LIL'S LAD COMES UP BIG IN FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

He was just a big kid winning his first two starts of the year, speeding out of the gate and running as fast as he could to the wire to take a pair of allowance tests by a combined 22 3/4 lengths. But Lil's Lad (Pine Bluff) is growing up. Cast as the 4-5 favorite in yesterday's GII Fountain Of Youth S. at Gulfstream, the big bay colt put up a powerful performance to capture his very first stakes by 2 1/4 lengths. Second choice **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner) was quickest away from the gate, but Lil's Lad soon strode to the lead and never lost it, turning back a challenge from that rival at the top of the stretch to draw off under jockey Jerry Bailey. "It was a great race," said winning trainer Neil Howard, who is now three-for-three with Lil's Lad. "It was nice to see him respond the way he did under pressure." Bailey added, "He was very relaxed going into the first turn today. Last time he didn't relax until he opened up seven or eight lengths. Today, as soon as he had a half-length on Coronado's Quest, his ears went up. He relaxed and came off the bridle a little bit. That is a tremendous sign. When Coronado's Quest came to him, I thought I'd find out something. Not only did he hold him off, he widened the gap. The closer a horse gets to him, the harder Lil's Lad fights." The runner-up, who threw a tantrum in the paddock before his last start but still managed to finish second in the GII Hutcheson S. January 31, was saddled in the tunnel underneath the grandstand yesterday and took to the track before the rest of the four-horse field left the walking ring. Excused from the post parade, he made it to the gate without incident but came up short in the stretch, just holding off **Halory Hunter** (Jade Hunter) to get the place. "He ran a good race," said his rider, Mike Smith. "He got a little hot, but he was a whole lot better before the race than last time. I thought he could run past Lil's Lad right up until he couldn't do it." Trainer Shug McGaughey, who had schooled his colt in the paddock nearly every day since the Hutcheson, felt that his concentration on Saddling 101 took away from Coronado's Quest's on-track preparation. "He was so bad last time, I couldn't really worry about his training," he said. "It was his afternoon department we were worried about. He acted a lot better. I was very pleased with the race. He was giving the winner seven pounds, and he started to get a little tired. He just wasn't ready to run by (Lil's Lad). But if everything goes as planned, I think he'll be double-tough in the Florida Derby." The top two will meet again in the GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream March 14.

Lil's Lad was sent off the 4-5 favorite in this short four-horse field after posting a pair of monster allowance victories at Gulfstream in January. The son of 1992 Preakness S. winner Pine Bluff demolished an allowance field at 6 1/2 furlongs Jan. 4 by 16 1/2 lengths, then returned to win by 6 1/4 lengths at the Fountain of Youth distance of 1 1/16 miles Jan. 31. With regular jockey Jerry Bailey in the irons once again here, Lil's Lad broke out of the gate behind GII Hutcheson runner-up **CORONADO'S QUEST**, took a short lead from that rival on the first turn, fought off a serious challenge from him entering the stretch then drew clear in the drive for a convincing victory. **HALORY HUNTER**, who raced 16 1/2 lengths behind the leader down the backstretch, launched his customary late run to overtake **CAPE TOWN** for the show spot.

PIMLICO JOINS MILLION DOLLAR BIDDING

The Maryland Jockey Club and Maryland's Thoroughbred horsemen have agreed to increase the purse of the 1998 Pimlico Special to \$1 million if three Grade I winners compete. The three they're hoping for are **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois), **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) and **Skip Away** (Skip Trial). This initiative followed Oaklawn Park's announcement Thursday of "America's Million Dollar Dare"—\$1 million to the winner of the Oaklawn H. April 4 if the three big horses compete. In effect, that would swell the purse of the Oaklawn race to \$1.3 million (\$300,000 would be divided among the non-winners). "I don't know if we can go that strong," said Lenny Hale, vice president of racing for the Maryland Jockey Club. "But we can go back and address that." The 1 1/4-mile Pimlico Special is set for May 9, the Saturday between the Kentucky Derby and Preakness. Worth \$600,000 last year, a \$1 million Special would be Maryland's second million-dollar race in seven days. The purse for the May 16 Preakness already has been increased to \$1 million.

