### SILVER CHARM BOUND FOR DUBAI?

The *Daily Racing Form* reports that **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck), forced to miss Saturday's GI Santa Anita H. with a bruised foot, has bounced back so fast he is likely to ship out of California Friday, heading to Dubai for the \$4 million World Cup March 28. "I discussed it (Monday morning) with Bob Lewis, and we're going to dinner to go over the plans and discuss the pros and cons," trainer Bob Baffert told the *Form*. "But Mr. Lewis lets me drive the bus. The horse is a bull right now, and I've got to find a race for him fast. We removed the heel nails on his shoe Friday. We soaked the foot on Saturday, and Sunday morning he was perfectly sound. I jogged him two miles (Monday) and he didn't show anything. After he cooled out, I put him back in the stall for a while, then jogged him on the hard road and nothing. With that in mind, I got to thinking about it...I could wait for a race in this country, and he could wind up getting hurt again. If he's ready, I hate to miss the opportunity. If he should go over there and get hurt, I'll take full responsibility." Baffert added that, if his colt makes the trip to the Middle East, he will be rested when he returns to the States, gearing up in time for the Del Mar meet.

### DEPUTY COMMANDER OUT OF DUBAI CUP

A day after watching his star four-year-old finish a lackluster seventh in the Gill New Orleans H., trainer Wally Dollase reported that **Deputy Commander** (Deputy Minister) will not make the trip to the March 28 Dubai World Cup. Dollase had expected a big effort out of the 1997 GI Travers and GI Super Derby winner and was stunned when Deputy Commander finished next to last as the 4-5 favorite. "I'm not sure what happened to him, other than maybe it was a virus," Dollase said. "When he gets back (to California) we'll do tests and take X-rays. I've had quite a few viruses with horses at this time of year. (Jockey Corey Nakatani) said he knew right away he wasn't into the race. We won't be going to Dubai because I still really don't know what is wrong with him."

**MATCH SERIES RETURNS FOR '98** The Mid-Atlantic Thoroughbred Championships Series, inaugurated in 1997, will be back this year sporting the new National Thoroughbred Racing Association's "Go Baby Go" logo and even more bonuses for participating owners and trainers. The Series features seven races in five divisions for a total of 35 events from April to October. The bonus pool has been increased to \$600,000, with the owners of the top 10 point-earning horses dividing \$250,000, the trainers of the top 10 point getters dividing \$100,000, and the top three point-earning trainers splitting \$150,000. Divisional champs earn bonuses of \$20,000 each. The MATCH Series races will be held at tracks in Maryland, Delaware, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Virginia; finals in all five divisions will be run throughout the region on October 3. "The inaugural Series last year exceeded our expectations," said MATCH creator Alan Foreman. "We are encouraged by the enthusiastic response we have received and look forward to an even stronger and more competitive series this year. I think we have created a signature event for the industry." MATCH Series races will be televised on *espn2*'s "2Day at the Races," and plans call for a half-hour special on the divisional championships to be broadcast October 4. The Gill Pennsylvania Derby, sixth race in the three-year-old distance division, will be the East Coast leg of the "America's Day At The Races" Coast-to-Coast Triple on Labor Day.

### HERB McCARRON DEAD

Herb McCarron, the father of Hall of Fame jockey Chris McCarron and jockey-turned-trainer Gregg McCarron, died Monday morning at South Shore Hospital in S. Weymouth, Massachusetts after a long illness. He was 76. McCarron served as a court stenographer for the U.S. Navy for over 30 years, retiring in 1974. He was active in the Knights of Columbus and served as Executive Secretary for the state council from 1975 until 1991. In addition to Chris and Gregg, he is survived by four sons, three daughters, 19 grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. His wife Helen died August 19, 1997. A wake will be held Wed. at the Dolan Funeral Home in East Milton; a funeral mass will be held Thurs. at St. Elizabeth's Church, also in East Milton. **DANE RIPPER WINS AUSTRALIAN CUP** Bart Cummings' four-year-old filly **Dane Ripper (Aus)** (Danehill) became a leading candidate for Horse Of The Year honors in Australia when she annihilated her field in Monday's G1 \$832,500 Australian Cup over a mile and a quarter at Flemington in Melbourne. She also gave her master trainer his 12th win in the event. In the absence of Foster's Melbourne Cup winner **Might And Power (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}), who sustained a minor leg injury in training, Dane Ripper, ridden by jockey Steven King, started 7-4 favorite and raced in the fourth spot early, moving to the front as they straightened for home and quickening brilliantly to win by 4 ½ lengths. Dane Ripper was winning her third Group 1 stakes and her second of the current season, following her 40-1 upset win in the G1 Cox Plate at Moonee Valley last October. Cummings will now run her for the first time over a mile and a half when she contests the G1 Mercedes Classic at Rosehill in Sydney April 4. "I knew she was pretty good and she seems to be getting better every day," said Cummings, who was winning his 238th Group race. "I don't think a mile and a half will worry her at weight-for-age in the Mercedes."

### Local News: Gulfstream Park

A tornado touched down just a half-mile west of Gulfstream Park on Monday morning at 5:45 a.m. The twister knock out the plate glass windows of the popular track restaurant Nick's, owned by the father of trainer George Gianos, but on the whole the damage was minimal. Trainer Howie Tesher claims a small tornado touched down in front of his stalls. "I was sitting in my office when this white funnel touched the ground. And just like in a John Wayne film, all the horses started to whinny. I thought I was in a western movie," he said. As a result of the storm, the track was closed for training for an hour; only three horses made the work tab.

One of those working was Florida Derby hopeful **Cape Town** (Seeking the Gold), who went five-eighths in 1:00 3/5 before the rain started. "We were lucky to get out there before the bad weather," said Jerry Barton, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He did it very well. It was exactly what we were looking for. He went real easy and came back in good order."

### Local News: Hialeah

Is Hialeah on its last legs? "Hialeah is on a resuscitator," owner John Brunetti is quoted as saying in the March 8 edition of the *South Florida Business Journal's* Broward Edition. Hialeah marketing director Steve Bovo recently told 200 young professionals at a weekend seminar that the track is on the verge of closure. But Gulfstream president Doug Donn told the publication, "Hialeah wants to survive at the expense or failure of someone else. There have been various attempts to try and help which we've supported. They simply haven't responded." One way in which Hialeah has failed to keep pace with Calder and Gulfstream is in the area of improvements. While Brunetti claims that he has spent roughly \$500,000 on improvements annually since 1992, annual reports filed with the state show the track has spent just \$838,028 over that six-year period, during which Gulfstream Park spent \$7.89 million and Calder spent \$7.26 million on their facilities.
