CAERLEON DEAD **Caerleon** (Nijinsky II), one of the top sires in the world, died from a suspected heart attack at Coolmore Stud in Co. Tipperary, Ireland Monday night. During his racing career, Caerleon was named champion three-year-old colt of 1983 in France after winning that year's G1 Prix du Jockey Club. Caerleon quickly established himself as a top stallion, producing 1991 Epsom and Irish Derby winner **Generous (Ire)**, 1994 G1 St. Leger and G1 Prix Royal-Oak winner **Moonax (Ire)**, 1993 G1 Yorkshire Oaks winner **Only Royale (Ire)** and 1996 G1 Vodafone Oaks winner **Lady Carla (GB)**. The 18-year-old sired Japanese champions **Shinko Lovely (Ire)**, **L-Way Win (Ire)** and **Biwa Heidi (Jpn)** and Japanese Derby winner **Fusaichi Concorde (Jpn)**. Caerleon's American graded stakes winners include **Kostroma (Ire)**, **Auriette (Ire)**, **Missionary Ridge (GB)**, **Pinfloron (Fr)** and **Overbury (Ire)**. From 11 crops to race, Caerleon's progeny has earned over \$46 million and the stallion has been represented by 74 stakes winners. His place at Coolmore will eventually be taken by last year's Prix du Jockey-Club winner **Peintre Celebre** (Nureyev).

FALL ASPEN DIES **Fall Aspen** (Pretense), named Broodmare of the Year in 1994, died at Creekview Farm in Paris, Kentucky yesterday. The 22-year-old mare hemorrhaged after producing a colt by champion Thunder Gulch Monday. The death was the second major loss for Coolmore Stud, after the farm's stallion Caerleon died Monday in Ireland. John Magnier purchased the dam of 1994's Champion Two-Year-Old **Timber Country** (Woodman) at the 1994 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale for \$2.4 million. A Grade I winner during her racing career, Fall Aspen is also the dam of graded or group stakes winners **Northern Aspen** (Northern Dancer), **Elle Seule** (Exclusive Native), **Mazzacano (GB)** (Alleged), **Colorado Dancer (Ire)** (Shareef Dancer) and **Hamas** (Danzig). Fall Aspen's last foal is doing well.

RECORDS FALL AT OBS-CALDER A colt by Prospectors Gamble--Society Gal (Linkage) brought a final bid of \$430,000 to establish a new sales record at the Ocala Sale's Company's Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training at Calder Race Course Tuesday. Selling as hip number 125, the chestnut two-year-old, consigned by Wavertree Stables, Agent I and purchased by The Thoroughbred Corp., eclipsed the old mark of \$360,000. The colt, a full brother to MGSP **Jigadee**, posted the fastest quarter mile of Sunday's Under Tack Show, working the distance in :22 2/5. He worked an eighth of a mile in :10 2/5 in Tuesday's preview. Hip number 161, **Winewomenandsong** (Sultry Song--Wine Taster (Nodouble) recorded the fastest quarter mile in the preview (:21 4/5), and brought the second highest price of the sale. The bay colt, consigned by Donna M. Wormser, Inc., agent, was purchased for \$375,000 by Aaron Jones. In all, 153 two-year-olds sold for an aggregate of \$12,564,000--up 20.5 percent from last year's figure of \$10,428,000, grossed from the sale of the same number of horses. The average price was a record \$82,118, an increase of 20 percent from last year's record \$68,157. The median price of \$64,000 marked a 23-percent increase over last year's \$52,000. Thirty four horses sold of \$100,000 or more during the session and 11 brought prices of \$200,000 or more.

FLORIDA TRACKS HIT HARD BY STORM Three Florida tracks suffered damage when an intense storm passed through the state, dumping from four to 10 inches of rain and bringing winds up to 105 miles per hour. Hialeah Race Track in Hialeah, Florida suffered major damage when a tornado ripped through South Florida Monday night between 7:30 and 8:00. The storm left debris scattered on the track and forced the suspension of training Tuesday morning. "I have to see how the clean-up goes before we decide whether we can open the track tomorrow (Wednesday); we'll definitely be open the next day," said the track's Vice President and General Manager Mike Mackey. No horses or people were injured in the storm and there was no serious damage to the building or stables, but trees were uprooted from the driveway to the clubhouse and around the backstretch. Gulfstream Park in Hallandale, Florida suffered water damage on the backside. Barns one through 17, occupied by trainers Bill Mott, D. Wayne Lukas, Neil Howard and Shug McGaughey, were surrounded by water and trainers couldn't get their horses out of the stalls to walk them, let alone take them to the track. Trainer Sonny Hine, hardest hit of all, had to empty his stalls of hay and couldn't replace it because the water kept sweeping in. "I was able to get Skip Away to the track to jog him, and he's walking up and down in front of the shedrow just to keep him busy," Hine said of his champion charge. At Calder Race Course in Miami, track President Ken Dunn said the property suffered some tree damage and one barn had one-third of its roof ripped off.

