BIG 'CAP RIVALS BREEZE **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) and **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois), set to meet for the first time in the \$1 million GI Santa Anita H. March 7, each worked yesterday morning. Last year's champion three-year-old Silver Charm went a half in :48 at Santa Anita, while MGISW Gentlemen breezed the same distance in :47 2/5 at Hollywood Park. "He looked good," said trainer Bob Baffert of Silver Charm, winner of the GII Strub S. last out February 7. "He's not showing any signs his last race affected him at all. He's going to be mad at me when I go back to the barn, because I wouldn't let him catch that other horse he worked with." Trainer Richard Mandella said of Gentlemen, "He went really well. It's another step toward the Big 'Cap. The San Antonio was nothing for him, it didn't take anything out of him. I'm looking forward to the Big 'Cap." Gentlemen came back from a five-month layoff to take the GII San Antonio H. February 7. Another hopeful for the big race, **Funontherun** (Runaway Groom) went a half-mile in :47 2/5 Monday.

TATTERSALLS BREEZE-UP SALE ATTRACTS FIRST U.S. CONSIGNOR Kirkwood Stables, headed by Kip Elser, will become the first-ever U.S.-based consignor at a European breeze-up sale when it offers six two-year-olds in training for the Tattersalls Breeze-Up Sales in Newmarket, England April 14-16. Kirkwood has been among the top five consignors at American two-year-old in training sales for the last 10 years, sending such top horses as **Sharp Cat** (Storm Cat), a \$900,000 purchase at Barretts in 1996, GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Alphabet Soup** (Cozzene) and 1997 champion sprinter **Smoke Glacken** (Two Punch) through the ring. The Kirkwood consignment at Tattersalls will include colts by Fred Astaire, Hansel, Lear Fan and Missionary Ridge; and fillies by Beau Genius and Nureyev. "I am really excited about this whole project," said Elser. "It is something I have had in mind for a number of years, and I began to look at it seriously after visiting the Tattersalls' Houghton Sale as a buyer in 1996. The Tattersalls Breeze-Up is definitely on the upgrade, we've put together a nice team of two-year-olds and we are all looking forward to the sale." Tattersalls is expecting to catalogue 200 two-year-olds for the April Breeze-Up sale.

Bienvenido (Arg) ended 1997 with a second-place finish in the GII San Gabriel H. December 28, and started the new year in similar fashion, running second after a tough trip in the GII San Marcos H. January 19. Stretching out off that mile-and-a-quarter test, the bay sprinted to the lead at the start, was pressed through three-quarters in a pedestrian 1:15 4/5, shook loose as they raced around the far turn and cruised home under a hand ride. "His last race, he had so much trouble," said winning trainer Ron McAnally. "To have him last turning for home (in the San Marcos)--the way he ran today was just the opposite. There is one thing about being in front, you can't get into that trouble. The main thing was for him to go out there and slow the pace down." Taking the blame for the San Marcos loss, jockey Chris McCarron said, "I rode such a bad race on him last time. I'm so pleased to be able to let the horse vindicate me. Last time out, I fought him too much. I just wanted to let him do whatever he wanted to do today." The five-year-old will go next in the GII San Luis Rey S. (March 22). **KESSEM POWER (NZ)** (Kessem {NZ}) clipped heels on the far turn and lost his rider, Kent Desormeaux, but both horse and rider were uninjured.

Royal Haven was looking for his third straight graded stakes win after taking the Nov. 27 GII Fall Highweight and Dec. 27 GIII Gravesend H. in his last two starts. The dark bay gelding, a slight choice here, rallied from fifth in early stretch and split horses to easily take the lead in the final furlong and draw clear. "He just waits, then goes," explained winning jockey Richard Migliore. "He really makes my job easy."

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH PREPS Fountain Of Youth hopeful **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner) had his final breeze for Saturday's race yesterday morning, going six furlongs in an easy 1:15 1/5. "He did fine," said trainer Shug McGaughey. "Perfect. It was just what I wanted." The temperamental colt got through the breeze, and a subsequent schooling in the paddock, without incident. "When he's behaving, he will gallop around like a pony," said his exercise rider, Adolph Krajewski. "He's an easy horse to gallop. He's not crazy, he's just very smart." Also breezing yesterday, **Sweetsouthern saint** (Saint Ballado) went five-eighths in 1:00. "He's very fit right now," said trainer Leo Azpurua. "I feel like he'll run a very big race." The colt, who suffered his first defeat when third in the GIII Holy Bull S. last out, will race with Lasix for the first time in the Fountain Of Youth. "He's been on Lasix for his last two works," said Azpurua. "I wanted to make sure he could handle it. I want to stress that he only bled a little bit last time, but it was enough to make me use Lasix this time. It is just a safety precaution."

