### IT'S OFFICIAL: GULFSTREAM TO HOST '99 BREEDERS' CUP

D.G. Van Clief, Jr., president of Breeders' Cup Limited, announced yesterday that Gulfstream Park has been chosen as the site of the 1999 Breeders' Cup. The 16<sup>th</sup> running of racing's richest day will be held November 6, 1999 and will be televised live on NBC. "We are very pleased to select Gulfstream Park for the third time as host of the Breeders' Cup Championship," said Van Clief. "We greatly appreciate the outstanding support of the state and local community leaders and the Florida Thoroughbred industry in what promises to be another outstanding presentation of racing's championship." The Breeders' Cup was held at Gulfstream in 1989 and 1992. "Widespread community support is one of the major factors in Gulfstream being awarded racing's most prestigious event," said the track's President and CEO Douglas Donn. "The economic benefit to South Florida will exceed \$100 million and generate additional millions in favorable publicity. The management and staff are dedicated to making the 1999 event even more successful than the two previous Breeders' Cups held at Gulfstream."

### WOODBINE RELEASES '98 STAKES SCHEDULE

John Whitson, The Ontario Jockey Club's vice president of Thoroughbred racing, yesterday unveiled a stakes schedule worth more than \$10 million for the 1998 Woodbine Thoroughbred season. A total of 90 stakes will be offered during the meet, which opens March 28. Highlighting the program is the 139<sup>th</sup> running of the Queen's Plate June 21, the second edition of the Woodbine Mile September 20 and the 62<sup>nd</sup> running of the GI Canadian International October 18. This year's Queen's Plate will be run for a purse of \$500,000, up \$75,000 from last year. The Woodbine Mile purse has been boosted \$250,000 to \$750,000. Also enjoying a major purse increase is the GI E.P. Taylor S., to be run October 18 for \$400,000, up \$100,000 from 1997. An additional nine stakes received increases of from \$25,000 to \$50,000. Two legs of Canada's Triple Crown will be held at Woodbine--the Queen's Plate, first race in the series, and the Crown's finale, the Breeders' S., set for August 16. The newest event on the Woodbine stakes schedule is the \$200,000 Hong Kong Jockey Club Cup S., a mile-and-three-eighths grass test to be run July 26, "Hong Kong Day" at the Toronto oval. The 172-day Woodbine meeting runs through December 6. (All dollar figures are in Canadian currency).

*TDN special correspondent Bob Baffert, in Dubai with Silver Charm for the March 28 Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba Racecourse, has agreed to share his experiences with us each day leading up to the race.*

I finally made it into the city tonight--it's about 20 to 25 minutes from the hotel. We went shopping in the gold district first--just browsing--then had dinner in a Japanese, Benihana-type of restaurant. The skyscrapers are incredible. It's such a clean, beautiful city.

Things are starting to pick up. There was more action today; the press is starting to roll in. The barn area's pretty dead though. Every country has its own quarantine barn with very heavy security. There are only three horses in the American barn. Silver Charm and Malek (Chi) have bonded.

Silver Charm came out of yesterday's work great and walked today. He's a wild man.

When we came back to the hotel after the track, we went out on wave runners out in the ocean. The water is beautiful--very clean. I looked at my speedometer and I was going 35 miles an hour. It was rough out there in the ocean. I'll do that every day for a half-hour while I'm here. It's good exercise.

Dubai has pretty much everything we have at home--like McDonald's and Burger King. If I were to move here though, I would open a donut shop. I'm undergoing donut withdrawal.

**Behrens** (Pleasant Colony), one of America's Dubai World Cup trio, worked under the lights at Nad Al Sheba racetrack yesterday evening at about 8 p.m. local time. The four-year-old colt, third in the GI Gulfstream Park H. last out February 28, was timed going six furlongs in 1:14 3/5. French rep **Loup Sauvage** (Riverman) also had his first night-time experience Monday, enjoying an open gallop around the oval as he gets ready for his first start on dirt.

**SANDTRAP TO NEW ZEALAND** Multiple graded stakes-winner **Sandtrap** (Irish River {Fr}--Timely Reserve, by Nureyev) will stand at Peter Setchell's Millfield Stud near Matamata in New Zealand this year, becoming the first son of Irish River to take up stallion duties in the country. The five-year-old won six of his 17 career starts, including the GIII Hollywood Turf Express H. and GIII Baldwin S. at three and the GIII San Simeon H. at four, earning \$471,116. Sandtrap, third in a Santa Anita allowance test October 4 in his final career start, is due to arrive at his new home in May.

### SENATE BILL THREATENS GAMBLING

**DEDUCTIONS** The Harness Tracks of America newsletter reports that Republican U.S. Senator Dan Coats of Indiana is planning to introduce an amendment which would eliminate the ability of taxpayers to offset gambling winnings with documented losses. The tax monies saved by the amendment to H.R. 2646, the Education Savings Act for Public and Private Education, would be used to permit a charitable deduction of 110 percent for donations to high schools, grade schools and charitable organizations. The American Horse Council is urging members to oppose the measure. A similar bill introduced last year has stalled in the Senate Finance Committee.

Jockey Laffit Pincay Jr. will fly in to ride Yarrow Brae, while Shane Sellers has the mount on Time Limit.

Also breezing for the Beam yesterday, **Yukon Pete** (Peteski), third in the Battaglia Memorial H. last out, went seven-eighths in 1:28 at the Kentucky Horse Park and stablemate **Sorcerer** (Summer Squall), fourth in the Battaglia Memorial, went the same distance in 1:29. Yukon Pete is definite for the race, but Sorcerer may opt instead for the Rushaway S.

Jim Plemmons has acquired an interest in GI Arkansas Derby winner **Rockamundo** (Key to the Mint--Crystal Cup, by \*Nijinsky II). The eight-year-old stallion will move from Vinery to Old Frankfort Stud in Lexington, Kentucky, standing for a fee of \$1,500. "We see the same things in this fine young stallion that Ben Walden at Vinery saw when he decided to stand the horse originally," said Plemmons. "Ben has proved to have a keen eye at identifying stallions. I believe this horse will fit our program nicely. He had an enormous amount of speed, precocity and talent." Rockamundo, graded stakes-placed at two, captured the 1993 Arkansas Derby and earned \$383,625. The Ribot-line stallion is a half-brother to English champion and Group 1 winner Iktamal (Danzig Connection).

### Local News: Lone Star Park

Lone Star Park has added two Texas-bred stakes to its 1998 Thoroughbred schedule. The Assault S. for three-year-olds and up going seven furlongs and the Two Altazano S. for fillies and mares at the same distance will be run Saturday, May 30. Both races will carry purses of \$50,000, including \$25,000 from the accredited Texas-bred fund. Nominations close Wednesday, May 20. The second Lone Star Park Thoroughbred meet opens April 9.
