OSCAR SCHINDLER OUT OF DUBAI WORLD

CUP Oscar Schindler (Ire) (Royal Academy) will not start in the March 28 Dubai World Cup after suffering an injury to his left front tendon, leaving jockey Walter Swinburn without a mount in the race. The six-year-old, a five-time Irish champion, was preparing for his '98 debut in the World Cup. "He has incurred a slight injury to his near fore tendon, which has caused some inflammation," said trainer Kevin Prendergast. "He will be okay in time, but it is not in the interests of the horse to run him on Saturday. It has been a bitter blow, as he has been pleasing me in his build up and was loving the track at Nad Al Sheba. It would not be fair, however, to the horse or the race to run him."

TEAM USA TAKES INTERNATIONAL JOCKEY CHALLENGE

Jockey Eddie Delahoussaye led an American sweep of the final leg of Santa Anita's four-race International Jockey Challenge yesterday as Team USA came from behind to beat Team Europe, 48 ½ points to 35 ½ points. Delahoussaye also led all individual riders with 17 1/2 points, 2 ½ more than team mate Laffit Pincay Jr. and three more than French challenger Olivier Peslier, who was first in the second race of the contest. Completing the American team were Jerry Bailey and Gary Stevens; representing Europe were Mick Kinane (who captured the inaugural Challenge race), Kieren Fallon and Frankie Dettori, who bounced back to win the Gil San Luis Rey S. aboard longshot **Kessem Power (NZ)** (Kessem {NZ}). "It was great fun," said Delahoussaye, 46. "I was hoping this would be Senior Citizens' Day, and it was." Added runner-up Pincay, 51, who took the third race in the Challenge, "I hope they do this every year. Any time trainers talk about jockeys being old, I hope they remember this day. I was so happy winning my race, I felt like I had just won the Kentucky Derby." Lester Piggott, captain of Team Europe, said, "It's been a great day's racing. I thought we had it won until the last race, but the American boys swept it. Everybody enjoyed it, and I'd just like to say thank you to everyone." Team USA Captain Bill Shoemaker added, "All of our jocks rode great, and I thought the European riders were super riders. They were a little unlucky, because I guess we got the best of the draw in the last race. I enjoyed watching it...going through the whole thing." News cont. p2

TDN special correspondent Bob Baffert, in Dubai with Silver Charm for the March 28 Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba Racecourse, has agreed to share his experiences with us each day leading up to the race.

Silver Charm worked Sunday. He went three-quarters of a mile in 1:12 under my exercise rider, Pepe Aragon. That was a good work, as he hasn't run in a while. He is usually a lazy horse and does not work that well on his own, but he likes this track and it was good to blow the cobwebs out of him. He worked really good and handled the track great, so everything is looking good. It's a very tiring track, but he handled it good and got a good work out of it. He'll walk tomorrow.

Everything else is great. The weather is great. There's not a whole lot going on here. We went to a race meet tonight. They have these private racing clubs with just invited guests allowed into the track and that was sort of different. It was down the road about a half-hour away. It's a new track, a brand new facility. It's all turf racing. They had Arabians and Thoroughbreds. It was sort of neat, but it's weird watching a race and they're coming down the stretch and nobody is yelling. They're just watching. You can't bet, so there's no reason to yell.

That's about it. It's pretty quiet around here. I never went to town yesterday, never made it, so we're hoping to go tomorrow.

Loup Sauvage (Riverman), France's representative in the \$4 million Dubai World Cup, landed at Dubai International Airport Saturday evening at 9 p.m. and stretched his legs over the Nad Al Sheba racetrack for the first time Sunday morning. OBS UNDER TACK SHOW GETS UNDERWAY A colt by **Crusader Sword**--Magic Ladybug (Dominated) breezed a quarter in :22 to top the workouts at the first session of the Under Tack Show for the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Annual Open Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training, held yesterday in Ocala. The first foal out of a stakes winner, the bay, who went an eighth in :10 2/5 at the sale's Video Preview last Monday, has been named **Crusader's Magic** and will sell as hip #156. Getting the fastest furlong at the show was hip #57, a colt by **Sheikh Albadou (GB)**--Dialnineoneone (Phone Trick), who went the distance in :10 2/5, the same time he recorded last Monday. Hip #117, a colt by **Marquetry**--Intrepid Trek (Damascus) who went a quarter in :21 4/5 during the Preview, was clocked going three-eighths in :34 4/5, fastest time at that distance yesterday. The Under Tack Show concludes today from 8-11 a.m. The March Sale will be held Tuesday and Wednesday beginning at 11 a.m. daily.