VIVID ANGEL RETIRED Vivid Angel (Septieme Ciel), winner of the GI Oak Leaf S. and GII Del Mar Debutante at two, has been retired after finishing a disappointing fifth in Sunday's GI Las Virgenes S. at Santa Anita. "Her stifles have been bothering her ever since the Breeders' Cup," said trainer Bob Baffert. "I think it happened when she got knocked sideways in that race. She's not pushing off the way she used to, she's regressing. She hasn't trained the same since the Breeders' Cup, so we decided this would be best." The three-year-old filly, sixth after a very rough trip in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, goes to the breeding shed after winning three of her eight starts and \$314,196. It has not yet been announced who she will be bred to.

FASIG-TIPTON CALDER UNDER TACK SHOW

RESULTS Hip 235, a bay filly by Dehere--Theladysaid-so (Great Above), blazed an eighth of a mile in :10 2/5 to post the fastest time at Sunday's Under Tack Show for the Fasig-Tipton Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale, to be held at Calder Race Course in Miami, Florida Feb. 23 and 24. The filly, a registered Florida-bred, is consigned to the sale by R. N. Scanlon, agent. Only one two-year-old breezed a quarter-mile Sunday, and that was Hip 1, a colt by Lord At War (Arg)--Eleven O'Click (Sportin' Life). Consigned by Mark Casse, agent, the bay colt covered the distance in :23 1/5. The second and final Under Tack Show for the Calder sale will begin at 10 a.m. this Sunday, February 22.

Last early, the filly powered her way to the lead in midstretch and drew off to the wire, earning her first graded stakes win and giving jockey Jorge Chavez his second straight victory in the race. "Today when I asked her at the five-eighths pole and took her to the outside, she started flying," said Chavez. "In the stretch, she was going away. She won pretty easy today."

When he's ready to move, he'll move. He's pretty much like driving a car." Winning trainer Billy Badgett was worried the Palm Beach S. would come off the turf. "With this turf course and rain, I haven't slept for two or three days. I would have talked Mr. Knight (owner) into running him on the main track if it had come off the turf. He really needed to run. He was ready to jump over the fence."

MSW Advancing Star (Soviet Star) breezed a half-mile in :48 1/5 yesterday, getting ready for Sunday's GIII Las Flores H. Trainer Richard Mandella will run the five-year-old mare only if the track is fast, but added, "She's doing too well right now to keep her in the barn."

MGSW Career Collection (General Meeting), fourth in Sunday's GI Las Virgenes, may have been injured in the race. "She didn't run her race, and I think something happened," said trainer Wally Dollase. "We'll know more (Tuesday), after we X-ray her."

Boundless Beauty (Copelan), sixth in the Las Virgenes, was lame on her right hind leg after the race. "She strained her stifle," said trainer Kim Lloyd. "I think she did it when she broke from the gate, she went off a little awkwardly. I don't think it's anything that's going to prevent her from becoming a nice filly, she'll probably just need time off." The filly was also scheduled for X-rays yesterday.

Monday's Work Tab: MGSW Souvenir Copy (Mr. Prospector), runner-up in the GIII Santa Catalina S. February 1, went five furlongs in 1:01 1/5. He goes next in the GII San Rafael S. March 1. "Boy, he looked good," said trainer Bob Baffert. "I got his last quarter in :10 3/5. That's what he needs to do, relax and finish strong." Fellow San Rafael candidate **Orville N Wilburs** (Out Of Place) went a half in :48 3/5. "I worked him behind a horse," said trainer Wally Dollase. "He ate dirt for a good three-eighths of a mile and finished up real good. He needs that experience behind other horses, that was the problem in his last race. We'll probably work him that way again." Out of action since finishing second in the GII Norfolk S. last October, **Old Trieste** (A.P. Indy) went five-eighths in 1:00 2/5 with jockey Chris McCarron in the saddle; he galloped out six furlongs in 1:13 2/5, but is unlikely to be ready for the San Rafael.

Patrick and Justine Hogan, at whose Cambridge Stud Zabeel stands, are majority shareholders in the stallion. Said Patrick Hogan: "The syndicate is keenly aware of Zabeel's great value to the New Zealand breeding industry and has decided that the horse is definitely not for sale." Zabeel has sired six Group 1 winners to date, including the 1997 Melbourne Cup winner **Might And Power (NZ)** and the leading Australasian money-earner of all time **Octagonal (NZ)**.
