**OAKLAWN WRAPS UP '98 SEASON** Oaklawn Park in Hot Springs, Arkansas concluded its 1998 racing season Saturday. During the 53-day meet, a total of 697,084 fans passed through the turnstiles, an increase of 2.5 percent from last year's figure. Mutuel handle on-track at Oaklawn showed a slight decline of less than one percent. Total handle, boosted by the large simulcast network, increased 11 percent to a daily average of \$5,061,653, the first time Oaklawn has topped the \$5 million mark. The average purse distribution jumped from \$223,000 in 1997 to \$227,000 for the 1998 meet. Jockey Tim Doocy easily captured his first Oaklawn riding title with 86 wins from 371 mounts. Kenny Smith saddled 30 winners to take the trainer's title. Drs. K K and Devi Jayaraman were leading owners at the meet with 17 winners.

**LURE COLT TOPS INGLIS EASTER SALES** Tuesday's top price of \$353,060 was easily eclipsed at Wednesday's second session of the Inglis Easter Yearling Sales in Sydney, Australia when South African-born agent James Bester, Coolmore Australia's marketing manager, paid \$537,996 for a colt by **Lure** out of Prawn Cocktail (Artichoke), an unraced half-sister to Breeders' Cup Mile winner Royal Academy (\*Nijinsky II) and MGSW Terlingua (Secretariat). This was the highest price paid in Australia since a yearling broke the \$1 million mark back in 1989. Bester was buying for South African-based Mrs. Sabina Plattner, wife of Hasso Plattner, the man who became a billionaire by developing the hardware for Bill Gates' Microsoft company. Mrs. Plattner was recently the leading buyer at the South African yearling sales in Johannesburg, purchasing six yearlings for over \$500,000 total. The Lure colt will go into training in South Africa. Bester also purchased the highest-priced filly at Wednesday's session, bidding \$386,685 on behalf of Mrs. Plattner for a daughter of Danehill out of Procrastinate (Aus) (Jade Hunter). After two days of the Inglis sale, the gross had reached \$18,781,775 for an average of \$70,344, with 83 percent of the lots sold.

### Saturday, May 2, Churchill Downs

#### KENTUCKY DERBY-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo, 1 1/4

**Old Trieste** (A. P. Indy), runner-up in the GII Norfolk S. at two and a 10-length allowance winner going a mile at Santa Anita in his second start this year April 4, has been added to the list of 1998 Derby starters. The colt shipped to Churchill Tuesday.

GIII Flamingo S. winner **Chilito** (Strawberry Road {Aus}) worked a half-mile in :48 at Churchill Wednesday morning. "I was very pleased with it," said trainer H. Graham Motion of the move. "He actually went a little better than I expected him to." Adding that the colt has been "a handful" since shipping from Florida to Kentucky, Motion said, "I think horses coming out of the warmer weather in Florida and into the cooler mornings always do well, and I think some people make too much of that. But, I really am very pleased at how he's adjusted since he got here. He's been very full of himself."

GII Jim Beam S. runner-up **Yarrow Brae** (Deputy Minister), possible for the Derby, worked six furlongs in a bullet 1:13 4/5 at Churchill yesterday. With jockey Donna Barton aboard, the Team Lukas colt cruised through fractions of :24 and :48 2/5 and galloped out seven furlongs in 1:30 2/5. "We didn't ask him for a lot," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "We just wanted to keep him tight." The colt will go next in the GIII Derby Trial April 25. Lukas sent out On the Line to win the 1987 Trial and Houston to take the '89 edition; both ran back in the Derby, finishing 10<sup>th</sup> and eighth, respectively. "They ran just like the Derby Trial--they ran great miles," said Lukas. "So I don't know yet what we'll do (with Yarrow Brae)." GIII Louisiana Derby winner **Comic Strip** (Red Ransom), a distant third in the GIII Flamingo last out, worked a half in :49 2/5 yesterday. He could join stablemate **Parade Ground** (Kingmambo) in the starting gate on the first Saturday in May.

**Indian Charlie** (In Excess {Ire}) worked a half-mile Monday in :49 3/5. Stablemate **Real Quiet** (Quiet American) went the same distance in :48 2/5. Both colts left Santa Anita Wednesday for Churchill Downs.

**TATTERSALLS SALES RESULTS** At yesterday's first session of the Tattersalls Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale in Newmarket, England, high price was paid for hip number 57, a colt from the first crop of the top-rated three-year-old miler in England and Ireland and 1994 Breeders' Cup Mile champ Baratheia (Ire) out of Oasis (GB) (Valiyar {Ire}). Consigned by Mocklershill Stables, the bay brought a final bid of \$127,552 from Gay Kelleway. At the first session of the two-day sale, 86 horses sold for a total of \$2,182,882--up 2.2 percent from last year when 69 two-year-olds sold for \$2,136,848. The average sales price of \$25,381 was down 18 percent from last year's average of \$30,969. The sale concludes today.

