DEPUTY COMMANDER RETURNS IN TALENT-RICH ALLOWANCE The 1997 GI Travers and GI Super Derby winner **Deputy Commander** (Deputy Minister) makes his return to the races in Friday's 7th race at Santa Anita, a \$72,000 one-mile turf allowance race. The four-year-old has not run since finishing second in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic last November. "We need to get a race in him," explained trainer Wally Dollase. "He'll do well because he's such a good horse. The question is, does his trainer have him fit enough? We want him to have a good experience, something to get him ready for the next one." Deputy Commander's "next one" could be the March 7 GI Santa Anita H. or the March 8 GIII New Orleans H. at the Fair Grounds. The race won't necessarily be an easy return for Deputy Commander. Eight of the ten runners in the field are graded stakes victors and all are stakes winners, including **Anet** (Clever Trick), **Northern Afleet** (Afleet) and **Rainbow Blues (Ire)** (Bluebird). **Funontherun** (Runaway Groom), winner of last year's GII San Rafael and the GII Palos Verdes H. in his only start so far this year, is on the also-eligible list for the race.

\$3.5 MILLION DELAWARE STAKES SCHEDULE RELEASED The \$500,000 GIII Delaware H. highlights Delaware Park's \$3.52 million 1998 stakes schedule. The track's signature event for fillies and mares at 1 1/4 miles will be run July 26 and caps a weekend of stakes worth a record total of \$1.175 million. On July 25, three-year-old fillies will be showcased in the \$200,000 Delaware Oaks. Delaware Park will also host six stakes races in the Mid-Atlantic Thoroughbred Championship Series; the April 26 \$100,000 Wilmington H., May 31 \$50,000 Leonard Richards S., July 25 \$100,000 Robert G. Dick Memorial, August 9 \$75,000 Francis LaBelle Memorial and the October 3 \$150,000 Brandywine H. Highlighting the track's turf stakes races are the July 4 \$100,000 Christiana S. for three-year-old fillies, the August 30 \$100,000 New Castle H. for older fillies and mares and the September 6 \$100,000 Sussex H. for three-year-olds and up, all at nine furlongs. Delaware Park's 1998 meeting runs from April 5 through November 12.

ALDEN'S JUANA TOPS FASIG-TIPTON KENTUCKY Alden's Juana (John Alden), dam of GII Palos Verdes winner Funontherun (Runaway Groom), brought a final bid of \$322,000 to top yesterday's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale in Lexington, Ky. The nine-year-old mare, in foal to Runaway Groom, was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency and was purchased by Michael Yovankin. The second highest price was \$200,000 for graded stakes winner **Notagoldbrick** (Fortunate Prospect), a racing or broodmare prospect purchased by Jimmy R. Davis, agent, from the consignment of Darby Dan Farm. Gross sales increased 148 percent with 286 horses selling for \$3,748,600 in 1998 compared with a 1997 gross of \$1,510,100, with 162 horses sold. Overall, the average sales price was \$13,107 which represents a 41-percent increase from the 1997 average sales price of \$9,322.

Rare Rock, who just missed winning the Oct. 26 GIII Ack Ack H. at Churchill three starts ago, established a new track record when he raced 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:02 2/5 in a Jan. 3 Gulfstream allowance last time out. The second choice pressed a hot pace of a half-mile in :44 flat and outfinished pace-setting Heckofaralph in the final stages. "To look at him (Rare Rock), you wouldn't think he could be that quick," winning jockey Pat Day said. "He's a big, strong horse that doesn't appear to be that fast. Actually, he didn't break as alertly today as he did last time. The speed was inside of us. We were able to trail them down the backside. When we came off the turn, and I asked him to change leads, he responded. About the 1/16ths pole, I urged him and we slowly edged away from them." Trainer Todd Pletcher was not concerned about his horse breaking from post seven in the eight-horse field. "We felt good about the outside post," Pletcher said. "It gave Pat (Day) the opportunity to decide to sit back or go to the front. He can go either way." Pletcher indicated that the winner may go next in the Mar. 13 GIII Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup Sprint Championship. "He's the type of horse that likes a month off between races," he said. "He puts a lot into his races." The 8-5 favorite KELLY KIP (Kipper Kelly) was in perfect striking position in the early going but came up empty in the stretch, finishing sixth.
