HIALEAH CANCELS AGAIN The only thing charging through the stretch at Hialeah Friday was a yellow Caterpillar road grader. For the second day in a row, jockeys canceled racing at the South Florida track. Hialeah's General Manager Mike Mackey said he called in local contractor Ralph Sessa to try and overcome the problems troubling the track's jockey colony. "We are scraping the cushion all the way down to the pad," Mackey said yesterday. "Then we will replace the cushion around the whole track. We hope to be finished by training time (Saturday)." Jockey Guild representative Gary Boulanger said, "There are two problems. The hole (a six foot by eight foot depression near the eighth pole caused by excessive rain) and the temporary rail." The aluminum rail usually used on the turf course was strung from the top of the stretch to past the finish line and out about 15 feet on the main track. It was secured to the permanent rail with rope. A jockey was seen pushing on the rail with his hand yesterday morning and watching it rock back and forth. That was enough to convince riders to call it a day. Trainer Robert Durso, who is sending his wife's horse **Frisk Me Now** (Mister Frisky) in today's Gill Widener, said he'll run the horse as long as the track is okay.

EVENT OF THE YEAR TO JIM BEAM Undefeated three-year-old **Event Of The Year** (Seattle Slew) worked five-eighths in a bullet :59 2/5 under jockey Russell Baze yesterday at Bay Meadows and will ship to Kentucky today for the Gill Jim Beam S. at Turfway Park March 28. Explaining the decision to go in the Beam, trainer Jerry Hollendorfer said, "It looked like a good spot, but more importantly to us is the timing of the race. It gives us more time to prepare for the Kentucky Derby, if we do good in this race." Event of the Year, winner of the Gill El Camino Real Derby last out, will have to be supplemented to the Jim Beam for a fee of \$30,000.

Shake the Yoke (GB) (Caerleon), winner of Ascot's 1996 G1 Coronation S., returned to the races after a year's absence and lost a shoe while running sixth in a Feb. 5 Santa Anita allowance. The five-year-old mare improved to finish second, beaten only a neck, in the Feb. 28 Gil Buena Vista H. last time out. **Fiji (GB)** (Rainbow Quest) won her debut in England in Sept. '96 and returned to win a listed stakes at Chepstow in July '97. The four-year-old filly was second in her American debut last December, but rebounded with two allowance wins, most recently a nine-length victory Feb. 19. Previously owned by Prince Fahd Salman, she was given as a gift to the daughters of his younger brother, Ahmed Salman, and will now run in The Thoroughbred Corp. colors.

Local News: Belmont Park

Smokin Mel (Phone Order), winner of the GII Gotham S. in 1997, had his first breeze of the year Wednesday morning when he went three furlongs in :38 over Belmont's fast training track. "We battled his quarter-crack problem all year, and finally he went off form," said trainer John DeStefano. "So we sent him down to Sharon Clark's farm (Rigbie Farm, Darlington, MD) and he was basically turned out for about three months. He was doing two-mile gallops on the farm, so he came to us pretty much ready to breeze." Smokin Mel's last start was a seventh-place finish in a Belmont allowance Oct. 5; DeStefano said the four-year-old will likely return during Belmont's spring/summer meeting, which begins May 13.

Local News: Sportsman's Park

Sportsman's Park may be getting into the auto racing business, according to a report in Friday's *Chicago Tribune*. Sources say the track could have a CART circuit auto race by the fall of 1999. Plans would call for the auto track to be built outside the seven-eighths of a mile Thoroughbred track, but if auto racing becomes a reality, it could mark the end of harness racing at the oval. Said Sportsman's Park Chief Operating Officer Ed Duffy, "We've been exploring (auto racing). In a couple of weeks, we'll be able to make an announcement." It is also possible that a training center will be built 30 to 40 miles from Sportsman's and the neighboring Hawthorne Race Course, just a block away, which would then allow both facilities to be used for other sports and entertainment ventures. Duffy said last fall he favored establishing a training center which would accommodate 3,000 Thoroughbreds year-round.

Local News: Santa Anita

MGSW Rajpoute (Fr) (Double Bed {Fr}), who came back from his sixth-place finish in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf with a quarter crack behind, returned to post an impressive seven-length victory in a Santa Anita allowance Thursday. "He has had a lot of problems with his feet," said trainer Ron McAnally. "He got a quarter crack in the Breeders' Cup, and we got a patch on that, and then he got another one in the front and we had to stop on him again. It was all little stuff, but we had to take care of him. We would have hated to bring him back in one of those Grade II or Grade III races, so (Thursday's) race was a good spot for him. Now, hopefully, we can live to fight another battle."

Local News: California

The California Horse Racing Board yesterday amended the state's claiming rule, reducing from 30 to 25 days the period during which a claimed horse is ineligible to run in another claiming race for less than 25 percent more than the price it was taken for. The Board was acting on a request by the California Thoroughbred Trainers, which explained that having a horse on schedule to "get out of jail" five days earlier would more closely follow condition book patterns.

The Pacific Racing Association has signed an agreement with horsemen which will allow for a reimbursement of up to \$85 per trip for horses shipping to Golden Gate Fields to run. The agreement was made possible with the assistance of the California Thoroughbred Trainers and the California Authority of Racing Fairs.

The Alameda County Fair facility will be open for stabling when Bay Meadows closes for renovations. Bay Meadows is constructing a tunnel and barn area in its infield.
