RICK BAEDEKER NAMED NTRA VICE

PRESIDENT OF MARKETING Rick Baedeker, the vice president of marketing and public relations for Hollywood Park for the past six years, has been named vice president of marketing for the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. Baedeker will help to launch the NTRA's advertising campaign as well as an extensive customer development and fan education program. The native Californian will be based in Lexington, Kentucky, and will begin working for the NTRA immediately. "Marketing is at the heart of the entire NTRA effort and we are thrilled to have someone with Rick's experience, ability and knowledge of the sport join our team on a full-time basis," said D.G. Van Clief Jr., the interim CEO of the NTRA. "We will rely heavily on him in the critical months ahead as we launch the NTRA."

SON OF DANCE SMARTLY INJURED

Dance Brightly (Mr. Prospector), the second foal from Canadian Horse of the Year and GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine **Dance Smartly** (Danzig), has suffered a condylar fracture of the right front cannon bone. The three-year-old, who broke his maiden in his first start and was second in the GIC Coronation Futurity November 1 in his only other appearance, was injured during a half-mile work in :51 4/5 Sunday at the Fair Grounds. "He took a bad step and it was one of those freak things," said trainer Mark Frostad. "He was sent to the clinic at Louisiana State University on Sunday. He'll have most of the year off." Dance Smartly's first foal, a colt by Pleasant Colony, broke his leg when he was just five weeks old and had to be put down.

NEULLY OUT OF ACTION

Neully (Trempolino), who took the G3 Prix Messidor and was third in the G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois last year, fractured his left front cannon bone during a breeze at Santa Anita Thursday morning. The four-year-old had started just once in this country, finishing 12th in the GI Hollywood Derby in his last outing November 30. "He just took a wrong step," said trainer Ron Ellis. "We did surgery on it last night and the prognosis looks good. There wasn't any joint damage, the break was in the middle of the bone. They put a couple of screws in there. We'll give him between six and eight months off and get him ready for his five-year-old campaign." The Kentucky-bred has won two of six starts for earnings of \$88,336.
