\$1 MILLION GOLD CUP HEADS HOLLYWOOD STAKES SCHEDULE

The \$1-million mile-and-a-quarter Hollywood Gold Cup, set for June 28, highlights the 1998 spring/summer stakes schedule at Hollywood Park. The 55-race program, worth \$7.7 million, includes 29 graded events, six of them Grade I. The track will also offer 15 overnight stakes boasting a total of \$1 million in purses. The GII A Gleam H. has been boosted \$150,000; the seven-furlong event for fillies and mares, now worth \$250,000, will be run on the Gold Cup undercard. Also set for Gold Cup Day, the seven-furlong GII Triple Bend Breeders' Cup H. has received a \$50,000 increase to \$300,000. The GI \$400,000 Hollywood Turf H. May 25, GII \$400,000 Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile June 14 and the GI \$300,000 Beverly Hills H. July 4 headline the 24 turf stakes on the schedule. Hollywood's "Super Sunday" July 19, one of 16 multiple-stakes day during the meet, features five stakes worth \$1.2 million, including the GII \$500,000 Swaps S. for three-year-olds, GII \$350,000 Sunset H. at a mile and a half on the turf and the GIII \$100,000 Hollywood Juvenile Championship for two-year-olds. The 67-day spring/summer season opens April 24 and closes July 20.

LEAK CHANGES '98 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

According to the *Daily Racing Form*, this year's Racing Hall of Fame ballots will list five candidates in each category, instead of the traditional three, because a member of the Hall's nomination and selection committee leaked the original roster to the press. Both the *Associated Press* and *The Blood-Horse On-Line* ran stories Tuesday which revealed the confidential list of candidates that had been sent to the 14-person nomination and selection committee. The committee would normally shorten the list to three candidates in each category, but due to the leak, all five names will be on the ballot this year. The candidates for induction into the Hall of Fame in '98 are: Trainers--Bill Mott, Carl Hanford, Willard Proctor, Buddy Raines, Robert Wheeler; Jockeys--Russell Baze, Earlie Fires, Ismael Valenzuela, Jacinto Vasquez, Jack Westrope; Contemporary Male Horse--Cougar II, Exceller, Ferdinand, Manila, Riva Ridge; Contemporary Female Horse--Bayakoa (Arg), Dance Smartly, Miesque, Mom's Command, Winning Colors; Horse of Yesteryear--Bald Eagle, Bowl of Flowers, Fort Marcy, Gun Bow, Needles.

HANDEL TO PHILLY PARK Greenwood Racing, Inc., the owners of Philadelphia Park Racetrack, the Turf Clubs and Phonebet, announced yesterday the appointment of Hal Handel as chief executive officer of Philadelphia Park. Handel, who resigns his post as the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority's chief operating officer for racing, will be responsible for all aspects of Philadelphia Park's operations. "I am delighted that Hal will be joining our organization," said Bob Green, chairman and president of Greenwood. "He is one of the leading figures in our industry and has done a magnificent job for the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority with his management of Meadowlands and Monmouth Park racetracks." Commenting on the move, Handel said, "I have had a wonderful 13 years at the Sports Authority and have enjoyed the challenge of helping to develop the Meadowlands and Monmouth Park into two of the most successful racetracks in America. The racing industry is going through a number of fundamental changes and I believe Greenwood is poised to take advantage of these changes and grow into one of the major racing operations in the country."

BACK ON TRACK AT GULFSTREAM Ted Malloy, Gulfstream Park track superintendent, said repairs made to the sinkhole which materialized between the three-sixteenths and the eighth pole Wednesday, were completed early Thursday morning. "I sent my crew home at 2 a.m.," Malloy said. He continued working alone well past 4:30. The track was available for horses at the regular 5:30 a.m. opening. Malloy said plumbers had to dig out a 20-foot section of 30-inch corrugated pipe to reconnect a broken strap that had caused the sinkhole. "The plumbers finished at 10 last (Wednesday) night," Malloy added. The sinkhole suspended the day's card after the first race, which meant the seven-furlong \$100,000 Gill Shirley Jones H. was lost. Racing Secretary Bob Umphrey said he was rescheduling the race for Sunday. "The matter was discussed with the owners and trainers of the original entries and it was agreed this was the most equitable way of handling the situation," said Umphrey. "Of the original field, only two, **Everhope** (Danzig) and **Dance for Thee** (Sword Dance {Ire}), said they could not run." Umphrey said the field, now down to five entries, would run in the post positions drawn for the Wednesday race.

TURFWAY CLOSED AGAIN Turfway Park in Florence, Kentucky was forced to cancel live racing for the second straight day yesterday as extreme snowfall blanketed the area. Officials were forced to cancel racing Wednesday night after nearly a foot of snow fell on the area and, with the prediction of continued bad weather, Thursday night's card was also jettisoned. Racing is scheduled to resume Friday with a first post time of 5:30 p.m.

Tale of the Cat (Storm Cat), who reportedly came back lame from a half-mile work at Gulfstream Monday, has just been walking the shedrow since the breeze. On Thursday, Pat McBerney, assistant to trainer John Forbes said, "John is in New Jersey for a couple of days, but when he comes back on Sunday, he'll decide whether to work him or not. We thought there was a bruise, but there was nothing on the X-ray. Both of his (front) hoofs are warm, but there doesn't seem to be an abscess. We're keeping a close eye on him."

The grey is also the leading candidate for Cal-bred "Horse of the Year" honors, which will be announced at the CTBA's awards dinner in Sacramento February 17. Golden Eagle Farm was represented by three Cal-breds champions for 1997: GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies runner-up **Career Collection** (General Meeting), two-year-old filly; **Fleet Lady** (Avenue of Flags), three-year-old filly; and **Avenue of Gold** (Avenue of Flags), older filly/mare. Champion older male went to Cal Cup Classic hero **Awesome Daze** (Lil Tyler), while **Surachai** (Slepy) was named top Cal-bred sprinter. **Ex Marks the Cop** (In Excess {Ire}), three-for-four in '97, earned the award as champion two-year-old, and **Gastown** (Carson City) pocketed the state title as top grass horse.
