COX'S RIDGE DEAD Cox's Ridge (Best Turn), an 11-time stakes winner who captured the 1978 GI Met Mile and went on to sire champions Cardmania, Life's Magic and Vanlandingham, was euthanized at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky January 14 due to the infirmities of old age. The stallion, pensioned last August after serving his entire stud career at Claiborne, was 24. Cox's Ridge, who won 16 of his 28 career starts and bankrolled \$667,172, sired 45 stakes winners and the earners of more than \$35 million from his 15 crops to race so far. His Grade I winners include millionaires Sultry Song, De Roche and Lost Mountain, as well as Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine Twilight Ridge.

FORTY NINER MARE TOPS OBS OPENER

Chardae (Forty Niner), a six-year-old broodmare in foal to Tabasco Cat, topped the opening session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Winter Mixed Sale yesterday in Ocala, Florida. Consigned by Cantium Bloodstock, agent, the mare was purchased for \$120,000 by Peter Vegso Racing. The second highest bid Monday came in for the eight-year-old broodmare **Striking Broad** (Broad Brush), in foal to Dehere. Consigned by Bridlewood Farm, agent, the dark bay brought \$100,000 from Jacks or Better Farm. The top-priced yearling at the session was a daughter of Out of Place out of stakes-placed Max Donnell (Critique). The half-sister to multiple stakes winner Supah Jess (On to Glory), consigned by Johnson Hollow Farm (Dean and Peggy Johnson), Agent XVI, was purchased for \$52,000 by Volar Corp. A total of 247 horses grossed \$3,187,700 during Monday's opening session, up 26 percent from last year's corresponding session when 188 hips brought \$2,524,400. The 1998 opening-day average of \$12,906 was down just 3.8 percent from the 1997 figure of \$13,428. Buybacks were at 22 percent, the same as a year ago. "We're glad to see such a steady market despite selling so many more horses in the first session," said OBS Director of Sales Tom Ventura. "The opening session was especially well attended despite some threatening weather early (Monday) morning, and there are a lot of new names among the buyers on the results sheet. It's good to see so many new faces along with our regular customers." The Winter Mixed Sale continues today at 10 a.m., with the first of two open sessions. A listed stakes winner in England, Prize Giving (GB) had been off the board in four of his five starts since shipping across the Atlantic, breaking through with a win in the Political Ambition H. November 22 in his only try at this distance in this country. A good fourth in the GII San Gabriel H. at a mile and an eighth in his latest December 28, the chestnut was co-second choice; last after six furlongs in 1:14 2/5, he came with a three-wide move on the final bend and outfinished Bienvenido (Arg), runner-up in the San Gabriel, for his first-ever graded score. "He trained up to this race very well," said his conditioner, Neil Drysdale. "He was feeling very well coming into this race. He could be possible for the San Luis Obispo (GII, 1 1/2 miles, Feb. 16). After today, I don't see why he wouldn't go a mile and a half, because he settled very well." Agreed winning jockey Alex Solis, "He was very relaxed. He was very easy to handle today. He seems like he can go any distance." The 7-5 choice, San Gabriel victor Martiniquais (Ire) was checked the first time through the stretch, came with his bid to put a head in front at the top of the stretch the second time, but could not hold off the top two finishers.

TYCOON LIL TAKES NEW ZEALAND OAKS

Three-year-old **Tycoon Lil (NZ)** (Last Tycoon {Ire}) confirmed her status as the leader of her division with a win in Saturday's G1 \$145,680 New Zealand Oaks over a mile and a half at Trentham in Wellington. She becomes the sixth filly to complete the New Zealand One Thousand Guineas--New Zealand Oaks "double." Trained by Colin Jillings, Tycoon Lil skated home by four lengths and will now attempt a unique treble, with her trainer aiming her at the G1 AJC Oaks, also over a mile and a half, in Sydney on April 18. Longer term, Jillings is also contemplating aiming his champion filly at Australia's premier weight-for-age race, the G1 Cox Plate at Moonee Valley in Melbourne at the end of October. "I think it would be an ideal race for her," said Jillings, who won the race with The Phantom Chance (NZ) in 1993.

First or second in four-of-five prior turf tries, Quick Lap started this campaign with a second-place finish in the Tropical Park Oaks on the grass at Calder January 1. Sent off the choice here after the morning-line favorite, Tropical Park Oaks winner To Be Approved, was scratched, the Texas-bred sat near the back of the pack for a half but moved up steadily to be a factor as they headed into the stretch and finished well to get up in the final jump. "She likes to come from off the pace. Pat Day's ridden her before, and he says you have to time her move just right. I think he timed it a little too close for my liking," laughed trainer Neil Howard, adding, "She's a real honest filly. She deserved that. She gives 100 percent every time."

9th-GPX, \$29,000, **Alw**, 4yo/up, f/m, 7f, 1:24, ft. **SILVER WIRE** (f, 4, **Distinctive Pro--Loose Wire**, by **Ruritanian**) had never finished off the board in three previous tries at Gulfstream and was bet down to 6-5 despite coming off a seven-month layoff here. Making her first appearance since running fifth in the restricted **Bouwerie S.** at Belmont June 18, the grey filly was never far from the lead, took command at the top of the lane and strode under the wire 4 1/2 lengths to the good.