SANTA YSABEL PURSE REDISTRIBUTED **Love Lock** (Silver Ghost), who came home 3 1/2 lengths in front in the Gill Santa Ysabel S. at Santa Anita January 11, has been disqualified from all purse monies in the race after testing positive for the prohibited substance Scopolamine, it was announced by the Santa Anita stewards Saturday. Second-place finisher **Nonies Dancer Ali** (Danzatore), first or second in all six starts, was awarded the winner's share of the pot, \$63,660, and earned her first graded win via the disqualification.

SPRING STORM HALTS NORTHEAST RACING Sunday's cards were canceled at Aqueduct Racetrack in New York and Suffolk Downs in Massachusetts after an early spring storm dumped several inches of snow in the Northeast. It was the first time all year racing was called off at Aqueduct, and only the second full-card cancellation for Suffolk after an unseasonably mild winter. Aqueduct's featured Gill Next Move H. will be opened up to the original nominees and run next Sunday, March 29. Racing resumes at Suffolk today and at the Big A Wednesday.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a **@** will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a **+** will denote winners who are first-time starters, an **(S)** will be used for state-bred races, a **(C)** will be used for maiden-claiming races and an **(R)** will be used for other restricted races.

Claimed for \$50,000 last August at Del Mar, **Kessem Power (NZ)** has now won six of his nine starts for his new connections. Third in the Gill Carleton F. Burke H. at Santa Anita in November, he ended '97 with allowance and high-priced claiming scores, but was unlucky in his '98 bow, clipping heels in the Gill San Luis Obispo H. and losing his rider. The New Zealand-bred bounced back to be third in the restricted San Marino H. in his latest, but was let go at 14-1 stepping up again here. With new rider **Frankie Dettori** in the irons, the dark bay was rated well off the early pace, but made steady progress to join the leaders as they swept into the stretch and outfinish favored **Storm Trooper** for his first stakes victory. "I was a little scared because I thought he was worth more than (\$50,000)," said trainer **Mike Mitchell** of the decision to make this claim. "You're always scared claiming horses. I was in the race, too, and wound up beating him that day. This is the best claim I've ever made." **Mitchell** did, however, have to be talked into running in the **San Luis Rey**. "I had him in (an allowance race Wednesday) at a mile and an eighth," he admitted. "I know he's not a mile-and-an-eighth horse, so the racing secretary (Tom Knust) asked me to look at this race. I didn't want to run here because it was equal weights, but I talked to the owner and I thought...let's take a shot. It worked out great." Added **Dettori**, "Everybody kept telling me I had a good shot. I had met the trainer in Hong Kong and he had a lot of confidence in me. It was my first win at Santa Anita, and that makes it even more special. I spent four winters in California and that was a very important time in my career. I learned so much from these riders, and to come back and finally win one is great." The winner will go next in the **GI San Juan Capistrano Invitational** April 19.

A 26 1/2-length winner of her second lifetime start, her first for trainer David Carroll, Dec. 22 at the Fair Grounds, Pantufla followed that up with a Jan. 29 allowance win before finishing fourth in the Davona Dale S. Feb. 21 in her first stakes attempt last out. The 9-5 second choice to earn graded glory here, she picked up rider Pat Day, who looked to win back-to-back stakes after scoring in the Tampa Bay Derby. Next-to-last early, she edged closer on the turn, took the lead late and held off the late charge of Puddlejump. "The first time I saw Pantufla was in the paddock," said Day, who met Carroll 11 years ago when the latter was Easy Goer's exercise rider. "David told me to just tuck her behind the leaders and then make a move and she'd respond. It's great to win two stakes on the same day."

