FIRST FOAL FOR LIT DE JUSTICE The first foal sired by Eclipse champion Lit de Justice (El Gran Senor) was born January 13 at Adena Springs Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. The bay filly, out of Hickory Crest (Caro {Ire}), is owned by Stronach Stables. "His early foals are very nice," Dan Hall, general manager at Adena Springs, said. "His foal out of Hickory Crest is extremely nice." Lit de Justice was named Champion Sprinter of 1996 after a campaign in which he won four stakes races, culminating with a victory in the Breeders' Cup Sprint. Lit de Justice, who began his career in France, retired with a record of 10 wins from 36 starts and earnings of \$1,397,874. The eight-year-old stallion will stand the 1998 breeding season at Adena Springs for a fee of \$20,000 live foal. "We are very much excited about his future," Hall said. "He was bred to 87 mares last year. We support him with a good book of mares, and he gets a lot of outside support."

NEW ZEALAND SALE POSTS INCREASES On the third day of the National Premier Yearling Sale at Karaka in New Zealand, two fillies shared the top price of \$203,844. Australian trainer Bart Cummings paid that price for a daughter of Danehill--Vocation (NZ) (Sovereign Edition {Ire}) and Randwick Bloodstock Agency bought the filly by Maroof--Sparkle 'N Shine (by Filiberto). Over the three days of the sale, 398 yearlings were sold for an aggregate of \$27,557,643, up 50 percent from the 1997 figure of \$18,360,376 when 360 lots were sold. The average of \$69,462 was up 35 percent from the 1997 figure of \$51,452. "It's a hell of an increase," said sales company representative Peter Vela. "It exceeded our expectations. I thought the average price could have gone to \$64,048. To go to \$69,462 is absolutely wonderful." Vela also thought the New Zealand bloodstock industry was still only just starting its rejuvenation. "There are an awful lot of international mares which have been imported into the country which are not yet reflected in our catalogues," he said. One yearling which failed to sell was the half brother (by Casual Lies) to last year's Melbourne Cup winner **Might And Power (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}). Windsor Park Stud offered the colt, who is out of the mare Benediction (Ire), and lodged a reserve of \$170,794, but bidding only reached \$153,714 and he was passed in. There was no news as to the colt's future.

NTRA & TVG SIGN AGREEMENT The National Thoroughbred Racing Association and the Television Games Network announced yesterday the signing of a letter of intent for a comprehensive five-year membership, sponsorship and development agreement which aligns important future efforts of two of the racing industry's newest business entities. The agreement calls for TVG, the Broomfield, Colorado-based interactive home entertainment and wagering network scheduled to debut November 1998, to become a "special member" and top tier sponsor of NTRA and for NTRA to lend its support to TVG's market development initiatives. At the same time, the two entities will match annual contributions to a joint five-year national legislative fund dedicated to making account (home) wagering legal in new states. The dollar value of TVG's commitment to NTRA, including its share of the legislative fund, is estimated at approximately \$15 million over five years, and possibly as much as \$30 million if mutually beneficial milestones are hit. "We are extremely pleased to enter into this partnership with the Television Games Network," commented NTRA Chief Executive Officer D. G. Van Clief, Jr. "TVG and its business partners recently have made exceptional progress. The new relationship between NTRA and TVG is an exciting and important step toward an integrated national television presence for our sport." The network's President Mark Brenner added, "We at TVG are honored and happy to be the first to sign a major sponsorship agreement with NTRA. The agreement reflects our respect for NTRA as a vital new national horse racing organization, and the fact that we share a vision of how racing can be carried to millions of people in their homes in the immediate future." TVG has secured exclusive commitments from many of America's major tracks, including Churchill Downs, Hollywood Park, Gulfstream Park, Laurel Park, Pimlico, Lone Star Park, Santa Anita and Turfway Park, to develop and distribute a premier package of racing-based entertainment programming and wagering. The agreement is subject to final drafting and approval of the NTRA Board of Directors and TVG principals.

REGAL DISCOVERY RETIRED TO STUD Regal Discovery (Regal Classic--Royal Discovery {Tom Tulle}), winner of the 1995 Queen's Plate, has been retired and will enter stud in 1998 at Pleasant Valley Farm in Goshen, New York. The Canadian-bred six-year-old, who finished second in the 1995 Prince of Wales S. and GI Molson Export Million, retires with a race record of 25-5-3-4 and earnings of \$652,843. He will stand for a 1998 stud fee of \$3,000.
