SURGERY FOR SILVER MAIDEN Frank Calabrese's GISW **Silver Maiden** (Silver Buck), who suffered her first career loss when fifth in the Tiffany Lass S. at the Fair Grounds February 1, will undergo arthroscopic surgery to remove a small chip from her right knee. The three-year-old filly, who was also found to have bled in the Tiffany Lass, is expected to miss about six weeks of training. She will be sent to Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, where Dr. Larry Bramlage will perform the operation. "I don't anticipate any problems," said trainer Britt McGehee. "Dr. Bramlage said it didn't look that bad at all, although they will know more once they get into her knee."

RERUN STALLION AUCTION SET ReRun, the Kentucky-based program to place ex-racehorses into adoptive homes, announced yesterday that bids for their Stallion Season Auction can be placed beginning Tuesday, February 24 at 9 a.m. Bids will be taken by telephone and by e-mail until Friday, February 27 at 4 p.m. The live auction is set for the night of Saturday, February 28 at ReRun's Mane Event, a fundraiser to be held at Fasig-Tipton in Lexington. "While we certainly hope horse lovers turn out in droves for our fundraiser, you don't have to be present to be high bidder on a stallion season or silent auction item," said Shon Wylie, co-founder of ReRun. "We will determine the top e-mail and phone bidders, and they will be contacted via cell phone during the live auction so that they may participate in the final bidding." Stallion seasons currently available at the auction include Academy Award, Conte di Savoya, Demidoff, Evansville Slew, Ferrara, Gold Case, Hawk Attack, Home At Last, Kyle's Our Man, Lac Ouimet, Lucky Lionel, Othello, Peruvian, Play Fellow, Sabona, Southern Rhythm, Tejano Run, Tricky Creek and Turkoman, and more may be added. Beaten only a half-length at the wire by I Ain't Bluffing in the GII El Encino S. last out January 18, Fleet Lady was awarded the victory when the original winner was disqualified for bothering Minister's Melody and placed third. Proving she could finish first without the help of the stewards, the Cal-bred miss sat behind LOVE THAT JAZZ (Dixieland Band) and I Ain't Bluffing to the stretch, then had to wait for an opening, but found running room late and got to the front in the final sixteenth to win going away. "When I got to the three-eighths pole, I didn't like my spot any more because...I had to sit and wait," said jockey Garrett Gomez. "I was following Love That Jazz, but she started coming back to me. Once I finally found somewhere to go, I was hoping the filly would jump back out underneath me and go. She started to accelerate, but really didn't hit her best stride until the wire. She was just starting to level out and get to running. She looks like a true route filly." Added trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, "The key to her improvement is just maturity. She's learning how to do things now she didn't know before. We also stretched her out--she seems more comfortable doing that."

HALL OF FAME TRAINER BURLING COCKS

PASSES AWAY According to *The Blood-Horse On-Line*, W. Burling Cocks, a steeplechase owner and trainer who was elected to Racing's Hall of Fame in 1985, died Saturday at his farm in Unionville, Pennsylvania at the age of 82. Cocks handled the career of three-time champion steeplechaser **Zaccio** (*Lorenzaccio), who won 12 stakes over the jumps and earned Eclipse Awards in 1980, '81 and '82. Cocks leaves his wife, Barbara; a son, William B. Cocks Jr., a trainer based in Camden, South Carolina; daughters, Susan Jones, Barbara C. Vannote and Jessie W. Cocks; and eight grandchildren.

U Can Do It rolled to a 4 1/2-length victory in the Gill First Lady H. at Gulfstream in her previous trip to the post. The second choice raced slightly out from the rail while dueling with favored Glitter Woman through a half in :45 1/5 and put away the favorite in the drive despite having jockey Shane Sellers drop his whip near the wire. "It set up good for her," Sellers said. "For those types of fillies, the fractions were good. My filly was the speed of the race. My filly is probably a three-quarters of a mile horse. I needed to get the fractions right. (Glitter Woman) came to me a little sooner than I expected, enough to make my filly exert herself, and I was able to just sit there when we turned for home. She's got a nice punch to her. She still had something left." Trainer Larry Pilotti was unsure what would be next for the winner and indicated she may be rested. Making her second start off an eight-month layoff, Glitter Woman was sent off as the prohibitive favorite on the strength of her perfect four-for-four record over the Gulfstream main track (by a combined margin of 28 1/2 lengths), but could not stay with the winner in the stretch. "No excuses," Mike Smith, rider aboard the beaten chalk, said. "I wish I could tell you something, but I can't. No excuses." Trainer Shug McGaughey saw something positive in his filly's defeat. "She ran fine," McGaughey said. "I'm disappointed that she didn't win, but not in how she ran. This should do her some good. The Rampart H. (Gill, March 1) will probably be her next race."

