SKIP AWAY TO BIG 'CAP? Trainer Sonny Hine has opened the door for a possible showdown between his two-time champion **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) and California stars **Gentlemen** (Arg) (Robin des Bois) and Eclipse winner **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) in the GI Santa Anita H. March 7. Hine had been expected to send his five-year-old out in the GI Gulfstream Park H. February 28, but yesterday said, "We're just watching what's taking place. We'll see what Gulfstream has to offer. I've been getting calls from tracks all over the place." The trainer cited the Big 'Cap as a potential goal for his charge, despite the fact that the Thoroughbred Owners of California turned down Santa Anita's bid to raise the race's purse from \$1 million to \$1.6 million. Skip Away is scheduled to breeze at Gulfstream Monday.

MELBOURNE CUP WINNER THIRD IN RETURN

Last year's Foster's Melbourne Cup winner **Might And Power** (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) made his first start since that November victory in Saturday's G1 \$133,200 C. F. Orr S. over seven furlongs at Caulfield in Melbourne and only just failed to make a glorious return. The four-year-old finished third, missing by a long head and a half neck to sprinters **Special Dane** (Aus) (Danehill) and **Al Mansour** (Aus) (At Talaq). Three-year-old colt Special Dane, a 14-1 shot, was winning at the Group 1 level for the first time; he gave his trainer Brian Mayfield-Smith his first Group 1 winner in nine years, and his 23rd in all. "I'm just thrilled," said Mayfield-Smith. "It's good for the owners to win a Group 1 with him, as they want to breed him. He came out and fought hard to win against some super horses. He's got a real fighting heart and just won't let up." But all hats were off to Melbourne Cup winner **Might And Power**, who was several lengths behind the leaders entering the stretch and only just failed. His regular rider Jim Cassidy said, "He was off the bit working into the race, but he finished off sensationally." Special Dane, who won the G2 Sandown Guineas earlier in the season, will now be aimed at the G1 Futurity S. over seven furlongs at Caulfield Feb. 28.

After finishing up 1997 with a fourth-place finish in the Breeders' Cup Sprint, Exotic Wood got right back on track in her '98 debut, winning the GI Santa Monica H. at Santa Anita in her last start. The six-year-old dark bay mare reeled off her second straight GI with incredible ease here en route to a stakes record in her first attempt over an off track. Breaking from the rail, she stalked the early pace of TUZLA (FR) (Panoramic (GB) and Toda Una Dama while saving ground on the inside. Swinging wide turning for home, she quickly drew away and went on to win under a hand ride from jockey Chris McCarron. "Boy, she is something," said McCarron. "I didn't know how she was going to handle the off track, but she skipped across it with the greatest of ease. She is something special." McCarron brought a bit of history to the event. "I rode her sire's dam, Glorious Song, in this race in 1981 and won," he said. "I think it was the easiest stakes win I had in my career. This might have been the second easiest." Said winning trainer Ron Ellis, "This was a perfect race for her. We are really pointing her for the (April 10, GI) Apple Blossom H. (at Oaklawn), especially now that we know she can handle the mud so well, because you can always get mud there." Carrying highweight in the race, Exotic Wood earned her sixth stakes win in 15 starts.

J J'sdream shipped in from New Orleans where she finished second in the Dec. 21 F. W. Gaudin Memorial H. at the Fair Grounds in her previous start. Coming off a two-month break, the second choice trailed the field of 10 in the early going before advancing very wide around the far turn and closing gamely in the stretch to nip Palette Knife. As for his charge's future, trainer Bobby Barnett indicated that she will continue to race until she earns the \$188,000 needed to bring her to the million-dollar mark before being retired to become a broodmare.

Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. (Cont.)

Flag Down ended his 1997 campaign with third-place finishes in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and the GI Hollywood Turf Cup and returned to the winner's circle here for the first time since capturing an Aug. 25 Saratoga allowance event five starts back. The favorite was unhurried in the early stages before advancing six-wide turning for home and gaining ground quickly to wear down front-running Buck's Boy inside the final furlong. "We knew there was a lot of pace in this race," winning jockey Jose Santos said. "Earlie Fires' horse (Buck's Boy) had a lot of speed. I was very confident on the horse. He went back to California after the Breeders' Cup. He was kind of a little down. He looked good in the paddock. Through the race, I was laying back. At the half-mile pole, I was asking him a little bit. He was not picking it up. I said, 'Come on man, you can do better than that.' As soon as I said that, he just took off running. He was outside. No traffic. He did his job. He's one of the best turf horses around. He's a tough guy." Trainer Christophe Clement said he planned to run the winner back in the Mar. 7 GII Pan American H. at Gulfstream. Sent off as the 4-1 second choice, VAL'S PRINCE (Eternal Prince) lacked a late response and finished fifth in his initial 1998 start.

Local News: Florida

The Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering in Florida has released new guidelines regarding penalties on positives for Class IV and Class V medications, which include arquel, azium, banamine, ibuprofen, isoxsuprine and robaxin. These guidelines were worked out between the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering during 1997, and went into effect January 5, 1998. The new penalties are: a \$100 or \$250 fine for the first violation in a 12-month period; a \$250 or \$500 fine for the second violation in a 12-month period; and a \$500 to \$1,000 fine and a 15 to 30-day suspension for the third or any subsequent violation in any 12-month period. FHBPA Executive Director Kent Stirling said, "These are by far the most equitable medication rules I have seen anywhere in the United States. They should be a model for other racing jurisdictions to emulate."
