudor**, by **Chief's Crown**), who, despite racing for only the third time in his life, won as if he may have a very serious future. If that future includes a Kentucky Derby start, it will be appropriate, as Classic Time is linebred to Kentucky Derby winner Swaps and his full sister Track Medal. In both cases, the Swaps is combined with Princequillo, as Sky Classic's granddam is by Outing Class (dam Track Medal) out of a Princequillo mare and Classic Time's third dam, Celia, is by Swaps out of a daughter of a Princequillo mare.

1997 FRESHMAN SIRE WRAP-UP

At the beginning of each two-year-old racing season, the *Thoroughbred Daily News* asks a panel of experts in the bloodstock industry to predict which freshman sires will top the charts. Our 1995 winner was *Daily Racing Form* Bloodstock Editor Sid Fernando, who correctly chose Farma Way. In 1996, trainer John Kimmel and bloodstock analyst Alan Porter were the co-victors with their pick of Salt Lake. To prove that history repeats itself, the talented trio of Fernando, Kimmel and Porter were at it again in 1997 as our only three panelists to correctly tab Gilded Time as the year's leading first-crop sire!

Upon being informed of his victory for the second year in a row, Kimmel explained his logic in choosing Gilded Time: "After having inspected a lot of the Gilded Times at the sales and knowing what kind of sprinter he was as a racehorse, I felt his offspring would show the precocity which is needed to be a top freshman sire."

Added Porter, "Having predicted Gilded Time, you'd have to be pleased that he did come through. He's already had a graded stakes winner in 1998 (Time Limit, GIII Spectacular Bid S.) and there's an awful lot of his first crop left to run, so the best might still be to come. It's nice to have something other than a Northern Dancer or Mr. Prospector-line horse at the top."

Fernando, back on top after a one-year hiatus, said, "Gilded Time was a precocious racehorse and an outstanding physical specimen standing at the right farm. He was much easier to pick than Farma Way, whom I picked in 1995."

A son of Timeless Moment--Gilded Lilly (What a Pleasure), Gilded Time was the undefeated Champion Two-Year-Old of 1992 whose wins included the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, GII Arlington-Washington Futurity and GII Sapling S. His best runners in 1997 were Tremont S. and Count Turf S. winner Time Limit and Old Topper, who took the GIII Best Pal S. at Del Mar. Gilded Time stands at Vinery in Midway, Kentucky for a 1998 stud fee of \$30,000 live foal.

Japanese graded stakes winner **Super Nakayama (c, 4, Jolie's Halo-Saratoga Girl, by Saratoga Six)**, who took Saturday's Garnet S. (G3-Jpn), has a rather interesting pattern in his pedigree. His grandsire Halo and his granddam Glass Collector are genetic relatives.
