**LORD AT WAR DEAD** The 18-year-old stallion **Lord At War (Arg)** (General {Fr}), who was sent to Hagyard-Davidson-McGee equine hospital after severely injuring the tendons in his left hind leg March 4, had to be humanely destroyed Sunday after attempts to repair the tendons failed and complications developed. A champion in Argentina and multiple Grade I winner in the U.S., Lord At War has sired 19 stakes winners to date, including Grade I winner La Gueriere, and the earners of more than \$11 million. He had covered 16 mares this year at Winborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky, and five are already reported to be in foal. The stallion was buried at the farm.

**CHURCHILL TO PURCHASE ELLIS PARK** Churchill Downs Incorporated yesterday entered into an agreement to acquire Ellis Park Race Course in Henderson, Kentucky, as well as the Kentucky Horse Center, a training facility in Lexington. Both properties are currently owned by Racing Corporation of America. Under the terms of the agreement, Churchill will purchase all of the capital stock of RCA for approximately \$22 million, payable in a combination of cash and common stock of Churchill Downs. RCA is a wholly owned subsidiary of TVI Corporation, which is controlled by Tinkham Veale, II, a Cleveland-based businessman who has close ties with the racing industry. The agreement, which is subject to approval by several regulatory agencies including the Kentucky Racing Commission, is expected to be finalized by mid-April. "The acquisition of Ellis Park and the Kentucky Training Center is a logical step in the development plans of Churchill Downs and is consistent with our strategic plan," said Thomas Meeker, president and chief executive officer. "Ellis Park will complement the racing and simulcast operations at Churchill Downs and will allow us to leverage our strengths. The summer meet at Ellis Park is an important part of Kentucky racing, and we believe the entire Kentucky racing circuit can be enhanced by our commitment to maintaining quality live racing and customer service. In addition, we will have a larger share of the interstate simulcasting market and more products to package under the Churchill Downs brand." Despite the change in ownership, it will be business as usual at both Ellis Park and the Kentucky Horse Center.

**Saturday, Santa Anita**  
**SANTA ANITA DERBY-GI**, \$750,000, 3yo, 1 1/8m, post time 2:35 p.m.

Three of the top contenders for the Santa Anita Derby worked yesterday. Undefeated **Indian Charlie** (In Excess {Ire}), who makes his stakes debut, zipped six furlongs in a bullet 1:10 4/5 with exercise rider Dana Barnes up. The colt went the first three furlongs in :36, finishing up in an eye-catching :34 4/5. "What he's got going for him is that he's an athlete," said trainer Bob Baffert. "He's got that raw talent. Silver Charm was the same way last year. Raw talent got him there." Baffert also sent out GISW **Real Quiet** (Quiet American) for his final tune-up yesterday. The colt, winner of the GI Hollywood Futurity at two, was second in the GI San Felipe S. March 14. He went three-quarters in 1:11 3/5, also with Barnes aboard. "He isn't fast, he's steady," said Baffert. "He's a galloper, as they say in Europe."

Also breezing Monday, **Orville N Wilbur's** (Out Of Place) went five-eighths in :59 3/5. Despite getting caught in traffic as he broke off, the winner of the GI San Rafael S. registered the fastest work of the day at the distance. "He got tangled up with horses coming out of the starting gate," said trainer Wally Dollase. "I was ponying the horse; I looked around and made sure we were all by ourselves, so I went ahead and turned him loose. All of a sudden there were two horses right there with him. Boy, that was dangerous. It could have messed the whole thing up."

**KEENELAND SETTLES SALE MIX-UP** According to *The Blood-Horse* on-line, trainer Bret Calhoun and officials from the Keeneland Association have settled the mistaken identity case involving a yearling sold at Keeneland last September. Calhoun purchased the yearling, which he believed was by Ogygian, for \$7,500, but it was determined after the colt's markings did not match the foal papers that he was actually a son of Seeking the Gold owned by Ogden Mills Phipps. The two horses were switched by accident prior to the sale. While details of the agreement were not released, Calhoun told *The Blood-Horse* the colt was shipped from Texas to Kentucky, adding, "I think Keeneland did everything they were supposed to do and were very fair."

**MASTER MCGRATH TAKES CAROLINA CUP**

**Master McGrath** (Compliance) picked up his first win since 1995 with an impressive six-length score in Saturday's GI \$100,000 NationsBank Carolina Cup in Camden, South Carolina. Racing before a record crowd of 68,500, the highest attendance ever for an American steeplechase race, the 11-year-old led every step under jockey Arch Kingsley, covering the 2 1/4 miles in 4:23 2/5. Said trainer Janet Elliot, "I think if he'd been a sound horse, he would have won a lot of races. Age is coming against him a bit now, but he's very determined and he's got great heart. That counts for a lot." Master McGrath, winner of the 1995 Temple Gwathmey Hurdle H. and runner-up in the '94 Breeders' Cup Grand National, missed the entire 1996 season and started just three times last year, winning an allowance and running second in the GI Breeders' Cup Grand National. He was making his first start since finishing third in the GI Colonial Cup last November 16.

**SORCEROR PUT DOWN** According to *The Thoroughbred Times* on-line, three-year-old **Sorcerer** (Summer Squall), injured during Sunday's GII Jim Beam S., was euthanized after vets at Hagyard-Davidson-McGee equine hospital determined the colt's injuries were too severe and he was unlikely to survive surgery to repair them. "He had a fracture that started at the condyle and went up into the cannon bone; that was the one the state vet could feel," Laura Wohlers, racing manager for owner James McIngvale, told *The Thoroughbred Times*. "But he also had another fracture that went all the way up to the knee cap and another one going all the way around the bone. (The vets) felt he only had about a 20 percent chance of surviving the surgery." Sorcerer won one of his nine career starts, breaking his maiden in a stakes at Sam Houston, and earned \$41,480.
