FAVORITE TRICK EXTENDS STREAK IN

SWALE It was business as usual as undefeated Horse of the Year **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick) made his much anticipated three-year-old debut in yesterday's seven-furlong GIII Swale S. at Gulfstream. Bet down to 3-10, the dark bay sat fourth through a half in :44 4/5, found running room between horses as they headed into the stretch and drew off to a 1 3/4-length victory while kept to the task by jockey Pat Day. "He wasn't as enthusiastic and as easily placed as he was in the Breeders' Cup, but that was a mile and a sixteenth," said Day, who has been aboard Favorite Trick for every one his nine career starts. "They ran very quick in front of us. It made us work a little bit to hold our position. I had to work on him a little bit and he finally kicked on. In a matter of a couple of jumps, he made the lead and pointed his trademark ears straight forward." Trainer Bill Mott, who picked up Favorite Trick from Pat Byrne after his Horse of the Year campaign, was relieved to get the first win out of the way. "I think this was as good for me as it was for the horse," he said. "He had to show that he could win for our connections." Mott added his colt would go next in the GII Toyota Blue Grass April 11. (Swale S. chart, p3-4)

"DERBY" DUEL DECIDED BY STEWARDS Three-for-three on the year and looking for number four, **Lil's Lad** (Pine Bluff) was bet down to 3-5 in yesterday's GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park. He got it, crossing the finish line a nose to the good, only to have the victory seized by the stewards. **Cape Town** (Seeking the Gold), who missed by the bob of the head, was awarded the win after Lil's Lad drifted out and brushed with him during a fierce final furlong. The crowd's choice was hounded by **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner) through a half in :46 and lost the lead after three-quarters in 1:10 as the pair battled nine lengths in front of the field. But Lil's Lad came back, breaking one heart at the top of the stretch, to be joined by Cape Town as that hot early pace steamed his legs into spaghetti. Weary but iron willed, the bay held on despite heading to the middle of the track, only to lose the race when the inquiry went against him. "I felt at the quarter pole I had it," said jockey Shane Sellers, rider of Cape Town. "When you're close to the finish and you get knocked around like that, it tests the horse's ability." Added winning trainer D. Wayne Lukas, "I think (the stewards) did the right thing. I believe that we would have won by over a head with a clean trip."

Cape Town ended his juvenile campaign with a win in the GIII Brown & Williamson Kentucky Jockey Club S. and started 1998 on the same note, taking the GIII Holy Bull S. January 17. But the colt faltered badly in his latest attempt, finishing fourth and last in the GII Fountain of Youth S. February 21. Facing Fountain of Youth hero and heavy favorite Lil's Lad once again, the well-bred bay took advantage of a torrid early pace to challenge that rival in the final furlong, missing by a nose but seeing his number go up via a stewards' disqualification. Undefeated in three previous sophomore starts, Lil's Lad dueled with **CORONADO'S QUEST** (Forty Niner) for six furlongs. He managed to put that one away as they came into the stretch, but drifted out despite jockey Jerry Bailey's right-handed whip to brush Cape Town in the closing yards and cause the reversal. "You feel bad...when a horse has to come down," said winning trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "You wish it could be decided fair and square." As for his colt's effort in the Fountain of Youth, Lukas said, "He didn't handle the dry track. He's a big powerful horse that needs a track he can get a hold of." The top two are expected to meet again in the GII Toyota Blue Grass at Keeneland April 11. Coronado's Quest, who was up to his old tricks after being saddled in the tunnel and broke free briefly after freezing as he was led to the track, drove up to take the lead after six furlongs, but faded to fifth under Robbie Davis, who subbed for the injured Mike Smith.

JOCKEY MIKE SMITH INJURED Mike Smith, who had ridden the winner in three of the last four Florida Derbies, lost his chance to add a fourth when he was injured in a spill in the ninth race at Gulfstream yesterday afternoon. Riding the 3-5 favorite **Seaview** (Crafty Prospector), Smith was thrown when the horse broke down while vying for the lead at the eighth pole in the seven-furlong allowance race. Smith was taken to the hospital, where he was diagnosed with a broken collarbone. His Florida Derby mount, **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner), stalked the early pace, put a head in front after three-quarters, but tired badly and finished fifth under jockey Robbie Davis.

