"INDIAN" ATTACKS AT SANTA ANITA

DERBY Trainer Bob Baffert is on the warpath. After saddling the great Silver Charm to win the \$4 million Dubai World Cup last Saturday, last year's Eclipse Award-winning conditioner sent out the dynamic duo of **Indian Charlie** (In Excess {Ire}) and **Real Quiet** (Quiet American) in yesterday's \$750,000 GI Santa Anita Derby and saw the team come home one-two. Making only his fourth start and seeing stakes competition for the first time, Indian Charlie tracked front-running **Orville N Wilbur's** (Out of Place) around the first turn and down the backstretch, charged to the lead as they raced around the final bend and left the field in the dust. The 9-5 favorite, he won off by 2 1/4 lengths, equaling the Santa Anita Derby stakes record of 1:47. "You've just got to put it right out of your mind that today was only his fourth race," said winning rider Gary Stevens. "He's really seasoned. He's like a horse that has run 20 times. You can ride this horse with so much confidence because he has that acceleration. It was just a matter of being patient and pushing the button. He always finishes strong. He's a very exciting horse to ride, and I'm just in awe that he's as lightly raced as he is." Stablemate Real Quiet closed from next-to-last to be second. Baffert, who missed the '96 Kentucky Derby by a nose with Cavonnier, then came right back to win it in a photo last year with Silver Charm, will send both colts on to Churchill Downs.

SATISH SANAN PURCHASES SILVERLEAF

FARM Satish Sanan, principal owner of Padua Stables, has entered into an agreement to buy the 600-acre Silverleaf Farm in Summerfield, Florida from David Hutson. The purchase does not include any of the bloodstock currently owned by Silverleaf. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who will handle the Padua Stables runners, has agreed to relocate training center operations from Westerly in Santa Ynez, California, to Silverleaf this fall. Sanan has hired racetrack consultant Dennis Moore to develop the property into a state-of-the-art training facility capable of housing 100 horses; improvements will include the completion of a three-quarter mile training track and European-style turf gallop. Lukas will act as general manager at Silverleaf. Bruce Hill, currently general manager at Valor Farm in Texas, will serve as farm manager, and Todd Quast, Lukas' current training center manager, will relocate to Summerfield.

Indian Charlie broke his maiden at Del Mar last August, then was on the shelf until resurfacing to take a Santa Anita allowance by nine lengths February 22. Trying two turns for the first time in his most recent effort March 13, the bay coasted to a 2 1/2-length score going a mile, and trainer Bob Baffert declared him ready for a sterner test. The fans believed in him, too, betting him down to 9-5, and the colt responded, sitting just off the pace of **ORVILLE N WILBUR'S** (Out of Place) to the top of the lane before unleashing a stretch run that carried him home an easy winner over his rallying stablemate, Real Quiet. "I've been blessed to have these good horses every year," said Baffert. "We've always known this is a great horse. We took our time with him. He's a really smart horse. Once you teach this horse one time, he remembers. He's got a great mind. He looked like a winner all the way around there today." Indian Charlie became the third straight California-bred to win this race; he will try to become the fourth Cal-bred to take the "Run for the Roses," and the first since Decidedly did it in 1962. The first three finishers will all head to Churchill Downs for the Kentucky Derby May 2. "The mile and a quarter will really help him," said Baffert of his second-place finisher, the late-running Real Quiet. "The further they go, the better for him." Trainer Randy Bradshaw will also send Artax, an even third, to Louisville. "I liked his race today," he said. "At least he relaxed off the pace...if (Indian Charlie) hooks up with Lil's Lad on the lead (in the Derby), maybe that will be good for us."

First or second in six of his last seven starts, Precocity missed making it seven-for-seven when he fell in the Gill Fayette H. at Keeneland last October. Runner-up in the GI Super Derby last year, the unfashionably bred bay started this year at the Fair Grounds and, after winning his first two, missed by a nose in the Whirlaway H. and by a length and a half in the Gill New Orleans H. last time out March 8. The second-longest shot on the board in his first try at Oaklawn, he was rated near the back of the pack through six furlongs in 1:11, made a four-wide sweep at the top of the stretch and inched clear late to earn his first graded score. "He is at the top of his game now and has been all winter," said trainer Bobby Barnett. "We saw a big change when the weather got cooler." Added jockey Carlos Gonzalez, "At the top of the stretch he moved through to the outside and I told him, 'It's time to rock 'n' roll.' I never let up on him until we were past the wire. I wasn't going to take a chance that he would pull himself up like he did at the Fair Grounds and let somebody come back on and beat him." The colt could go next in the GI Pimlico Special May 9. Favored MUD ROUTE (Strawberry Road {Aus}) stalked the pace early, but lacked a late rally.

