**NUMBERS UP AT KEENELAND JANUARY** Yesterday's third session of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington, Kentucky registered gains across the board from the corresponding 1997 session. Keeneland sold 252 horses Wednesday, for a total of \$5,025,700. That is up 47.3 percent from last year's third session when 259 horses sold for \$3,412,200. The average rose 51.4 percent, from \$13,175 a year ago to \$19,943 in 1998. The median price of \$11,500 marked a 43.8-percent increase from last year's figure of \$8,000. Top price at yesterday's session was paid for hip number 790, **Trouble Woman** (Dayjur). Sold as a racing or broodmare prospect, the four-year-old filly is a half sister to 1988 Kentucky Derby winner **Winning Colors** (Caro {Ire}). Consigned by Cantium Bloodstock, agent, **Trouble Woman** brought a final bid of \$310,000 from Gooree Pastoral Co. Hip number 1003 was the session's highest priced yearling. The bay colt by Mr. Greeley-Permissive (Wardlaw) was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent LIX and was sold for \$100,000 to Chestnut Valley Farm. Through the first three days of the five-day sale, 721 horses have been sold for an aggregate of \$48,332,300, an average of \$67,035 and a median price of \$20,000. The sale continues today at 10 a.m. and concludes Friday.

**NJ RACING STUDY RESULTS** A report scheduled to be issued tomorrow by The New Jersey Industry Study Commission will recommend several major changes to the structure of racing in the Garden State, including the advent of OTBs and phone betting. Many of the changes proposed in the long-awaited commission report are expected to be formulated into legislation, which, if passed, could be put on the ballot as early as this November. If approved by the voters, OTBs could pop up in New Jersey in the near future. The commission did not recommend legalizing slot machines at the state's tracks. Other recommendations listed in the report include; considering closing live racing operations that are no longer viable, providing an additional \$25 million a year for purses and revenues, fixed odds and proposition wagering, allowing tracks to reduce takeout, providing state sponsored marketing expenditures for tourism that includes racing. "New Jersey racetracks need regulations which will level the competitive playing field," the report reads. "In the decade of the 1990s New Jersey has fallen behind the competitive curve due to aggressive legislation and regulatory action in our neighbor states of Delaware, New York and Pennsylvania."

**COOKSEY REACHES 2,000 WINS** Jockey Patricia Cooksey raced into the record books Wednesday night when she guided Noble Annie to a five-length victory in the 2<sup>nd</sup> race at Turfway Park. With the win, Cooksey became only the second female rider in racing history, behind only Julie Krone, to reach the 2,000-win milestone. When asked about the accomplishment, the rider said, "Well, it's out of about 18,000 mounts and that's a lot of circles. I think it's significant for any jockey, male or female. I'll ride for as long as I stay healthy and we'll go for 3,000."

**EXPECTATIONS HIGH FOR SPORTSMAN'S MEET** Sportsman's Park's promising 1998 season opens March 1 and the track has pledged to offer more than \$200,000 in daily purses. Stall applications for more than 3,000 horses were received by the January 8 filing deadline. "Because of our firm commitment to higher purses in the coming year, the nation's racing community has responded overwhelmingly by filing a record number of stall applications with us," Eddie Arroyo, general manger for the National Jockey Club said. "We are extremely pleased, not only with the continued support of those who have raced with us in the past, but also the list of owners and trainers who have not raced with us before. The strength of our first condition book and the purse structure it offers, along with our \$2 million stakes program, speaks for itself." The 17-event stakes schedule is highlighted by the prestigious "Million Dollar Trio" of graded stakes: the \$500,000 GII Illinois Derby (May 10), the \$300,000 GIII Sixty Sails H. (May 3) and the \$200,000 GIII National Jockey Club H. (May 23). The 105-day meeting will run through June 30.

## WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

### PEDIGREE SHORTS

Young sire Personal Hope was represented by a Japanese graded stakes winner when **Mandarin Star** (c, 3, **Personal Hope-Twofold**, by **Timeless Moment**) captured Sunday's Keisei Hai (G3-Jpn). This represents the cross of a Storm Bird son with a Damascus-line mare, a combination which has produced at least five earlier stakes winners—four by Storm Cat—including Breeders' Cup Sprint heroine Desert Stormer and Sir Cat, whose retirement to Gainesway Farm for the 1998 breeding season has just been announced. We suggest the key is the duplication of the influential Sun Again, who appears as the sire of the third dam of Storm Bird and in the male line of Damascus. Sun Again seems to be duplicated in pedigrees of stakes winners far more often than he should be by chance.
