LONE STAR OPENS TONIGHT Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie opens tonight for its second season of Thoroughbred racing. Highlights of the meet include the April 19 \$250,000 Lone Star Derby and the \$250,000 Texas Mile the same day. The National All-Star Jockey Championship returns to Lone Star Park on Friday, June 19. The opening day feature at the Texas track is the \$75,000 Premier S. for Texas-bred three-year-olds and up going 8½ furlongs. Live racing runs Wednesdays through Sundays during the 73-day 1998 season with first post time on weekdays at 6:35 p.m. and on weekends and holidays at 1:35 p.m.

INAUGURAL RERUN GALA A SUCCESS With all the figures in and tallied, ReRun is declaring its Mane Event, held February 28 at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky, a success. The first-ever dinner dance and silent auction held by the Kentucky-based program to place ex-racehorses raised \$15,000 toward the upkeep of horses awaiting adoptive homes. "We had over 200 people in attendance for our first annual fundraiser, and from all accounts, everyone had a great time," said Lori Neagle, co-founder of ReRun. In addition, ReRun has been chosen as the recipient of the charitable funds raised by the Kentucky Farm Manager's Club Golf Scramble, to be held this year at the Players Club in Lexington Sept. 28. LAURIN SUFFERS HEART ATTACK Hall of Fame trainer Lucien Laurin suffered a heart attack last week, according to his wife Juliette. "He couldn't breathe and I took him to his doctor," she said yesterday from their Key Largo, Fl home. "They had to rush him to Baptist Hospital (in Miami) by ambulance. It happened in the middle of last week, and they kept him in the hospital for three or four days. He yelled and screamed so loud to come home, that they had to let him out. He's resting now, and can't stand for very long." The 86-year-old's participation in a tour of the Triple Crown races in honor of the 25th anniversary of Secretariat's victories in the races is now in question.

Collecting his second Group race victory, Alec Head's homebred Marathon, making his first start of the season, took command from the start, quickened well at the top of the stretch and had enough left in reserve at the finish to resist a strong late challenge from Keos. Marathon, who did not race as a juvenile, has now won four of his seven lifetime starts and has never finished out of the first three. The race was marred by an accident in the parade ring when the filly KART STAR (IRE) (Soviet Star) fell and threw her rider Thierry Jarnet into the rail. Jarnet appeared to be okay, but was taken to the hospital for precautionary tests. Kart Star was scratched from the race.

Local News, England:

Coolmore Stud's first-season stallion **Perugino** (h, 7, Danzig--Fairy Bridge {Bold Reason}), a half-brother to Sadler's Wells, sired his first winner Wednesday when his colt Perugino Bay, making his second start, won the \$5,091 EBF Spa Welter Maiden S. over five furlongs at Ripon in England. Trained by Brian McMahon, Perugino Bay is out of the Private Account mare Dublah.

Local News, England:

Nine entries were added at Wednesday's \$13,498 supplementary entry stage for the G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom on June 6. The major surprise was the inclusion of Prince Khalid Abdullah's 1997 European Champion juvenile **Xaar (GB)** (Zafonic). Earlier in the week the colt's connections had expressed doubts about making the supplementary entry, but Prince Khalid's racing manager Grant Pritchard-Gordon said: "We have had a change of heart. Andre Fabre's comments after Xaar won the (G1) Dewhurst S. (at Newmarket) last October are the reasons for this entry--certainly not the colt's pedigree." Amongst the other supplementaries for the Vodafone Derby are **Mudeer (GB)** (Warning {GB}), the unbeaten **Dr Fong** (Kris S.) and the G2 Prix Robert Papin winner **Greenlander (GB)** (Green Desert).

Local News, Australia:

The Sydney Turf Club Wednesday announced a 25-percent increase in the value of the world's most valuable race for juveniles, the G1 A.A.M.I. Golden Slipper S., for 1999. Run over six furlongs at Rosehill, the race will now be worth \$1,681,237. Last month the Victoria Racing Club increased the value of this year's running of the G1 Melbourne Cup from \$1,479,489 to \$1,882,986.

Champion **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) worked five furlongs in :59.1 yesterday before shipping to his summer home at Belmont Park, according to trainer Sonny Hine. "We'll work him a couple of times in New York, before we send him to Maryland for the (May 9 GI) Pimlico Special," said Hine.

Trainer Bob Durso said **Frisk Me Now** (Mister Frisky), the second place finisher in Saturday's GI Oaklawn Park H., came out of the race well. "We're shipping to Monmouth in the middle of next week" said Durso. "I'm thinking about the Pimlico Special for his next race. I know Skippy (Skip Away) and the winner of the Oaklawn race (**Precocity** {Aferd}) are going to Pimlico, so I might go there or look at the race in New York at Aqueduct (the GIII Excelsior Breeders' Cup H. on April 26.)"