Parade Ground had impressed in his last, a Feb. 29 allowance at Gulfstream in which he was sent off the 3-5 choice and prevailed despite traffic problems. Making his stakes debut here, he was sent off the 3-2 second choice, with the edge going to Middlesex Drive. The latter, also an allowance winner last out at Gulfstream Feb. 14, had some stakes experience, finishing fourth in the GI Champagne at Belmont last fall and fourth in the Hawthorne Juvenile in his final start at two. Middlesex Drive settled into sixth position early, with Parade Ground just a length off him; the favorite made his move on the turn and squeezed through horses to get the lead in the stretch, but the winner caught him in the final yards and hit the wire in front. "This is a big step forward for Parade Ground," said co-owner Will Farish. "The next race we may try is the (April 11, GI) Wood Memorial (at Aqueduct)."

Unbeaten in three previous tries on the grass, Cryptic Rascal was looking for his third straight graded win after taking the Gill Pilgrim S. at Aqueduct in his final start at two and the Gill Palm Beach S. in his three-year-old bow at Gulfstream February 16. The 1-2 chalk had a head in front after a half, took a clear lead coming out of the far turn and held on while being ridden out to the wire. "It was inside the eighth pole before I even showed him the whip," said jockey Julie Krone. "He has race savvy. When he sees a horse coming, he moves by himself. It's like he's reading your mind. He loves what he's doing." Added trainer Bill Badgett, "He has a terrific stride on grass. After the Aqueduct race, I sent him to Ocala for five or six weeks, and he came into Gulfstream great. We'll go to Keeneland with him now, probably for the Forerunner (Gill, April 17) and then maybe the Jersey Derby."

Victor Cooley, Canada's champion three-year-old colt and Queen's Plate winner in 1996, earned his first Grade I win in Belmont's Vosburgh S. in his penultimate start of 1997. After finishing third by a neck in the GIII Ack Ack. S. Oct. 26 at Churchill to end the year, he took a four-month vacation and was beaten the same distance when fourth in the Taylor's Special H. March 1 at the Fair Grounds in his five-year-old debut. Steadied while in tight early here, he swung five-wide at the top of the lane, bumped with Golden Oriental in deep stretch and just got up for the win at the wire. "This is not his best distance, so I wanted to keep him a little closer today," said rider Eddie Martin Jr. "The key is to get his blood flowing early." Trainer Malcolm Pierce said the seven-furlong GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup at Keeneland April 11 would be next for his charge.

GISW **Capote Belle** (Capote), who started the season with a pair of sprint stakes wins at Oaklawn, attempted to stretch her speed around two turns in the \$147,000 Oaklawn Breeders' Cup S. at a mile and a sixteenth yesterday, but faded after setting a moderate pace. The five-year-old mare, in front after a half in :49 and three-quarters in 1:13 2/5, finished fourth, beaten just a length and a quarter as the 6-5 second choice. "She couldn't have done the early part any better," said her rider, Don Pettinger. "She had a nice easy lead in slow fractions and when (runner-up **Danzalert** {Gold Alert}) came to me she gave me a nice spurt, but after that she didn't have anything left." Added trainer Dan Peitz, "How can we have an excuse, on the lead in those fractions? I think the distance is beyond her." **Turn To The Queen** (Lyphard's Ridge) rallied to win the race by a neck, with the third-place finisher, favored **Leo's Gypsy Dancer** (Leo Castelli) another head back.

"Mr. Wygod asked me to take a few horses for him," said Hofmans, who added he believed the contingent will include MGISW **Exotic Wood** and MGSW **Benchmark** (Alydar), currently recovering from surgery to remove chips from his left front ankle. "He's a very important owner and very dedicated to the game. He's been very successful with Ron, and I hope I can be as successful with him and for him." Dan Hendricks, who already has several horses for the Wygods, will pick up the remainder of the string now under Ellis' care. The Wygods, who own the 170-acre River Edge Farm near Buellton, California, finished 23rd in the nation among owners with 38 wins and earnings of \$1,610,851 last year.