Parlay won her first two starts at two before finishing fourth in her lone graded try, the GII Astarita S. at Aqueduct. Two-for-five at three, including a win in Aqueduct's Dearly Precious S., she then won her four-year-old debut, an Aqueduct allowance Jan. 14. Sixth last out as the 8-5 favorite in the Feb. 7 Correction H., she surprised as the fourth choice here with a wire-to-wire driving victory. "This race set up for her a little better than last time, when she resented getting a lot of dirt kicked in her face in behind other horses," said Loretta Lusteg, assistant to trainer John Kimmel. "I think she likes it better racing on the lead and she got that kind of trip today."

The 5 1/2-length winner of the GIII Santa Catalina at this distance in his last start Feb. 1, Artax solidified his stature as a leading Triple Crown contender with a hard-fought victory. Breaking a step slowly, he was hustled out for the lead while previously undefeated Prosperous Bid pressed him to his outside. Real Quiet, coming off a disappointing eighth in his last start, the Jan. 18 Golden Gate Derby in the slop, sat just off the pair in third. At the top of the stretch, Prosperous Bid began to tire and Real Quiet launched his bid but could not get by the winner, who drifted in slightly near the wire but held on gamely for the victory. The result was a reverse of the pair's last meeting, the Dec. 14 GI Hollywood Futurity, where Real Quiet was a one-length victor over Artax. "He's trained great up to this race and he looks like he's getting better with every race," said winning trainer Randy Bradshaw, who added that his colt had been coughing the past couple of days, which he said could have explained his fatigue near the wire. "I think he'll be a little better next time," he added. "We're going to stay here and run in the (April 4, GI) Santa Anita Derby." The trainers of both Real Quiet and Prosperous Bid said their charges may also be back for that race. Jockey Kent Desormeaux, who rode Real Quiet, predicted a different outcome down the road, saying, "They won the battle, but we'll win the war." Previously undefeated SEA OF SECRETS (Storm Cat), who came into this race off three straight wins including a victory in the Feb. 7 GII San Vicente, had skipped the March 2 GII San Rafael with a high white count. The colt, off at odds of 9-2, stumbled at the start, settled back along the rail and had little left for the stretch drive.

Making his first start since a runaway win in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile November 8, Favorite Trick shipped down from Payson Park and picked up right where he left off. The overwhelming choice of the Gulfstream crowd, the 1997 Horse of the Year was close to the pace from the start, found a seam to run through to take command at the top of the stretch and edged clear to his ninth straight victory. "I thought he looked good," said trainer Bill Mott. "He was a little hot, but that's to be expected after shipping in and staying in the holding barn. His behavior was good. He seemed calm and collected." Added jockey Pat Day, "He's an older horse now. You lose a little youthful enthusiasm from two to three. He has filled out. I think he's more horse this year than he was last year. He showed a lot of courage busting between horses like that. He's been in relatively tight quarters, but not like today. I was real proud of him."

"We knew that the two speed horses (Subordination and Donthelumbertrader) were the two to beat," said trainer Christophe Clement. "(Jockey) Jose (Santos) knew to rate right off them. At the quarter pole, we had something left to beat them." Clement said he would call the colt's owners today before planning his next start.

Never far off the early pace, he launched his bid on the turn, hit the stretch with a 2 1/2-length lead and increased his advantage through the stretch to win going away. "I had a lot of confidence in him before the race," said winning trainer Frank Alexander. "He's going to keep getting better."

Longshot **Admired (Aus)** (Covetous {Aus}), off at 20-1, was another nose away in third. Freedman, who has won four of the past five G1 Golden Slippers, may saddle his Sires Produce S. duo in the big juvenile event on April 4, along with his G1 Blue Diamond S. winner **Danelagh (Aus)** (Danehill) and the very promising filly **Compulsion (Aus)** (Danehill).

Three-year-old New Zealand-bred and trained filly **Tycoon Lil (NZ)** (Last Tycoon {Ire}), already winner of the G1 One Thousand Guineas and the G1 New Zealand Oaks, made her first trek to Australia a successful one when she blitzed the field in the G1 Canterbury Guineas over a mile and an eighth in Sydney Saturday.
