**RAINBOW DANCER TO CHILE** MGISW Rainbow Dancer (Fr) (Rainbow Quest--Ramanouche {Fr}, by Riverman), who captured the GI Hollywood Turf H. last May and ended his career with back-to-back victories in the GI Del Mar H. August 30 and GI Oak Tree Turf Championship October 12, has been retired and will stand the 1998 Southern Hemisphere breeding season at Chile's Haras Carioca S.A. The seven-year-old raced in France at three, four and five, capturing three Listed stakes. He won three of his six U.S. starts last year, and goes to the breeding shed with a record of nine wins, five seconds and five thirds from 28 appearances. The dark bay earned \$864,114. His 1998 stud fee is private.

**CHURCHILL DOWNS OPENS TODAY** The 74<sup>th</sup> running of the GIII Derby Trial and a commemoration of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Secretariat's Triple Crown highlight opening day at Churchill Downs, which begins its 47-day Spring Meet this afternoon. The first 10,000 patrons at Churchill will receive Secretariat posters, and Big Red's owner Penny Chenery and jockey Ron Turcotte will be on hand to sign autographs from 2-4 p.m. The Derby Trial kicks off the richest Derby Week stakes schedule in the track's history, with 13 stakes worth more than \$2,950,000. Five Derby Trial winners have gone on to take the Kentucky Derby, but none since Tim Tam in 1958. The Churchill Spring Meet runs through Sunday, June 28. Post time will be 1 p.m. Derby Week, with a special 11:30 a.m. post on Friday, May 1, Kentucky Oaks Day, and Saturday, May 2, Kentucky Derby Day. After the Derby, racing will be held Wednesdays through Sundays, with first post at 3 p.m. weekdays and 1 p.m. Saturdays, Sundays and for the special Memorial Day Card, Monday, May 25.

**SEGENHOE BUYER REVEALED** An article by S.H. Fernando in the latest issue of *Owner-Breeder*, mailed out yesterday, reveals the previously anonymous principal buyer of Segenhoe Stud in Australia. He is George Hofmeister, an entrepreneur and newcomer to racing who owns the 2,000-acre Highland Farms, a collection of five Paris, Kentucky-area farms he recently acquired. Hofmeister owns 55 mares, and as his farm manager Peter Kirwan told *Owner-Breeder*, he is still "in the early days" of putting together a sizeable broodmare band and possibly some stallions. Segenhoe Stud will assume the new name Stone Lodge as of June 1.

**EVENT OF THE YEAR INJURED** Undefeated **Event Of The Year** (Seattle Slew), who had been working sharply at Churchill Downs and was listed as one of the favorites for this year's "Run for the Roses" May 2, zipped five furlongs in :59 4/5 yesterday morning, but came out of the work with a fractured knee and will miss the Triple Crown. "About 20 minutes after the work I noticed he was walking funny. He has a slab fracture of the right knee in the third carpal bone," said trainer Jerry Hollendorfer. "He is going to be operated on (Friday) afternoon by Dr. Larry Bramlage at Rood and Riddle. The prognosis is good for a full recovery. He could come back in six months." The colt is four-for-four with a win in the GI Jim Beam S. last time out.

**DERBY WORK TAB** Tampa Bay Derby winner **Parade Ground** (Kingmambo) worked six furlongs in 1:14 1/5 yesterday morning. Jockey Shane Sellers was aboard the colt for the first time; the pair went the first half in :48 3/5 and galloped out seven furlongs in 1:26 4/5. "He went really good," said Sellers. "I told (owner Will Farish) that I didn't want to be blowing any smoke, but he couldn't have gone any better. He galloped out real good and got over the racetrack real good." **Nite Dreamer** (El Prado {Ire}), still possible for the Derby, worked six furlongs in 1:12 4/5 Friday.

Storm Broker was off the board in four straight California starts to end 1997, but kicked off this season winning back-to-back allowance races at Turfway before finishing third in the Tejano Run S. over a muddy strip last out March 21. Trying the track at Keeneland for the first time here, the dark bay was sent off the second-longest shot in the six-horse field, but outgamed pacesetting favorite Delay Of Game in the drive for a narrow victory. "He just didn't want to lose today," said winning rider Robbie Albarado. "We were running along on the inside and he really didn't feel comfortable. I don't think he wanted to go inside (Delay Of Game). So we kind of settled back a little and moved to the outside. He really came running then."

Clearance Code fell soon after the start in his '97 finale, a restricted stakes over the jumps last October, then lost his rider in his first start back, an optional claiming race over fences just six days ago. Understandably overlooked at the windows here, the bay this time jumped cleanly until the penultimate fence, settling in seventh over the first eight hurdles, closing strongly despite swerving over the next-to-last to join the pacesetter, G1 Carolina Cup hero Master McGrath, in the final yards and drawing clear to win the first steeplechase race in Keeneland history. ## Local News: Hialeah Park

Hialeah wants to buy Hialeah. The city of Hialeah, through its mayor Raul Martinez, has been holding talks about the possibility of purchasing the racetrack from owner John Brunetti. Martinez and Representative Rudy Garcia have talked to lobbyists from Calder and Gulfstream about the availability of funding to investigate the potential of such a purchase. A bill currently before Florida's House of Representatives has set aside \$180,000 as seed money to do feasibility studies. "The state owns the lottery, so we could own a racetrack," said Martinez. In discussing the possibilities, Martinez talked about putting dormant parcels of Hialeah's land to use as a shopping complex or amusement park. Everyone is agreed that if the city got into the racetrack business, it would probably eliminate the dates wars that have gone on in the state since the 1950s.