K.O. PUNCH RETIRED K.O. Punch (Two Punch) has been retired from racing and will stand the 1998 breeding season at Margaux Farm, in Midway, Kentucky for a stud fee of \$5,000. The bay three-year-old colt captured last year's Gill Hollywood Juvenile Championship and ran second behind champion Favorite Trick in the GI Hopeful. In his last race, K.O. Punch suffered a condylar fracture while running second in the GI Futurity at Belmont September 21. Never off the board in six starts, he retires with earnings of \$212,870.

RECORD GROSS FOR TRF AUCTION Topped by a successful bid of \$49,000 for a no-guarantee season to Wild Again and a record \$8,000 bid for two antique oak chairs with cushions hand-embroidered by Mrs. Richard du Pont, the eighth annual Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation Charity Stallion Season Auction at CandyLand Farm in Middletown, Delaware, raised a record of approximately \$500,000 for the TRF and Thoroughbred Charities of America. The January 31st event attracted 300 people from across the country to a combined live and silent auction of stallion seasons, equine and other artwork, plus Thoroughbred memorabilia and gifts. Hundreds of others bid by telephone for dozens of other seasons during a five-day preliminary auction. Purchased by Maryland veterinarian Dr. Michael Cavey, the Wild Again season was one of two no-guarantee seasons to go over the \$40,000 mark. Owner/breeder Robert Manfuso was the successful bidder, at \$41,000, for a season to Dixieland Band. "It will still be a few days before all the final bids are tallied and the accounting completed, but we are thrilled that this event has once again proven to be so successful--and that is directly attributable to the generosity of the stallion managers who donate these seasons," said CandyLand owner Herbert Moelis. "There are so many worthy equine causes, many of them very small operations, which very much need our support, and it is heartwarming that so many of those who love the horse have continued to show their generosity by supporting this event."

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

UANME (f, 3, Marquetry--Archimillionaire, by Medaille d'Or) and **ARTAX** (c, 3, Marquetry--Raging Apalachee, by Apalachee)

The young sire Marquetry appears to be on a role with his first three-year-olds. His daughter Uanme captured the GIII Forward Gal S. at Gulfstream Park Jan. 28, and just five days later his son Artax took a bold step down the Triple Crown trail with a 5 1/2 length win in the GIII Santa Catalina S.

It never ceases to amaze us how often the first major winner for a sire has some notable inbreeding or linebreeding, and Uanme is no exception. Marquetry is by Conquistador Cielo out of a mare by Vice Regent. In turn, Vice Regent is a son of Northern Dancer out of a daughter of the outstanding Windfields Farm matron Victoriana. A look at the distaff side of Uanme's pedigree shows a daughter of Northern Dancer (Fanfreluche) and a son of Victoriana (Victoria Park), so Uanme is 4x4 to Northern Dancer and 5x5 to Victoriana, both through a son and daughter. Fanfreluche is herself pretty closely related to Vice Regent, since both are by Northern Dancer out of daughters of mares by Windfields.

These combinations suggest a number of other things which might be tried with Marquetry, including Viceregal (brother to Vice Regent), other Fanfreluche sons D'Accord and L'Enjoleur, and The Minstrel (by Northern Dancer out of a mare by Victoria Park).

Artax, whose dam was sold for just \$2,300 as a two-year-old in training, has a much more outcrossed pedigree. It is interesting, though, that one of the best runners by Apalachee, the broodmare sire of Artax, was out of a mare by Marquetry's broodmare sire, Vice Regent. If there is a significant link between Apalachee and Vice Regent, it might be attributed to Gold Bridge, who is broodmare sire of Apalachee's dam, Moccasin, and of Vice Regent's broodmare sire, Menetrier. Both Vice Regent and Moccasin are Nearco-line horses, and Menetrier and Moccasin give, respectively, the brothers Fairway and Pharos over Gold Bridge mares.

As a footnote, we might mention that Conquistador Cielo is quietly becoming a useful sire of sires. In addition to Marquetry, his son Norquestor has done very well in Maryland, while another son, El Moxie, began his career in Tasmania, but sprung to Australian prominence with a Group 1 winner in his first crop.
