**OAKLAWN PROPOSES "AMERICA'S MILLION DOLLAR DARE"** Charles Cella, president of Oaklawn Park, yesterday announced his track will try to entice the country's top three handicap horses, **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois), **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) and **Skip Away** (Skip Trial), to the GI Oaklawn H. April 4 by offering a \$1 million purse to the winner of the race. Dubbed "America's Million Dollar Dare," the bonus will only be up for grabs if all three start in the mile-and-an-eighth event. "I have personally contacted all three of the connections, Robert and Beverly Lewis, R.D. Hubbard and Carolyn Hine...there are no commitments as of right now, but they are supportive of the concept and have told us to go forward," said Cella. "I look at this as a climb to Mt. Everest. We are at the base of the mountain now. I'm optimistic. We see 'America's Million Dollar Dare' as a gift to the fans here in Arkansas and to fans across America to commemorate the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Racing Festival of the South." Should all three horses make it to the gate, the total purse will remain \$750,000, but the winner, which does not have to be one of the top three, will be assured a \$1 million payday. "We will not utilize purse funds for any increases in the purse for this race," added Cella. "The association will subsidize the purse increase in order to set the stage for this great event." Said Skip Away's trainer, Sonny Hine, "I'm concerned with getting over \$10 million (in earnings) for my horse. I'll go anywhere they offer \$1 million (to the winner)." In addition to the "Million Dollar Dare," Oaklawn will offer an incentive of \$20,000 to any stakes winner who runs, but finishes sixth or worse in the race. Nominations for the Oaklawn H. are due Wednesday, March 18. Weights will be released March 26.

**CAREER COLLECTION INJURED** Career Collection (General Meeting) came out of Sunday's fourth-place finish in the GI Las Virgenes S. with chips in her left knee. Dr. Wayne McIlwraith will perform surgery to remove the chips on Saturday, but the filly will miss at least three months of action. Career Collection was runner-up in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and in the GI Hollywood Starlet. She earned wins in the GII Sorrento S. and GII Landaluce S., taking four of nine starts for earnings of \$494,005.

**TRA SETS RACING NETWORK IN MOTION** The Thoroughbred Racing Associations has launched a project to build a communications network linking all racing and simulcasting locations in North America. TRA has selected Autotote Corporation, in partnership with AT&T, to implement and manage the North American Simulcast Racing Information Network (NASRIN). A pilot network linking five racetracks will be installed and tested over the next two months before a national rollout begins later this spring. "The natural inclination will be to focus on the dramatic savings this network will produce, but that would be missing the most critical point," TRA Executive Vice President Chris Scherf said. "As an industry, we can take control of telecommunications technology and build a network to substantially change the means and cost of conducting our simulcasting business...now and in the future. Our history in simulcasting has been to reinvent the wheel 100 times over, but no one would argue that that has proven to be either effective or economical." Robert Bork, chairman of the TRA's 2020 Committee and senior vice president of Sam Houston Race Park, added, "Once racetracks and simulcasting outlets link in the creation of NASRIN, they will be able to securely transmit betting data at a fraction of the current rates. Participants will also realize significant savings on conventional voice phone calls."

**'98 DATES FOR COLONIAL DOWNS** Colonial Downs General Manager Gil Short has finalized racing dates for the Virginia track's upcoming Thoroughbred meeting. The 30-day season will kick off August 26 and conclude October 12. The track's inaugural harness meet runs from April 24 through July 5. Both meets will be run on a Thursday-through-Sunday basis. Thoroughbreds will head to the first post at 7 p.m. Thursdays and Fridays and at 1 p.m. on week-ends.

The field, in order of the draw, is as follows: **Halory Hunter** (Jade Hunter), 112; **Cape Town** (Seeking the Gold), 119; **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner), 119; **Lil's Lad** (Pine Bluff), 112.

Trainer Leo Azpurua, Jr. has decided not to run **Sweetsouthern saint** (St. Ballado) in the Fountain of Youth. "I don't want to do anything that might injure the horse," said Azpurua, who made the call not to enter the race after finding some inflammation in the colt's right front tendon sheath. An ultrasound was taken but showed nothing. But Azpurua said, "I'd rather be cautious. I can always run in the Florida Derby (March 14)." **Sweetsouthern saint**, third in the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 17, walked the Gulfstream track Thursday morning, but never left the side of the pony that accompanied him and never broke into a jog.

