BREEDERS' CUP CONTRIBUTES \$3.5 MILLION

TO NTRA Officials of the Breeders' Cup Limited announced yesterday that the organization, on behalf of the Thoroughbred breeding industry, is contributing \$3.5 million to the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. "The development of the NTRA is critically important to the future of the Thoroughbred industry," explained D.G. Van Clief, Jr., president of the Breeders' Cup Ltd. "This contribution not only ensures the successful launch of the NTRA, but also recognizes the contributions of breeders, who have supported our championship and marketing programs over the years. Due to the fact that the NTRA was not able to fully implement its stallion farm solicitation effort until well into the breeding season, we felt that it was important to relieve the burden of the breeders this year." The \$3.5 million contribution is a one-time payment by Breeders' Cup Ltd, a founding member of the NTRA.

TURFWAY WINTER/SPRING WRAP-UP Turfway Park's 1998 Winter/Spring Meet ended April 2 with varied results. Overall handle showed a slight increase of 3.1 percent, reaching \$219,580,160, while on-track business registered a decline of eight percent to \$28,527,150. On-track attendance decreased 5.9 percent from 137,132 to 129,005. "The end-of-meet numbers are a little deceiving," commented Turfway Park President Mark Simendinger. "The loss of electricity on Jim Beam S. Day and the resulting schedule changes had a significant impact on our entire meet. Of the eight percent we were down for the meet, three percent can be attributed directly to the losses we incurred on Jim Beam weekend. Overall, we were able to increase purses three times during the meet and seem to have stemmed the tide of double-digit decreases which we experienced last year."

Escena, third in last year's Breeders' Cup Distaff, was second in both of her previous 1998 outings, the GII Sabin H. and the March 1 GII Rampart H., both at Gulfstream. The bay mare settled off the early leaders, moved into contention while three wide midway down the backstretch and surged to the front with a half-mile to run and maintained her daylight advantage to the wire. "The race didn't develop the way I thought," admitted winning rider Jerry Bailey. "I expected more pressure early and when I went to the lead, I expected someone to be contesting the race at that point, but it never happened. She ran a big race and powerful race in a quick time and there wasn't much for me to do." Glitter Woman, winner of last year's GI Ashland S., was bumped at the start, and, after being in striking position early, fell back before producing a late run a half-mile out, but could not reach the winner. "We decided to take back early, sensing that there would be plenty of early speed in this field," explained jockey Gary Stevens after his ride on Glitter Woman. "At about the three-eighths pole I thought I was in a strong position and when we hit the eighth pole, she gave me a big punch and I thought we would make it close, but we never were able to get any closer to the winner."

SLIGHTLY DANGEROUS NAMED BROODMARE OF THE YEAR The Board of Directors of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders has named **Slightly Dangerous** (Roberto) the 1997 Broodmare of the Year. Prince Khalid Abdullah's Slightly Dangerous, second in the 1982 G1 Epsom Oaks, is the dam of 12 foals, 10 starters and nine winners. Her 1985 foal **Warning** (GB) (Known Fact) was named Champion Two-Year-Old and Three-Year-Old in England. She is also the dam of **Yashmak** (Danzig), the 1997 winner of the GI Flower Bowl Invitational and the G2 Ribbledale S. as well as **Dushyantor** (Sadler's Wells), runner-up in the 1996 G1 Epsom Derby. Slightly Dangerous's total progeny earnings are \$3,889,251. The KTOB will honor its 1997 champions at a luncheon April 23 at Keeneland.

Lil's Lad (Pine Bluff), disqualified for drifting out and impeding **Cape Town** (Seeking the Gold) after finishing first in the GI Florida Derby in his last start March 14, could lead trainer Neil Howard's team into the Kentucky Derby with a strong effort here. The favorite, a three-time winner at the Gulfstream meet, including a score in the GII Fountain of Youth Feb. 21, would improve his record to five-for-eight with a win and looks to be the lone speed here. Cape Town won Gulfstream's GIII Holy Bull in his first '98 start before finishing fourth behind Lil's Lad in the Fountain of Youth; he got his revenge in the Florida Derby but may be forced to chase his speedy rival early here. **Halory Hunter** (Jade Hunter), third in the Florida Derby and Fountain of Youth, looks for his first win since scoring in a Belmont allowance Sept. 26; the confirmed closer will be rooting for a speed duel on the front end.

After a troubled winter at Gulfstream, **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner) returns to the site of his last victory, the Nov. 30 GII Remsen S., which capped a perfect three-stakes sweep at Aqueduct last fall, including the GII Cowdin and the GIII Nashua. He underwent surgery for an entrapped epiglottis after a fifth-place finish last out in the GI Florida Derby March 14; he was second in the GII Fountain of Youth and the GII Hutcheson earlier in a meet compromised by behavioral problems. **Prosperous Bid** (Mr. Prospector), third in the March 14 GII San Felipe in his last after maiden and allowance wins in his first two, ships east for red-hot trainer Bob Baffert. Neil Howard looks to add another gun to his Derby arsenal with **Parade Ground** (Kingmambo), winner of the Tampa Bay Derby March 22 in his latest effort.

The 1997 Horse of the Year **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick) looks to extend his nine-for-nine record to a perfect 10 after winning the March 14 GIII Swale S. in his 1998 debut. "I am getting more confident in him," said trainer Bill Mott, who took over at the helm after the colt's juvenile season. "I think the horse is giving that confidence to me. Having seen him win one, which got the monkey off our backs, I feel like I know him better." Mott said a good effort here would send him to the Kentucky Derby with an even more optimistic feeling. "If he won here and it were a race equal to his Breeders' Cup Juvenile or his Swale, I'd have to say he's a definite contender," said the trainer. "You're always left with a question of whether he'll get a mile and a quarter, but there will be that question for many of them going into the Derby. I'm looking for conditioning and hopefully a confidence builder." The morning-line second choice, California invader **Quake** (Capote), is just one-for-four lifetime but was second to eventual GI Santa Anita Derby winner Indian Charlie in a March 13 Santa Anita allowance in his last start.
