FAVORITE TRICK TO ARKANSAS The 1997 Horse of the Year **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick) will make his next start in the April 11 GII Arkansas Derby, trainer Bill Mott confirmed yesterday. The winner of the March 14 GIII Swale S. in his '98 debut, Favorite Trick will ship to Oaklawn April 2 with as many as six other Mott-trained horses set to run in Oaklawn's Festival of the South races. "Since the Swale, I feel a bit more confident," said Mott, who had also considered running in the Blue Grass the same day. But, he explained, the lack of speed to go with **Lil's Lad** (Pine Bluff) in the race had discouraged him from going to Keeneland. "Having gotten the race under his belt and mine, I started to think more about where we were going. I think Arkansas will be a more useful race for him than the Blue Grass. With **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner) going to the (April 11, GII) Wood Memorial (at Aqueduct), I thought that might wind up leaving it up to us to go after Lil's Lad awful early," said Mott. "I'm not ducking any particular horse, but maybe I am ducking the way the race will come up. I don't want this race to be our toughest race. I thought that would be counterproductive with the Derby coming up three weeks later."

OXALAGU DOUBTFUL FOR WORLD CUP German **Oxalagu** (Ger) (Lagunas {Ger}) missed a scheduled workout over the Nad Al Sheba strip yesterday after suffering a bruised left front foot and is now doubtful for Saturday's \$4-million event. "This is a real shame, as he was going really well," said his trainer, Andreas Schutz, who added, "If we can get him ready for the race, he will not be lacking condition. We will know more (Friday)." The six-year-old, injured during a gallop Wednesday, may have stepped on a rock or a golf ball--there is a golf course on the Nad Al Sheba infield. Stablemate **Borgia** (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}), runner-up in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf, stretched her legs over the sand track Thursday, working six furlongs with a final eighth in a sprightly :11.60. French hopeful **Loup Sauvage** (Riverman) also breezed, going five furlongs in just under 1:03 with jockey Olivier Peslier aboard.

TDN special correspondent Bob Baffert, in Dubai with Silver Charm for the March 28 Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba Racecourse, has agreed to share his experiences with us each day leading up to the race.

Thursday night was the party. It was an awesome experience--the best pre-race party I've ever been to, put it that way. I got to meet Sheikh Maktoum and his sons. It's really neat to come to this country and get to meet the leader and be made to feel so welcome.

There was great music at the party, lots of food, camel rides and lots of dancing. It was like a made-up castle. They had lamb on a spit. It kind of had a feel like an old marketplace. And there were fireworks. We were really made to feel like part of the country. It was incredible. The time just flew by we were having such a great time. We got there about eight and before we knew it, it was midnight.

I am just going to train now. Silver Charm is doing great. He'll gallop again today.

My wife loves it. Her luggage didn't follow her here, so we had to run out and get her some stuff. But it finally got here.

Today, we'll just relax by the pool. Tonight is when I'll start getting nervous. The night before a big race is when it starts to hit you--people ask you a question and your mind is someplace else. Everything is looking great for the race. One more day...

TOUCH GOLD BACK IN TRAINING Last year's Belmont S. winner **Touch Gold** (Deputy Minister), away from the races since reinjuring his left front foot during a ninth-place finish in the Nov. 8 Breeders' Cup Classic, is back in training. "He's coming along nicely up at the Ocala Farm," said his new trainer, Pat Byrne from his barn at Hialeah. "He's back in light training and galloped at the track the last three days. In a few weeks, we'll send him to Churchill Downs." Byrne said he has no short-term plan regarding Touch Gold's comeback race, but added, "Our ultimate goal is the Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs (Nov. 7)."
