VICTORIOUS RETURN FOR XAAR Prince Khaled Abdullah's **Xaar (GB)** (Zafonic), Europe's top two-year-old last year, is now at 4-5 with most bookmakers for the Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 2 after a winning return to the races in yesterday's G3 City Index Craven S. in Newmarket, England. His trainer Andre Fabre said before the race that his charge was by no means fully fit and needed the race and it showed, as he ran lazily for the first six furlongs. But once French champion jockey Olivier Peslier took Xaar to the outside and the favorite put his mind to the job at hand, he quickly devoured the soft ground just as he had done in winning last October's G1 Dewhurst S., and he soon caught the pacesetter and ran out a clever winner. Fabre said, "I am more relieved than excited. I feared the ground very much and it was Xaar's first race of the year and a new world. I hope we have some sunny weather and the ground dries up before the 2000 Guineas and I would prefer an extra week before the race, because two weeks is a little short." Peslier added, "I was pushing and pushing and when I took him to the outside, he didn't want to quicken immediately. He wanted to look around and say 'hello' to everyone. But he won well today and now we will see about the Guineas." *Craven S. results p. 2*

NUREYEV FILLY SETS RECORD AT

TATTERSALLS A filly by Nureyev--Saratoga Sea, by Saratoga Six, consigned by Kirkwood Stables set a new British record when she fetched \$168,298 at yesterday's final session of the Tattersalls Breeze-Up Sale in Newmarket, England. The bay two-year-old was purchased by John O'Connor of Ballylinch Stud after a protracted bidding duel with French agent Marc-Antoine Berghgracht. The sale marked Kirkwood Stables' first foray in the British market. "This whole project has given me and my team a great deal of pleasure," said Kirkwood's Kip Elser. "We are thrilled to have topped the sale and with the overall response to our consignment. It has been a great experience and one that we are looking forward to repeating next year." Overall at the two-day sale, 171 horses sold for an aggregate of \$4,774,666--up 23.1 percent from last year's figure of \$3,875,097 from the sale 141 horses. The average price of \$27,921 was up 1.6 percent from last year's \$27,482.

OBS-APRIL UNDER TACK SHOW RESULTS Valid Wind (Valid Appeal) posted the fastest quarter-mile work during Thursday's first of four sessions of the Under Tack Show for the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Annual Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training in Ocala, Florida. The filly, who sells Monday as hip number 10, stopped the timer in :21 3/5. Two horses shared honors for the session's fastest eighth-mile work, as both hip numbers 154 and 217 stopped the timer in :10 2/5. Hip number 154 is a bay filly by Prosper Fager out of stakes winning Dreamy Heart. Hip number 217 has been named **Diablo's First Lady** (Diablo). Hip number 213, **Fight to the End** (End Sweep), posted the fastest three-eighths work, getting the distance in :34 2/5. Hip number 239, **Sweeping Gloves** (End Sweep), was the only horse to work a half-mile, covering the distance in :47 3/5. The Under Tack show continues Tuesday morning beginning at 9 a.m. The April Sale is scheduled for Monday through Thursday April 20-23.

York's G2 Dante S. over 1 5/16m May 13 is the probable next target for Border Arrow (GB), who is unlikely to run in the 2000 Guineas and instead looks a serious Epsom Derby prospect. Alboostan (GB), having his first run for trainer Barry Hills, who replaced the late David Morley, set the pace and was still in command entering the final furlong, but Frankie Dettori had timed his run on Border Arrow to perfection and he came to collar the leader close home for a narrow win. Winning trainer Ian Balding is inclined to stay away from the 2000 Guineas, despite the fact that the colt's owners, Bob Michaelson and Wafic Said, run Sagitta Management, the company which sponsors the Classic. "I am not sure he's a 2000 Guineas horse, but I will discuss it with the owners. I think he will stay the mile and a half of the Derby, as he has a stayer's temperament. He was quite impressive today," Balding said. Trainer Barry Hills may also aim Alboostan at the Dante S.

Further gains were made at the Inglis Easter Yearling Sales in Sydney, with the sale grossing a final total of \$33,086,752 for an average of \$72,697, a rise of 9.3 percent on last year's figure of \$66,479. The gross broke the previous record of \$31,681,237 set in 1989. The session topper on the third and final day Thursday was Coolmore Stud Australia's Danehill colt out of Tristalove (NZ), who was purchased for \$369,872 by a syndicate headed by Hong Kong-based trainer David Hayes. Hayes's brother Peter, based in South Australia, will train the colt. South African-born agent James Bester was again buying for South African-based owners Hasso and Sabina Plattner and paid \$302,623 on their behalf for the Danehill filly out of the Australian Juvenile Triple Crown-winning filly Burst. On Tuesday, Bester secured the sales-topping Lure colt out of Prawn Cocktail for \$537,996.
