ECLIPSE CHAMPS TOP EXPERIMENTAL

Eclipse Award winners **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick) and **Countess Diana** (Deerhound), both trained by Patrick Byrne last year, have been assigned top weights of 128 and 125 pounds, respectively, in their divisions of the 1997 Experimental Free Handicap. This marks the first time since The Jockey Club began weighting colts and fillies separately in 1985 that the leaders in both categories were ranked above the heavyweight's standard assignment of 126 pounds for colts and 123 pounds for fillies. First published in 1933, the Experimental Free Handicap is based on a hypothetical race at a mile and a sixteenth on the dirt. This year's Handicap committee of racing secretaries included Howard Battle of Keeneland and Saratoga, Michael Lakow of Aqueduct and Belmont Park and Thomas Robbins of Santa Anita and Del Mar. The committee weighted 84 colts and geldings and 88 fillies. To be eligible, a two-year-old of 1997 had to finish in the first four in a graded stakes or other unrestricted stakes with an added value of \$50,000 or more in the continental United States. Undefeated **Favorite Trick**, eight-for-eight as a juvenile, capped his campaign with an impressive 5 1/2-length victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He was weighted five pounds higher than MGISW **Grand Slam** (Gone West), and two higher than the 1996 top weight, Boston Harbor. **Countess Diana**, five-for-six on the season, captured the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies by an eye-catching 8 1/2 lengths. The 125 pounds she received on this year's Experimental was the second highest ever assigned a filly, behind only **First Flight**, who was weighted at 126 in 1946. **Silver Maiden** (Silver Buck), undefeated at two, was second among fillies at 122 pounds. Carson City led all sires with six representatives on the 1997 Experimental Handicap, one colt and a division-high five fillies. Cryptoclearance had the most colts on the Handicap with three. Of the 172 juveniles weighted, 89 were bred in Kentucky, 37 in Florida and 11 in California.

COUNTESS DIANA TO MOTT Bill Mott has been named the new trainer of Eclipse Award winner **Countess Diana** (Deerhound), owners Rick and Nancy Kaster have announced. Countess Diana was scheduled to arrive at Mott's Payson Park stable yesterday, where she will be reunited with fellow champion Favorite Trick. Both were trained last year by Pat Byrne, who dispersed his stable to take a private job with owner Frank Stronach. Mott also picked up the Kaster's MGSW **Richter Scale** (*Habitony). "Countess Diana and Favorite Trick were really good friends, so it was a logical choice," joked Rick Kaster. "Mott's a great trainer. We thought as long as he was up to the challenge of one champion (Favorite Trick), we thought we might as well really have some pressure. I talked to Mr. (Joseph) LaCombe after Favorite Trick had been with Bill for a couple of weeks. If you talk to anyone (about trainers), Bill's name always comes up. He's on top of everyone's list." Kaster said he expects his filly to be back in action around April. She was sidelined after the Breeders' Cup to have a chip removed from her knee.

FOUR "DUAL QUALIFIERS" ON '97

EXPERIMENTAL Favorite Trick (Phone Trick) was assigned top weight of 128 pounds among two-year-old males rated on the annual Experimental Handicap, but is not among the four "dual qualifiers" under the system that has predicted so many recent Kentucky Derby winners. Dual qualifiers are horses with a Dosage Index of 4.0 or under who are also weighted within 10 pounds of the top horse on the Experimental. Since implemented in 1984, nine Derby winners have been on the short list of dual qualifiers. Favorite Trick does not qualify due to a Dosage Index of 4.60. The dual qualifiers for this year's Derby are **Grand Slam** (Gone West), **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner), **Lil's Lad** (Pine Bluff) and **Souvenir Copy** (Mr. Prospector). **K.O. Punch** (Two Punch) and **Time Limit** (Gilded Time), both of whom were weighted at 118 pounds, are also disqualified on the Dosage Index criteria.

HELISSIO TO SHUTTLE TO AUSTRALIA European champ **Helissio (Fr)** (Fairy King), the 1996 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner, will stand the 1998 Southern Hemisphere breeding season in Australia. The five-year-old, who captured eight of 13 starts and earned \$1,996,227, will stand at Widden Stud in the Hunter Valley for a fee of \$18,315, and will cover a book of 70 mares. Helissio will be shipped from his current base at Japan's Shadai Stallion Station in August.

FAVORITE TRICK BACK ON WORK TAB Horse of the Year finalist **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick) had his first work of the year at Payson Park yesterday, according to the *Daily Racing Form*. The Eclipse winner, who could make his three-year-old debut in the Gill Swale S. at Gulfstream Park March 14, went three furlongs in an easy :39 4/5. "We had him with another horse, and they went along nice and easy together," new trainer Bill Mott told the *Form*. "He did everything smoothly and was in hand the whole way."

DANCE DESIGN HEADED TO DUBAI WORLD CUP Satish Sanan, the Florida-based Indian computer tycoon, is targeting the \$4-million Dubai World Cup for his world-record purchase **Dance Design (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). The five-year-old mare cost 2.5 million guineas (\$4,425,000) at the 1997 Tattersalls December Sales in Newmarket, England. The filly's trainer, Dermot Weld, said, "We've already entered her for the race and she has been out in Dubai for a couple of weeks. It all depends on how she handles the sand as to whether she runs. She has settled in and seems in great form." A champion at two and four in Ireland, Dance Design finished 11th in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf in her last start November 8.

MONDAY MORNING SCARE FOR TALE OF THE CAT Tale of the Cat (Storm Cat), who looked good working a half-mile in :48 3/5 at Gulfstream yesterday morning, came up lame while cooling out after the breeze, but apparently the injury was not serious. Trainer John Forbes reported that X-rays proved negative and his colt is still on track to make his four-year-old bow in the March 14 GIII Creme Fraiche H. at Gulfstream. "He must have stepped on a nail or something," said Forbes. "He took some funny steps, but was then all right. We tried to find something wrong, but couldn't." The colt, three-for-five lifetime with a win in the GII King's Bishop S., has been out of action since running third in the GI Vosburgh S. last September 27.

FASIG-TIPTON MIDLANTIC WINTER MIXED

RESULTS Check Out the Flag (Stalwart), an eight-year-old broodmare in foal to freshman stallion Dehere, brought a final bid of \$72,000 to top Sunday's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Winter Mixed Sale in Timonium, Maryland. Consigned by Blue Ridge Farm, agent, the mare, an unraced half-sister to GISW Mahogany Hall (Woodman), was purchased by Caroline Stautberg. A total of 180 hips grossed \$904,400 Sunday, an average of \$5,024. The results were down sharply from last year's lucrative event which saw the gross rise 250 percent and the average increase 135 percent. During the 1997 auction, 201 horses brought a total of \$2,262,000, an average of \$11,254. "A big chunk of (the '97 gross) was from the Austin Taylor dispersal," said Fasig-Tipton Executive Vice President Boyd Browning Jr. "Last year, the Austin Taylor dispersal had 17 horses which sold for \$449,500. In addition, we had about 50 horses which were sold to dissolve a partnership that averaged over \$15,000. The '98 results were more in line with what we traditionally expect at the Midlantic Winter Mixed Sale. It was an amazing crowd. The sellers were very pleased with the prices. I just wish we'd had a few more horses to sell."