SILVER CHARM WORKS TOWARD BIG 'CAP

Silver Charm (Silver Buck), four-length winner of the GI Strub S. in his most recent outing at Santa Anita Feb. 7, breezed six furlongs in 1:13 2/5 at the Arcadia, California track Saturday morning. The 1997 Champion Three-Year-Old Colt is pointing toward a probable encounter with **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois) in the \$1 million Santa Anita H. March 7. Trainer Bob Baffert actually called an "audible" during Silver Charm's workout yesterday, electing to send his star pupil an extra furlong during the planned five-furlong drill. "There was nothing in front of him and he's lazy when that happens," Baffert said. "I wanted to get a really good work into him, so I sent him another furlong. He just does what he has to do, no more." The colt's co-owner Bob Lewis, on hand for the breeze, added, "He's got that fluid movement. He looks awesome. One thing about him, he knows when to turn it on in the afternoons."

SKIP AWAY DEFINITE FOR GULFSTREAM PARK HANDICAP

After weeks of speculation about whether or not Sonny and Carolyn Hine would send their champion **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) to California for the March 7 Santa Anita H., it has been decided that the five-year-old gray will remain in Florida to compete in the GI \$500,000 Gulfstream Park H. Feb. 28. **Skip Away**, second in last year's Gulfstream Park H., won the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Feb. 7 in his first start of '98. "He's doing super. Knock on wood," said trainer Sonny Hine. "He had a great work Monday (breezing five furlongs in :59 4/5). He'll work again this Monday."

A trio of Bill Mott-trainees breezed at Payson Park over the past few days.

Last year's Horse of the Year **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick), training toward his expected '98 debut in the GIII Swale S. at Gulfstream March 14, worked five furlongs in 1:08 flat Friday.

Last year's Champion Three-Year-Old Filly **Ajina** (Strawberry Road {Aus}), who has not started since her victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff at Hollywood Park Nov. 8, went three furlongs in :39 4/5 Thursday. Regarding the filly's first start of '98, Mott said, "We don't have a plan set for her yet."

Escena (Strawberry Road {Aus}), third behind Ajina in the Breeders' Cup Distaff, is scheduled to start next in the GII Rampart H. at Gulfstream March 1. "She's training really well," said Mott. "She breezed five furlongs in 1:03 and change at Payson Park Thursday. We're really happy with her."

Local News, Australia:

New Zealand Derby winner **Zonda (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}) failed in his bid to land the Australian Triple Crown when he was beaten in Saturday's second leg of the series, the G2 \$333,000 A.A.M.I. Classic over 1 1/8-miles at Caulfield in Melbourne. Starting as the 8-13 favorite, Zonda, who had won the first leg, the G2 Alister Clark S. over a mile at Moonee Valley in Melbourne, was beaten 2 3/4-lengths by the Leon MacDonald-trained 11-1 shot **Gold Guru (Aus)** (Geiger Counter), with **El Mirada (Aus)** (El Moxie) claiming the second spot, just as he had done in the Alister Clark. This was a major reversal of form, as Gold Guru had finished only seventh in the Moonee Valley race. Despite this defeat, Zonda's trainer Roger James still intends to let the gelding take his chance in the G1 \$666,000 Cadbury Guineas over 1 1/4-miles at Flemington March 9, which is also Gold Guru's target now. "You could still see the best of Zonda over the mile and a quarter at Flemington," said James.

Four-year-old gelding **Singing The Blues (Aus)** (Bluebird) scored an upset victory in the G1 \$149,850 Oakleigh Plate over 5 1/2 furlongs at Caulfield Saturday, giving trainer Jon Inglis and jockey Chad Davies their first-ever Group 1 success. The 16-1 shot took his career record to 11 wins from 18 starts and will now aim for the G1 \$333,000 Newmarket H. over six furlongs at Flemington in Melbourne March 7. "Some trainers at home told me we had no chance of winning a race in Melbourne," said Inglis. "I wonder what they're saying now!" The disappointment of the race was the 5-4 favorite **General Nediym (Aus)** (Nediym {Ire}), winner of 11 of his 13 lifetime starts. He set a fast pace, but faltered badly and finished almost last.
