BREEDERS' CUP DISTAFF PURSE RAISED TO \$2 MILLION The purse of the Breeders' Cup Distaff has been increased from \$1 million to \$2 million, it was announced yesterday by Breeders' Cup Ltd. The purse increase will become effective with this year's Breeders' Cup Championship at Churchill Downs, bringing total purses for the day to \$12 million. The raise in the Distaff, which carried a purse of \$1 million from its inception in 1984 through last year, becomes the second such purse increase in the past three years. In 1996, the purse of the Breeders' Cup Classic was raised from \$3 million to \$4 million. The Distaff becomes the second richest race on the program, along with the \$2 million Breeders' Cup Turf. "Our Board has long sought to increase earnings opportunities for fillies and mares," said D.G. Van Clief Jr., president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. "The \$1 million increase for the Distaff is consistent with that approach. We are very pleased to raise the purse for a race that has provided the sport with some of its greatest moments."

KEENELAND CATALOGS 160 FOR APRIL SALE Keeneland officials have catalogued 160 horses--82 colts and 78 fillies--for their sixth annual April Two-Year-Olds In Training Sale. The sale will be held in Lexington, Kentucky Tuesday, April 14, beginning at 3 p.m. Breezing and galloping previews will be held Monday, April 6 and Monday, April 13. Videotapes of the workouts will be available for viewing in the sales pavilion. The April catalog may also be found on the Internet at Keeneland's website, www.keeneland.com/sales/apr98/cat.html. Distribution of printed copies of the catalog will begin March 9. Notable graduates in the sale's short history have been three-year-old champion **Thunder Gulch** (Gulch) and GI Kentucky Oaks winner **Gal in a Ruckus** (Bold Ruckus).

SPORTSMAN'S PARK REDUCES TAKEOUT In an effort to give more to its fans in 1998, National Jockey Club has reduced its takeout from 17 percent to 14 percent on all win, place and show wagers made on live races at Sportsman's Park. Fourteen percent is the lowest takeout rate for win, place and show wagers offered by any racecourse in the nation. "We believe that the takeout amount has always been a serious issue to our horseplayers," said National Jockey Club Chief Executive Officer Ed Duffy. "(Lowering the takeout for) all win, place and show wagers placed at our facility goes toward letting them know how important they are to us." In addition to the reduced takeout, NJC is reducing Clubhouse admission from \$4.25 to \$3.00 and keeping Grandstand admission free. Sportsman's Park's 1998 Thoroughbred race meet begins March 1 and runs through June 30.

BIG 'CAP NOTES Jockey Gary Stevens, the regular rider of both **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) and **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois), reflected yesterday on his decision Tuesday to stick with Silver Charm in the \$1 million Santa Anita H. March 7. "It was probably the most difficult decision of my career," Stevens said. "I feel good about having done it and have no apprehensions. I also think they made a good choice in getting Pat Day to ride Gentlemen. Pat will fit this horse like a glove. It should be a hell of a horse race." The Hall of Fame jockey added, "Both horses have meant a great deal to me, but it would have been very difficult to take off of a horse that won the Kentucky Derby and Preakness. Silver Charm has so much raw ability. I really don't know if he's capable of beating Gentlemen right now. He may have to continue improving, but I definitely think he is capable of doing it." As for trainer Richard Mandella's choice to put Pat Day in the irons aboard the six-year-old Gentlemen, Mandella said, "Pat and I are very good friends. We worked together at Farrell Jones' farm (Riverside Thoroughbred Farm) 25 years ago. We've never been in the same place at the same time. I've always said I'd get him out here to ride a good horse, and I hope it works out." Gentlemen prepped for the Big 'Cap Monday at Hollywood Park with a five furlong breeze in 1:01 2/5. In other Big 'Cap news, trainer Mel Stute said yesterday that GII Palos Verdes H. winner **Funontherun** (Runaway Groom) will skip the 1 1/4-mile event and run instead in the seven furlong GII San Carlos H. the same day. "It wouldn't be to his benefit to go a mile and a quarter right now," Stute said, "especially against those two horses."

BOOM TOWNER RETIRED Owner Barry Schwartz has announced the retirement of 10-year-old gelding **Boom Towner** (Obligato), who will be pensioned to Schwartz's 700-acre Stonewall Farm in Granite Springs, New York. "He is a very special horse," said Schwartz. "I claimed him on the opening day of Belmont in September, 1994 and he went on to win three stakes for me." The gelding made his last start February 4, finishing fourth in a \$35,000 claiming race at Aqueduct. Boom Towner was claimed from Schwartz last June 27 for \$22,500; he claimed him back six starts later for \$18,000. Boom Towner retires with 29 wins, four of them in graded stakes, from 82 starts and earnings of \$962,390. His graded stakes victories included the GIII Toboggan H. in 1992 and 1995 and the GIII Sport Page H. and GIII Boojum H., both in 1993. "This is Barry's first pensioner, and I think it shows a great face about racing," said Mike Hushion, who trained Boom Towner for Schwartz. "You read about people not caring about horses after they race, but here is someone taking care of a horse who did good things for him. Not everybody has a farm like Barry's, but people can donate to groups like the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation because most people in racing care a great deal about the horses."

