BAFFERT NAMED BIG SPORT OF TURFDOM

Eclipse Award-winning conditioner Bob Baffert has been named the 1997 Big Sport of Turfdom by the Turf Publicists of America. The TPA consists of approximately 130 Thoroughbred racing publicists and marketing executives from around the country and has presented the Big Sport of Turfdom Award for the past 31 years to an individual whose cooperation with the media and those who promote racing has enhanced coverage of the sport. "With the intense glare of the national media spotlight focused squarely on him, Bob Baffert always found time to accommodate the press," said TPA President Dan Metzger. "His keen sense of humor throughout the Triple Crown campaign was eclipsed only by his graciousness when Silver Charm was defeated in the Belmont S. and he epitomizes what the Big Sport of Turfdom Award stands for." Baffert will receive the award on Tuesday, February 10 during a luncheon at Bighorn Golf Club in Palm Desert, California. "I try to promote racing as much as I can," Baffert said. "And when you have a 'big horse' like Silver Charm, it gives you a chance to give something back to the game. Winning the Eclipse Award and the Big Sport of Turfdom is very overwhelming to me and it's quite an honor."

MINI SERIES TOPS KEENELAND THURSDAY

Mini Series (Theatrical {Ire}), an unraced four-year-old filly in foal to Diablo, attracted a bid of \$265,000 to top Thursday's session of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington. The bay, a half-sister to three stakes winners including MGSW Possible Mate (King's Bishop), was consigned by Denali Stud (Craig Bandoroff), Agent XX, and purchased by Darby Dan Bloodstock. A total of 241 horses grossed \$3,140,400 yesterday, up 36.2 percent over 1997; the average of \$13,031 was up 27.7 percent from a year ago. Thursday's median price was \$7,000, up 34.6 percent. Last year's corresponding session saw 226 horses sell for \$2,305,400, an average of \$10,201 and a median of \$5,200. The five-day Keeneland January Sale concludes today.

WRITERS UP

AT THE JANUARY SALE...with Bill Oppenheim

There are significant number of people (this writer among them) who think the Claiborne family tracing to the Gold Bridge mare *Rough Shod II is just about the best ever seen in America. Apalachee, King Pellinore, Mocassin and Thatch were its best-known representatives 20 years ago, but more recently it's better known for Thatch's full sister, Special, dam of Nureyev and granddam of Sadler's Wells. There were five female representatives from that family, if my calculations are correct, in the Claiborne-Gorman dispersal at Keeneland on Tuesday. Of the five--which included the consignment's three \$2-million plus horses--four were bought by Coolmore "names," and in all four cases it was the farm that stands Sadler's Wells outbidding the family that raced Nureyev...not much doubt in those camps about the *Rough Shod family's value.

The four were hip 657, the \$3.4-million Seeking the Gold--Number two-year-old; hip 491, Bound (\$2.2 million); the yearling full sister to hip 657 (hip 658, \$1 million); and Bound's yearling daughter by Nashwan (hip 492, \$925,000). The one that got away was hip 626, Limit. The sale's second highest-priced horse, she sold for \$2.5 million to previous Claiborne client Adele Dilschneider. The Coolmore contingent bought eight of the consignment's 34 horses, spending just under \$8.8 million, over 40 percent of the dispersal's total.

It wasn't just the Coolmore names who were there, either: lots of names turned up, and when the smoke cleared, the buyers' list was pretty impressive--Will Farish, Ned Evans, the Niarchos family, Chrys O'Reilly, Cheveley Park Stud, Ed Cox, Robert Nataf, Angus Glen Farm, Bill Mott x 3...few buyers one hadn't heard of.

Not among the buyers: Satish Sanan. His man Warren Evans was sighted on Sunday, but had left town before Tuesday, we believe...

This sale was significant in two important ways: it shows just how much people are prepared to spend for the "real deal," and it tends to validate the value of the few thousand with pedigrees that aren't quite as mouth-watering who came up for sale in 1997. There are plenty of factors the horse business only reacts to, and it's anybody's guess right now what the economic turmoil in Asia will mean to the horse market for the rest of 1998. One thing we can be certain of after Tuesday: Quality Always Sells. And the real quality, right now, is worth really big money. Monster sale.

Martiniquais (Ire) (Simply Great {Fr}), winner of the GII San Gabriel H., worked five furlongs in 1:01 Thursday at Hollywood Park. Also breezing for the San Marcos, **MSW Big Sky Chester** (Afleet) went the same distance in 1:00 4/5 at Hollywood. Peruvian champ **Fregy's** (Combsway), second in the Ack Ack H. on the dirt in his U.S. debut December 27, will return to the turf for the San Marcos. The six-year-old ended his South American campaign with a victory in Argentina's 1996 G1 Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini at a mile and a half on the grass. He was off for 11 months before his first State-side start. "It's been tough getting him ready the past year," said his trainer, Eduardo Inda. "He had a couple of quarter cracks on both his hind feet. He actually came with a quarter crack on his right front when he came from South America. We knew he'd have some problems, but when we began training him, he got a couple more. The feet look good right now. He looks like he's going to be a nice horse."

The New York Turf Writer's Association has named **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) the winner of the 1997 C. V. "Sonny" Whitney Achievement Award for his performance in last year's Triple Crown. Fellow Eclipse Champion **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) was voted winner of the Secretariat Award as New York's 1997 Horse of the Year. The NYTWA voted Silver Charm and his connections the winners of its John A. Morris Award as the individuals who did the most for racing in 1997. Trainer Pat Byrne was a runaway winner of the Fourstardave Award, given for special achievement at Saratoga. Byrne won all but one of the graded stakes for two-year-olds at the Spa. Two-year-old champion **Favorite Trick's** (Phone Trick) owner Joseph LaCombe was voted the group's Outstanding Owner for 1997. Gasper Moschera and John Kimmel were elected co-recipients of the Outstanding Trainer award and Jorge Chavez was voted Outstanding Jockey. New York Racing Association Recreation Director Nick Caras was voted winner of the "Red" Smith Good Guy Award for his contributions to the NYRA backstretch.

Maybe Jack (Classic Account), who earned the title as the nation's winningest horse in 1997, will make his first start of 1998 in Friday's sixth race at Aqueduct, a \$60,000 claimer going nine furlongs. The five-year-old got his 13th victory last season in a match race against Pro On Ice at Suffolk Downs December 14. "He fits, but that's a salty group," said owner John F. Four broodmares, all of them in foal, and a gelding were killed in a barn fire at Summer Wind Farm near Georgetown, Kentucky early Wednesday morning. A night watchman was able to rescue several horses housed in the barn, which Summer Wind leases to Twin Spires Inc., a breeding and sales company. The names of the five horses killed were not released. Summer Wind is home to the dams of 1997 champions and Horse of the Year candidates Skip Away and Favorite Trick--Ingot Way and Evil Elaine, respectively--but no Summer Wind horses were stabled in the barn which burned. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

Exotic Wood (Rahy), fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint last out, zipped seven furlongs in a bullet 1:25 2/5 with jockey Chris McCarron aboard yesterday. The six-year-old mare is being pointed for what may be her final career start in the GI Santa Monica H. January 24.

Three-year-olds working Thursday included **Artax** (Marquetry), runner-up in the GI Hollywood Futurity and most recently in an allowance test January 2. The colt went a half in :47 3/5 for the Santa Catalina S. February 1. Santa Catalina hopeful **Orville N Wilbur's** (Out of Place), two-for-three lifetime with an allowance score December 11, breezed seven-eighths in 1:25 4/5.