Apprehension (GB) sprang a 16-1 surprise as he produced an impressive finishing burst to catch Almushtarak (Ire) in the final strides. Winning trainer David Loder may now run Sheikh Mohammed's homebred colt in the G3 Gordon Richards S. over a mile and a quarter at Sandown April 25. "He was going for a conditions race at Ripon," said Loder, "but depending on how he comes out of this race, Sandown might enter our calculations. He had his knees cleaned up during the winter and he has been a lot better. He worked well on the soft turf last week and we decided the best thing to do was to race him here." The 1997 1000 Guineas winner SLEEPYTIME (IRE) (Royal Academy) started favourite, but faded badly after appearing to be traveling well behind the early leaders and finished a long way last. Her disappointed trainer Henry Cecil said: "She was going well, but never picked up at all. You would have expected her to pick up a little. Maybe it was the soft ground, but if it was, she wouldn't have been traveling so beautifully. Time will tell." Stable jockey Kieren Fallo said: "She traveled well, but went nowhere."

Desert Prince (Ire), whose sire Green Desert won this event in 1982, entered 2000 Guineas calculations with a convincing win in this Classic trial and most bookmakers are now offering odds of 16-1 on him for the Sagitta-sponsored Classic on May 2. Always handily placed, Desert Prince, skillfully ridden by French champion jockey Olivier Peslier, came to cut down Trans Island (GB) inside the final furlong and win going away. Winning trainer David Loder said: "I want to see what happens in (today's) Craven S., but there is a fairly good chance Desert Prince will run in the 2000 Guineas." Trainer Ian Balding said he was "very pleased" with Trans Island's effort, while Greenlander (GB)'s trainer Clive Brittain said: "His rider Pat Eddery said he lost his action two furlongs out, but then ran on again up the rising ground. He thought that on better ground the colt should run in the 2000 Guineas."

## WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

### PEDIGREE SHORTS

Storm Cat recorded his first classic victory as a broodmare sire when **Phalaenopsis (Jpn) (f, 3, Brian's Time--Catequil, by Storm Cat)** won the Oka Sho (Japanese 1,000 Guineas) Sunday. The dam Catequil is a sister to stakes winner Ocean Cat, but also half sister to Pacificus (by Storm Cat's grandsire Northern Dancer), dam of the Japanese stars Narita Brian (Jpn) and Biwa Hayahide (Jpn). Narita Brian is a son of Brian's Time and so is very closely related to Phalaenopsis. One interesting factor to note in Phalaenopsis's pedigree is that Brian's Time is out of a mare by Graustark and the cross of Storm Cat over mares from the Graustark line has produced Tabasco Cat, Mountain Cat and Senate Appointee. Similar matings could be created in the U.S. by breeding Storm Cat mares to Dynaformer and in Japan by breeding Storm Cat mares to Sunshine Forever, both Dynaformer and Sunshine Forever being closely related to Brian's Time.

Aqueduct's Gill Bay Shore S. Saturday saw a very impressive display by **Limit Out (c, 3, Northern Flagship--Lucky Delight, by Miswaki)**. Limit Out won by 2 1/2 lengths while running the seven furlongs in 1:20 2/5. Limit Out's sire Northern Flagship was brother to French and English Champion Sprinter Ajdal, but himself failed to win in four outings. None the less, he has had his moments at stud, siring German Champion Macanal and Polaris Flight, a French Group 1 winner who also finished second in the French Derby.

Northern Flagship's dam Native Partner is a dual stakes winner who is also dam of Group and Grade I winners Flying Partner and Formidable and third dam of champions Arazi, Dance in the Dark (Jpn) and Dance Partner (Jpn) (the last two in Japan). Native Partner is by Raise a Native out of a mare by Tom Fool, a fact which becomes particularly relevant when we note that Limit Out's broodmare sire Miswaki is by a son of Raise a Native out of a mare by a son of Tom Fool. This is also another example of a pattern which frequently seems to work well, inbreeding to the broodmare sire of a sire.

The Gill John B. Campbell H. at Pimlico Saturday resulted in a first graded stakes win for **Hot Brush (c, 4, Broad Brush--Hot Milk, by Restless Native)**. Hot Brush seems to represent something of a textbook mating. His sire is inbred 3x3 to Turn-to and his dam carries Ambiorix, a half brother to the dam of Turn-to. In addition, Hot Brush is also linebred to War Admiral who appears in the pedigree of Broad Brush as the broodmare sire of his broodmare sire Hoist the Flag.