Shemozzle (Ire), who began her career in England, captured the Aug. 6 Glens Falls S. at Saratoga and the Aug. 16 New Castle H. at Delaware, but then moved up to graded company and finished third in the Sept. 13 Gill Violet H. at the Meadowlands and eighth last time out in the Jan. 21 Gill Joe Namath H. at Gulfstream. Making her second start off a four-month break, the second choice was rated on the lead through a half-mile in :49 4/5 and opened up her advantage in the drive to notch her first graded score. "It worked out just the way we wanted," winning jockey John Velazquez said. "The course was in great shape. Christophe (trainer Clement) told me I was in the clear. She was just cruising, just galloping. From the half-mile pole, I said, 'O.K. This is my race. Let them catch up with me.' She doesn't have that quick speed to pick it up. I was told that when I got to the three-eighths pole to let her run before they get to her, so she has that advantage over the rest of the horses. As soon as I asked her, she responded right away. I didn't know what the others were doing. I was worried about me. I was just trying to ride my race." Clement indicated the winner will probably run back in the March 8 Gill Orchid H. at Gulfstream. The favorite Yokama tracked the pace and failed to make a serious run at the winner in the drive.

Local News: Gulfstream Park

Champion **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) came back from his victory in Saturday's GI Donn H. in good order, says trainer Sonny Hine. "He's excellent. He was the first one out (Sunday) morning. He was yelling to get out--usually he's patient," he reported.

Owner Joseph Graffeo and trainer Stephen L. DiMauro accomplished a rare feat at Gulfstream Sunday, finishing in a dead-heat for the win in two races on the card. Graffeo's 5-1 **Beauty Queen** (Fighting Fit) hit the wire as one with 4-5 **Blue Fire** (Majestic Venture) in the second race; his 8-1 **Call Me Social** (Raised Socially) finished on even terms with 6-1 **Festive Debut** (Festive) in the fifth race. Both were claiming events at six furlongs.

Jockey Gary Stevens will have the mount on **Sweetsouthern** (Saint Ballado) in the GII Fountain of Youth S. February 21. The colt was ridden by Abdiel Toribio through an undefeated two-year-old campaign, then finished third under jockey Pat Day in his first start at three, the GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream January 17. "The decision was made to find a rider that would not only ride the horse in the Fountain of Youth, but stick with the horse when we go to Kentucky," said trainer Leo Azpurua. "Pat Day is committed to ride Favorite Trick. Gary said to me that if the horse runs well, and I'd imagine that means wins, he'd be interested in committing to my horse. He has not formally committed at this time."

Lil's Lad (Pine Bluff), also pointing for the Fountain of Youth, worked a half in :47 4/5 yesterday. "It was a great work," said trainer Neil Howard. "He's had two races now, so we don't want anything fast. Right now it's just maintaining and foundation."

GISW **Val's Prince** (Eternal Prince), prepping for the GII Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. February 14, worked a mile in an easy 1:47 Saturday. The six-year-old took the G2 Hong Kong International Cup last out December 14. Of the trip to the Far East, trainer Jimmy Picou said, "It was just fabulous, I loved it. They gave you a Mercedes with a chauffeur. They put you up in the finest hotel there. The racetrack was amazing. Everything was just great."

Veteran grass star **Awad** (Caveat), a MGISW of \$3,270,131, will miss the Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup after spiking a fever and missing a couple of works, according to trainer Dave Donk. "We're shooting for the Pan American (GII, March 7) now," he said of the eight-year-old. "He's doing okay. He's back in training."

Local News: Florida

Officials from Gulfstream, Calder, the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and the Florida Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association met recently to discuss the Florida state legislative session which begins March 3. The two tracks and the two horsemen's groups are interested in seeing changes in a pair of the laws which govern racing in Florida. Kent Stirling, executive director of the FHBPA said, "The group would like to see the current tax structure remain, but they're looking for a change that involves dropping the doubling of the taxes if a track runs outside the dates they apply for. They also want to do away with the 10 p.m. deadline on taking simulcasts. The tracks would like to see all time restrictions removed." Television Games Network is working with the two tracks to get phone wagering passed, but no one expects the bill to go through in this session while Governor Lawton Chiles is still in office. Lawton's term expires in January, 1999. Hialeah, which has not aligned itself with Calder and Gulfstream, has a slightly different agenda at the upcoming legislative session. John Van Lindt, vice president of the track, said he would like to see the dates and the taxes remain the same, including the provision about doubling taxes on tracks trying to run outside their dates.

A winner of every other start since taking an allowance race at Del Mar last August, including the Run For Roses H. on the dirt in her latest outing January 1, Fun In Excess finally put together back-to-back victories. The grey stalked pacesetter Walk in Time for six furlongs, put a head in front as they swung into the stretch and edged away to win it as the crowd's second choice.