Well Chosen, a winner at first asking at Santa Anita last October, finished fourth in three straight, including the GI Frizette and GI Hollywood Starlet, to end the campaign, then finished second three straight times to open 1998. Runner-up by a half-length in the Gill Fair Grounds Oaks in her most recent trip March 14, the chestnut was overlooked at the windows stepping up to the Grade I level, but outran her odds. The Team Lukas filly raced head-and-head with pacesetter SANTARIA (Star de Naskra) to the far turn, put that rival away and held off Let in the drive for the victory. "She really did show a lot of guts," said winning rider Charlie Woods. "I thought we were in really good shape at the head of the lane. I hit her one time and she really took off. I knew they would have trouble beating me. She was digging in and running so hard." The winner goes next in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 1. The 4-5 favorite, previously undefeated HEDONIST (Alydeed) pressed the pace for a half, but faded late and finished sixth. "It just wasn't her day," said her jockey, Jerry Bailey. "She got banged around at the start pretty good, and then she ran up close to the lead. But I could tell early on it wasn't going to be her day."

Looking to add to his first Stateside victory in the GII Arcadia H. last out March 7, Hawksley Hill (Ire) was sent off the heavy favorite here and came through for the crowd, rallying from between horses as they came out of the final turn to take the lead at the top of the stretch and draw off to win handily. "He has got it all together, hasn't he?" asked trainer Neil Drysdale. "This race was even better than the last one. He really seemed to like the soft turf, we don't have to worry about that when we go back east. We might go to the Early Times Turf Classic (Churchill Downs, May 2), now that we've established he'll go nine furlongs." Jockey Gary Stevens, enjoying a stakes double on the afternoon, said, "I haven't sat on one in a turf race who was as impressive as this one was in a long, long time."

First or second in all of his first six starts, Son Of A Pistol fractured his shoulder in a winning effort Jan. 31, 1996 at Santa Anita and was given a year and a half off to recuperate. Returning to the races last July at Del Mar, he was seventh in the GIII Bing Crosby Breeders' Cup, his only off-the-board finish, and won a six-furlong allowance by seven lengths before taking another seven months off. Third in his '98 return, the GII San Carlos H. March 7, he was sent away the third choice to earn his first stakes here. Fourth early, he moved three-wide on the turn, hit the top of the stretch a half-length in front and pulled clear in the lane in track-record time. "It's gratifying to see him win like this," said trainer Bruce Headley. "Every time this horse has raced, he's really run. I don't know what we'll do next with him."

Chilito, who went two-for-four as a two-year-old, winning two six-furlong sprints, had won just once thus far at three, the Paradise Creek S. at a mile and a sixteenth on the turf March 13 at Gulfstream in his last start. Nominated to the Triple Crown at the \$6,000 late closing March 28, he came here looking for his first route win on the dirt in his first graded stakes attempt. Gary Boulanger sent him right out for the early lead and he never looked back, letting out a notch on the turn, hitting the stretch with a two-length lead and drawing away through the lane while never seriously threatened. "After that fast half mile (:46 2/5), I was ready to strangle Gary," said winning trainer Graham Motion, "but he obviously had plenty left. There is a lot to talk about now. (Owner) Mr. (Joe) Allbritton is out of the country in New Zealand this weekend. I'm sure he would like to win the Derby after the disappointment with Hansel (Allbritton owned the beaten favorite in 1991), but I think that the timing for the Preakness might be the way to go. We'll talk about the options." Comic Strip, the 1-2 favorite coming off a win in the GIII Louisiana Derby, closed from last but couldn't manage better than third. "He struggled from the get-go," said jockey Shane Sellers. "They throw clunkers out there every once in a while. Hopefully, that was his clunker and the next one will be his good one."

EARTH SUMMIT TAKES GRAND NATIONAL On rain-softened ground, the 7-1 favorite **Earth Summit (GB)** (Celtic Cone {GB}) handed **Suny Bay (Ire)** (Roselier {Fr}) an 11-length defeat in a stamina-sapping Grand National over 4 1/2 miles at Aintree near Liverpool, England yesterday. Only six of the 37 starters managed to complete the grueling 30-fence test. Carl Llewellyn, the winning rider, picked up his second Grand National (he won the '92 running aboard Party Politics {GB}) as substitute jockey and paid tribute to the gallant second-place Suny Bay, who carried topweight of 144 pounds. The margin back to the third-place horse, **Samlee (Ire)** (Good Thyne), was a "distance;" he just denied the tiring **St Mellion Fairway** (Mandalus {GB}), with the Irish-trained **Gimme Five (Ire)** (Deep Run {GB}) fifth and **Killeshin (Ire)** (Al Sirat) sixth and last among those who completed the course.