### RACE RIDING SCHOOL PLANNED TO HONOR

**ARCARO** The Jockeys' Guild is spearheading the development of the Eddie Arcaro School of Race Riding at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington, Kentucky, to honor the accomplishments of the legendary late jockey who would have turned 82 February 19. Joe Hirsch, a longtime friend of Arcaro's and executive columnist for the *Daily Racing Form*, said, "A jockey school is long overdue in the United States. We are the only major racing country in the world that doesn't have such a program. To name the school after Eddie is most appropriate. He is the greatest rider of this century and was an ardent supporter of programs to instruct younger riders." John Giovanni, national manager of the Jockeys' Guild, and regional manager Mickey Solomone have been working with John Nicholson, executive director of the Horse Park to establish the jockey school. They have discussed the administrative details, facilities, developed some curricula and have laid the groundwork to hopefully welcome the first student to the program in the Spring of 1999.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

**GAGLIANO TO PHILADELPHIA PARK** James L. Gagliano, general manager for racing at the Meadowlands and Monmouth Park for the last 2½ years, has resigned to accept the post of vice president of operations at Philadelphia Park. Gagliano, 32, has been associated with the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority since 1983. He will make the shift in mid-March and will be reunited with Hal Handel, who left the Sports Authority earlier in the month to become president of Philadelphia Park.

The 1986 Belmont S. winner **Danzig Connection** (Danzig), the only American Classic winner at stud in England, has attracted a book of more than 70 mares for his first season at Collin Stud at Stetchworth near Newmarket. His stud fee is set at £4,500 (\$7,324). Amongst the mares to visit him will be **Nest (GB)** (Sharpo {GB}), the half-sister to Breeders' Cup Sprint winner **Sheikh Albadou (GB)** (Green Desert) and **Corrina Corrina (GB)** (Risk Me {Fr}), full sister to champion **Risky (GB)**.

### Local News, Australia:

**Mouawad (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}), unsuccessful at stud, will be sold by the Magic Million Sales Company at public auction at Doomben Racetrack in Queensland on March 7. A full brother to 1996-97 Horse Of The Year Octagonal (NZ), **Mouawad** won seven of eight starts as a three-year-old in the 1996-97 season, including three Group 1 events, but was retired to Glenlogan Park Stud near Brisbane after sustaining a tendon injury. Pregnancy tests on the first 33 mares he covered all proved negative and shareholders decided to sell the horse. Magic Millions Director Don Hancock said, "We believe he is the best-credentialed horse ever to be sold in Australia. It will be an unreserved sale and we envisage world-wide interest in the auction." Last month, **Mouawad's** yearling full brother broke the all-time New Zealand record for a horse sold at public auction when purchased for \$932,347 at the New Zealand Bloodstock Sales at Karaka in Auckland.

**Frisk Me Now** (Mister Frisky), a disappointing fifth in the GI Donn H. in his last start, worked five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 yesterday with Pat Day in the irons. The four-year-old will start next in either the Feb. 28 GI Gulfstream Park H. or the March 8 GIII New Orleans H.

Owner James McIngvale has sent 12 of the horses which had been trained by Nick Zito to Steve Moyer at the Kentucky Horse Center in Lexington, Kentucky. "Three of the 12 horses I had for him were injured," explained Zito. **"St. Michael** (Devil's Bag) hurt his right rear ankle Tuesday. Right rear, what's the chances of that happening, 300-1? The horse is out for three months. I don't blame the man. It was a business decision. He wanted to get the horses out of here before any more got hurt." In addition to St. Michael, **Treasury** (Deputy Minister) and **Super Special** (Gone West) are on the injured list. Sent to train with Moyer are **Hitech** (Technology), **Sorcerer** (Summer Squall), **Solideroffortune** (Conquistador Cielo), **Metatonia** (Pleasant Tap), **Laydown** (Cryptoclearance), **Fire in the Hole** (Kris S.), **Lady's Choice** (Cox's Ridge), **AP Ruler** (A.P. Indy) and **Solid Wood** (Woodman).