Coming off a three-month break, the second choice raced near the back of the pack early on and unleashed a powerful stretch rally to catch Woven Silk, who was making her American debut, in the final stages.

Local News, Gulfstream:

Three-year-old **Sweetsouthern** (Saint Ballado), who was forced to miss the Feb. 21 Fountain of Youth S. due to a small tear in the tendon sheath of his right front leg, will be out of training for about a month, according to trainer Leo Azpurua Jr. "He's going to be alright," said Azpurua. "It's just going to take some time. He'll miss the Florida Derby also, but there are a lot of good races down the road. There's never a good time for these things to happen, but this is the worst time."

Last year's GI Turf Classic winner **Val's Prince** (Eternal Prince) breezed four furlongs on the turf in :51 flat yesterday en route to an intended start in the GI Pan American H. March 2.

Local News, Fair Grounds:

Fair Grounds' purses will be raised for the third time this season, effective this Friday, according to Director of Racing and Racing Secretary Mervin Muniz. All purses, excluding stakes races, will be raised by \$1,500, making the minimum claiming purse now worth \$10,000, with top allowance purses carrying a value of \$40,000. The raise comes just 30 days after purses on all races were boosted 10 percent and most major stakes received significant increases.

Local News, Sportsman's Park:

As part of this year's live telecast of the May 9 Pimlico Special, ABC Sports has also reached an agreement to provide exclusive live coverage of the 41st running of the \$500,000 Illinois Derby at Sportsman's Park. The May 9 telecast is scheduled to start at 4 p.m. ET.

Local News, Illinois:

The Illinois Lottery developed a four-ticket instant game series named Derby Dollars designed to keep horse racing fans entertained outside of the racetrack. March 1, 1998, in conjunction with the opening of Sportsman's Park, the Lottery will introduce its fourth and final ticket of the racetrack series--the Sportsman's Park Derby Dollars instant ticket. Featuring four state racetracks, including Arlington, Fairmount Park, Hawthorne and now Sportsman's, Derby Dollars tickets cost \$1 each. Players must match "their numbers" with the "winning numbers" and can win up to three times on each ticket for a \$10,000 top prize. The overall odds of winning a prize are one in 3.32.

Local News, Oaklawn:

Silver Goblin (Silver Ghost), the seven-year-old millionaire gelding making a bid to come out of retirement, could see racing action by mid-March, according to owner Al Horton. Silver Goblin, unraced since a sixth-place finish in the 1996 Remington Park Sprint Championship H., didn't take to retirement, according to trainer Kenny Smith. "He just wasn't happy being retired and on the farm," said Smith of his multiple-graded stakes winner. "He is happier on the racetrack, so we brought him back."

Local News, Turfway Park:

Overnight purses will be increased five percent, effective with last night's racing, Turfway Park officials announced yesterday. The increase is the third this month, following similar raises Feb. 1 and Feb. 15. Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund monies and all stakes purses are not affected by the hike. "Our business levels continue to remain constant," said Turfway President Mark Simendinger. "I probably should have raised purses 10 percent last time, but in this business it's sometimes best to be cautious. I'm just glad to be in a position to announce another increase."

Local News, Santa Anita Park:

Trainer Tim Pinfield said three-year-old filly **Nijinsky's Passion** (Nijinsky's Table), winner of the GIII Santa Ynez S. Jan. 25, will point for the GI \$250,000 Santa Anita Oaks Sunday, March 15. "She's doing so well right now," Pinfield said. "She runs well here, so it makes sense to stay." Another Santa Anita Oaks hopeful, **Marie J** (Mr. Prospector), drilled six furlongs in 1:12 4/5 Wednesday. The \$1 million Barretts' March two-year-old purchase was most recently sixth in the GI Hollywood Starlet Dec. 13. "I backed off her after the Starlet because she kind of had a nervous breakdown on me," said trainer Bob Baffert. "But she's back and doing well."

Deputy Commander (Deputy Minister) breezed five furlongs in 1:01 3/5 Wednesday. "It was an average work, overall," trainer Wally Dollase said. "We're just waiting to see what happens with the Big 'Cap. As things stand now, we're going to New Orleans." Dollase has said that if both Gentlemen and Silver Charm run in the March 7 Santa Anita H., he will ship Deputy Commander to Fair Grounds for the \$500,000 New Orleans H. March 8. If either Gentlemen or Silver Charm should drop out of the Big 'Cap picture, Deputy Commander would stay in California to contest the \$1 million race.

A pair of hopefuls for this Sunday's GII San Rafael S. worked at Santa Anita yesterday. **Magical** (GB) (Magic Ring {Ire}), winner of a 1 1/16-mile Santa Anita allowance Jan. 30, drilled three-eighths in :35 2/5, while undefeated **Mr. Fortune** (Crafty Prospector), who will be making his stakes debut Sunday, covered five furlongs in 1:03 2/5.

