BARRETT'S MARCH OPENS TODAY A total of 245 two-year-olds have been catalogued for the ninth annual Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training which opens today at the Hinds Pavilion at Fairplex in Pomona, California. Sires represented in the catalog include Belong to Me, Capote, Danzig, Dehere, Deputy Minister, Forty Niner, Gilded Time, Holy Bull, Mr. Prospector, Nureyev, Phone Trick, Seattle Slew and Strike the Gold. Also offered will be a half sister, by Gone West, to multiple Grade I stakes winning millionaire Goodbye Halo (Halo); a half brother, by Holy Bull, to Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Meadow Star (Meadowlake); a half brother, by Seattle Slew, to Champion Older Horse Blushing John (Blushing Groom {Fr}); and a full brother to Grade I stakes winner Honor Glide (Honor Grades). At the sale's training preview yesterday, the fastest eighth-mile work was turned in by hip number 152. The bay filly, by End Sweep--Caramel Desert (Desert Wine) and consigned by Mark Casse, agent for Mockingbird Farm, Inc., covered the distance in :10.27. The fastest quarter-mile work was turned in by hip number 4. By Capote--Mary's Spirit (Mr. Prospector), the grey filly went the distance in :21.51. She is from the consignment of Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds, agent. The Bidding begins today at 3 p.m. and Wednesday's second and final session begins at 7 p.m.

NEW STEWARD FOR JOCKEY CLUB Longtime Thoroughbred owner and breeder Wheelock Whitney has joined the Board of Stewards of The Jockey Club, filling the position vacated by John Hettinger at the expiration of his four-year term. Whitney, a member of The Jockey Club since 1974, is chairman of Whitney Management Company, a financial management firm based in Minneapolis. Jockey Club chairman Ogden Mills Phipps was also re-elected to a four-year term as steward of the non-profit Thoroughbred breed registry.

RECORD DEL MAR STAKES SCHEDULE

RELEASED Del Mar unveiled the stakes schedule for its 1998 summer meeting yesterday. Worth a record \$5.4 million, the 27-race program is highlighted by the \$1 million Pacific Classic on August 15. The headliner, for three-year-olds and up going a mile and one-quarter, has been shifted from the third to the fourth weekend of the seaside season this year. In addition to the Pacific Classic, the seven-week meet includes a trio of Grade I turf events at nine furlongs--the August 1 \$300,000 GI Ramona H. for fillies and mares, the August 2 \$300,000 GI Eddie Read H. for three-year-olds and up and the August 23 \$250,000 GI Del Mar Oaks for three-year-old fillies. Each of the 27 stakes races has a purse of at least \$100,000. The previous record amount offered for regular stakes at a Del Mar meeting was the \$5 million presented for 24 races during the 1996 season. Last year, the track served up 23 regular stakes worth \$4.9 million. Besides its four Grade I races, the track offers eight Grade II stakes and seven Grade IIIs, for a total of 19 graded events. Del Mar's 59th Thoroughbred racing season opens its summer stand on Wednesday, July 22 and the meet runs through Wednesday, Sept. 9.

FASIG-TIPTON TO OFFER RADIOGRAPHS Fasig-Tipton will introduce a repository system for radiographs at its sales of yearlings and foals, beginning with its yearling sale in Kentucky on July 22. The auction company's conditions of sale, which have previously contained a limited warranty for certain, specific bone injury or disease, will be amended to reflect the new policy. "There have been recent significant advancements in the science of equine radiology," Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson said in explaining the company's decision. "It has become an almost universal tool in pre- and post-purchase examination and we are seeing a wider range of veterinary opinion on the significance of pathology. Our research indicates the repository for radiographs removes much of the controversy in these evaluations and establishes a fairer playing field for sellers and buyers. In addition, our change will bring more uniformity to the market, particularly in Central Kentucky where so much Thoroughbred auction activity is centered."

BREEDERS' CUP ANNOUNCES NATIONAL STAKES Breeders' Cup Ltd. announced the first half of its 1998 National Stakes Program, the full schedule of which will feature 41 graded stakes races with purses totaling \$14.1 million. Now in its third year, this season's program consists of 84 stakes races cooperatively funded by Breeders' Cup and 46 participating racetracks. In National stakes, Breeders' Cup-nominated horses run for the full purse, while non-nominated horses compete only for the purse money provided by the racing association. This year, the Breeders' Cup has allocated \$5.6 million in purses and awards for the program. Among the 84 races in this year's series, 23 have received a \$100,000 allocation from the Breeders' Cup, an increase of four such allocations over last year.

◆ FOREIGN ◆

Local News, England:

In order to maintain its standing as one of the world's leading all-age turf races, officials at Ascot Racecourse announced Monday an increase of £100,000 (\$162,760) to the value of the mile-and-a-half G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., which was won last year by the Godolphin-owned **Swain (Ire)** (Nashwan). This year's edition of the race, to be run on Saturday July 25, will now carry total added money of £600,000 (\$976,563).

Local News, France:

Louis Romanet, a leading administrative figure in European racing for the past two decades, has been appointed to the newly-created post of Managing Director of France-Galop, the ruling racing authority in France. Romanet is currently president of the International Federation of Horse Racing Authorities.

Local News, Australia:

The 1997 Victoria Derby winner **Second Coming (NZ)** (Oak Ridge {Fr}), trained in Adelaide by New Zealander Mike Moroney, is a late entry for the G1 \$832,501 Australian Cup over a mile and a quarter at Flemington in Melbourne next Monday, March 9. Despite his defeat in last Saturday's G2 St. George S. at Caulfield, Australian bookmakers have 1997 Foster's Melbourne Cup winner **Might and Power (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}) at odds as short as 5-4 for the Australian Cup, with the St. George S. winner **Dane Ripper (Aus)** (Danehill) at 9-4. Second Coming is quoted at 15-1.

The three-year-old New Zealand-trained filly **Tycoon Lil (NZ)** (Last Tycoon {Ire}), already winner of the G1 New Zealand One Thousand Guineas, the G1 New Zealand Oaks and the New Zealand Filly Of The Year series, ships to Australia on March 14 for the G1 Canterbury Guineas in Sydney. Owned by Peter Walker and trained by Colin Jillings, Tycoon Lil has a race record of six wins and five placings from eleven lifetime starts and on her last start won the February 7 G2 Cambridge Classic at Te Rapa in New Zealand.

Snowy conditions forced the cancelation of the Sunday card at Nakayama Racecourse.

Local News, Gulfstream Park:

Cape Town (Seeking the Gold), a disappointing fourth in the GII Fountain of Youth, worked five furlongs in 1:00 1/5. "He worked great this morning," said Jerry Barton, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "We were very happy with it." The colt will start next in the March 14 GI Florida Derby.