Golden Arches (Fr) (Common Grounds {GB}), one-for-one in '98 after winning the GII San Gorgonio H. Jan. 17, worked five panels yesterday in 1:01 1/5. **Imroz** (Nureyev) went the same distance in 1:02 3/5 at Hollywood Park. Both four-year-old fillies are pointing to this Saturday's GII Buena Vista H. at a mile on the turf.

Also on Wednesday's worktab, **Bienvenido** (Arg) (Friul {Arg}) breezed a half-mile in :50 2/5 for the GII San Luis Rey March 22, and three-year-old **Skeaping** (Storm Bird) went a mile in 1:41 1/5 in preparation for the GIII El Camino Real Derby at Bay Meadows March 7.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

LIL'S LAD (c, 3, Pine Bluff-Totemic, by Vanlandingham)

Recognized for some time now as one of the most talented members of his generation, Lil's Lad gained a first stakes win when defeating Coronado's Quest to take Saturday's GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park. Lil's Lad is by the 1992 Preakness S. winner Pine Bluff. A son of Danzig, Pine Bluff began a little slowly at stud, but with I Ain't Bluffing, a 1998 Grade I winner from his first crop, and Lil's Lad in his second, he is enjoying a major resurgence this year.

When discussing the pedigree of I Ain't Bluffing, we mentioned that it represents the very successful combination of Crafty Admiral and Case Ace, a pair which both own the important Teddy/Commando cross (twice in Crafty Admiral). This is particularly apparent when Danzig (dam by a son of Crafty Admiral) meets Raise a Native (dam by Case Ace).

In the pedigree of I Ain't Bluffing, Danzig appears through Pine Bluff, and Raise a Native through her broodmare sire Raise a Cup. Similarly, a look at the pedigree of Lil's Lad reveals that his granddam is by Fappiano, whose sire, Mr. Prospector, is bred on the same Raise a Native/Nashua cross as Raise a Cup. Pine Bluff might be particularly prone to act this way, since he has a double of Crafty Admiral's sire, Fighting Fox, and therefore extra Teddy/Commando.

Actually, Lil's Lad's pedigree is full of interesting twists, and another one involves the background of Cox's Ridge, who appears here as sire of Vanlandingham (broodmare sire of Lil's Lad). Look into the third and fourth generations of Cox's Ridge and you will find Royal Charger (by a son of Pharos out of a Solario mare), Ballyogan (by Fair Trial, by Fairway, a brother to Pharos, and out of a Solario mare) and Phideas (by Pharos out of Imagery, a sister to Solario). Pine Bluff's granddam is by Rambunctious, who combines Fair Trial (by Fairway) and Solario, and his third dam is by Tulyar, who combines Pharos and Solario. Oddly enough, the sets of siblings Pharos/Fairway and Solario/Imagery are themselves linked by a brother/sister combination, as Pharos/Fairway carry the Derby winner Sainfoin, and Solario and Imagery have Sainfoin's sister, Sierra.

By the way, it is worth noting that Rambunctious and Cox's Ridge could also be brought together by combining Gulch (dam by Rambunctious) and Cox's Ridge. Gulch's son, Thunder Gulch, has some strains which might work particularly well with Cox's Ridge.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

When planning a mating involving a closely inbred mare, one of the tried and trusted techniques is to use a stallion which picks up something behind the close inbreeding. For a textbook example, one could wish for no better than Sunday's GII Davona Dale S. winner **Diamond On the Run (f, 3, Kris S.-Barbara Sue, by Big Spruce)**. Her dam is inbred 3x4 to Prince John, a son of Princequillo, and her sire, Kris S., is out of a daughter of Princequillo. We are always keen on a pattern which involves inbreeding to the broodmare sire of a sire, and in the case of Kris S., this pattern is found in more than a quarter of his stakes winners. We should also note that Diamond On the Run also carries Ambiorix, a half-brother to Turn-to (the great-grand sire of Kris S.). Ambiorix appears in eight of the first 42 stakes winners to represent Kris S., which again is higher than one would expect by chance.

The victory by the promising **Comic Strip (c, 3, Red Ransom-Now That's Funny, by Saratoga Six)** in Sunday's Risen Star S. pointed to an interesting trend. To date, three of Red Ransom's best sons--Trail City, English juvenile star Sri Pekan and Comic Strip himself--have owned very similar distaff pedigrees. Trail City is out of an Alydar mare, Comic Strip out of a mare by a son of Alydar and Sri Pekan out of a mare by Alydar's close relative Son Ange. The success of the Red Ransom/Alydar cross is most likely linked to the fact that Red Ransom is by Roberto, and the dams of both Roberto and Alydar combine Nasrullah with three-quarters relatives bred on the Bull Lea/Blue Larkspur cross.
